12 Traditional Catholic - Lenten Practices



On Ash Wednesday, all over the world, traditional Catholics are going to be praying and fasting. It is a powerful day to ask for God's forgiveness and for the salvation of Souls. All of us need to pray for unity and purity of Catholic dogma. We also want to repent of individual and collective sins that are destroying the Mystical Body of Christ.

Here are some suggestions of what we can do for Lent:

- 1) **Do a very humble and sorrowful confession.** Take the time to go over a very good examination of conscience and write down your sins so as to not forget them. Often, we get nervous in the confessional and can forget them. Stating how many times and when was the last time you committed the sins. This helps the confessor to give you the right penance and to help you root out these vices. Especially be sorrowful for sacrilegious sins such as receiving Holy Communion with a mortal sin on your soul.
- 2) Holy Mass every day. It takes a lot of discipline to get up early to go to Holy Mass, but the fruits are well worth it. There is no greater prayer than the prayer of Jesus to the Father through the Holy Ghost during the Holy Mass in which we participate.
- 3) **Pray the Holy Rosary.** Meditate prayerfully on the Passion of Jesus (Sorrowful Mysteries) every day during lent. It would be even more effective if the whole family prays it together. Try to put your heart into the words and meditations on the passion.
- 4) **Read the Bible.** Read and meditate on all that led up to the passion and crucifixion of Jesus. Each Gospel depicts the passion and crucifixion a little differently.
- 5) **Pray the Stations of the Cross.** Take yourself back in time to the Holy Land, retracing the steps of Jesus on His way to Calvary. *Every Wednesday during Lent after the 9:00 AM Mass. Also, on Fridays during Lent, there will be Stations of the Cross and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament starting at 7:00 PM.*
- 6) **Read a traditional Catholic book.** Like the "Imitation of Christ" or "The Secret of the Rosary", to encourage and inspire you to be happier and holier.
- 7) Make time for heart felt prayer. This is best done in front of the Blessed Sacrament. If for some reason you cannot go to a church, pray at home facing where ever the closest Tabernacle is. Then have faith that God has heard your prayers.
- 8) **Disconnect from social media.** Fast from Facebook, blogs and use your cell phone and computer, to the absolute minimum. We need to be connected to God instead, not the internet and the cell phone. Help your children to not use video games and electronic devices at all. If you haven't already disconnected cable and TV antennas, lent is the perfect time to do this. There is no good left on TV.
- 9) **Stop watching the news.** Instead use this time to pray for the world governments. What good does it do us to be depressed over all the evil things going on in the world that we have no control over? This time can be much better used to love and communicate with our families and make our home a happier world where they can see the difference. Take time to communicate with each other and love each other more.
- 10) **Fast by eating healthy and as a family.** Make a firm promise to absolutely, not buy any fast food. Sacrifice time to make delicious healthy homemade meals that everyone can enjoy. Stay away from desserts and sodas.
- 11) Forgive and Pray for those who have hurt you. Forgive everything from the past, once and forever. Holding on to pain from our childhood, our parish, our spouses, does more harm to our spiritual life than you can imagine. "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us", "Love your enemy", "Pray for those who persecute you", says Jesus. Pray for all those who are destroying Catholic doctrine and liturgy too.
- 12) Stop taking the Salvation of The World on your shoulders. Jesus is the savior of the world. We are just to help those with whom we have influence. And let us not forget, salvation starts with our own souls and family. Every time you get depressed about the pope, bishops, priests, religious and laity, get down on our knees and pray about it. Then, give it over to God, Mary and the Saints to take care of it. We are not God. Invite people this lent to attend a Holy Mass at Chapel of the Holy Family. God is still in charge of the Church and the world. We are only His humble servants.

After the 40 days of Lent, hopefully we have spiritually grown and have been renewed by the power of the Holy Ghost. This is the glorious destination we are trying to reach after the 40 days of traveling through the desert of lent.

FATHER SAFREED'S REFLECTIONS

RECONGNIZE AND RESIST DISHONESTY II

As stated previously in this Column when discussing the errors of Feeneyism on Baptism of Blood and Baptism of Desire, the Universal Ordinary Magisterium whether it contains non-fallible or infallible teaching, must be adhered to by all Catholics. There comes a problem, then, when assessing Vatican II because it "changed" Church teaching on major issues, and therefore has created a crisis for everyone. The R&R faction has taken on the function, it seems, to try to spin, distort, change Vatican II teaching so that it somehow fits in with dogma and the Ordinary Magisterium before the Council. Sometimes it's the other way around: some try to ignore, distort, spin, change dogma prior to the Council to make it fit into the understanding of Vatican II. Either way there's a disconnect, a break, a lack of continuity with the pre-Vatican II Church and the post-Vatican II church.

One myth that continues to juggernaut through Traditional and Novus Ordo circles is the idea that Vatican II was a so-called "pastoral council," which didn't intend to define dogma—therefore what it said and did was not binding in an official manner. They claim that Paul VI teaches this, and Taylor Marshall the Grand Poobah of Recognize and Resist, writes thusly in his book *Infiltration; The Plot to Destroy the Church from Within:*

Pope Paul VI promulgated *Dignitatis humanae* on 7 December 1965, and the next day he closed the Second Vatican Council and stated: "The magisterium of the Church did not wish to pronounce itself under the

form of extraordinary dogmatic pronouncements"... *The Council made no extraordinary dogmatic pronouncements*.
