Twenty Second Sunday After Pentecost

GOSPEL Matt. 22:15-21 At that time, the Pharisees went and took counsel how they might ensnare Him in His talk. And they send to Him their disciples, with the Herodians, saying, "Master, we know that Thou art true, and teachest the way of God in truth, and carest not for anyone: for Thou regardest not the person of men. Tell us therefore, What thinkest Thou?

Is it lawful to give tribute unto Caesar, or not?" But Jesus perceived their wickedness, and said, "Why tempt ye Me, ye hypocrites? Show Me the tribute money." And they brought unto Him a penny. And He saith unto them, "Whose is this image and superscription?" They say unto Him, "Caesar's." Then saith He unto them, "Render therefore unto Caesar the things that are Caesar's; and unto God the things that are God's."



Saint Teresa of Ávila

Saint Teresa of Ávila (1515–1582) canonized 1622; feast day October 15) was a Spanish writer and reformer of the Carmelite order. She was an influential and pivotal figure of her generation.

St. Teresa (Teresa de Cepeda y Ahumada) was born in Avila, Spain on 28th March 1515. Her parents were both pious Catholics and in some ways inspired their daughter to take up a life of prayer.

As a young child Teresa showed signs of a deeply religious nature; she would often retreat into silence for prayer and would enjoy giving alms to the poor. She was very close to her mother, who provided a warm counterbalance to the strictness of her father. However, in her teens, Teresa's mother passed away, leaving the young Teresa distraught at the void she felt. The young St. Teresa tells of her despair and how she turned instinctively to the Virgin Mary for comfort.

At the age of 16, her father decided to send Teresa to a convent school to be educated. This reignited in Teresa an interest in following a spiritual life and after some deliberation resolved to become a nun of the Carmelite Order. Shortly after becoming a nun, Teresa experienced a severe illness (malaria), which left her in great pain for a long period. At one point it was feared that her illness was so severe that she would not be able to recover. However, during this period of intense physical pain, she began to increasingly experience divine visions and an inner sense of peace.

At the age of 43, St. Teresa decided she wanted to found a new order recommitting to the values of poverty and simplicity. She guided the nuns not just through strict disciplines, but also through the power of love, and common sense and stressed the importance of experiencing God's Love.

She died on October 4 at the age of 67.

Gospel Commentary. The Pharisees tried to ensnare Jesus in order to find some reason to accuse Him before the emperor, or to make Him hated by the Jews; for had He denied tribute to Caesar, they would have accused Him before the emperor as guilty of high treason; had He, on the contrary made it obligatory to pay tribute, then they would have denounced Him as a destroyer of the liberty of the people, who considered themselves a free nation owing allegiance only to God. Those who, under the appearance of friendship, only cause vexation and misfortune to their neighbor are like the Pharisees and Herodians. Hypocrites are those who in order to cheat their neighbor, appear outwardly pious and holy, whilst inwardly they are full of malice; those who have honey on the tongue, but gall in the heart, and sting like scorpions, when we least expect it.

Because there are so many vices connected with hypocrisy, Christ has denounced no sin more emphatically than this one. Hypocrites are brethren of Cain, Joab, and Judas, of whom the first killed his brother, the second his cousin and the third betrayed his divine Master with a kiss. God curses such false men. (Mal, I. 14.) I hate a mouth with a double tongue. (Prov. VIII. 13.)

"The devil silently possesses the hearts of hypocrites and quietly sleeps in them, whilst he gives them no peace," says St. Gregory; and St. Jerome writes: "Pretended holiness is double malice." Better is an open enemy, before whom we can be on our guard, than a hypocritical friend of whom we have no suspicion, because we look upon him as a friend.

Beware, therefore, my dear Christian, of the vice of hypocrisy, which is so hateful to God; endeavor always to be sincere with God, thyself and thy neighbor, and to walk in-true humility before God, then mayst thou carry His image within thee.



Saint Luke was born a Greek and a Gentile in Antioch, Syria. He was a physician and it is believed that he may have also been a slave, as it was not uncommon in his day for slaves to be educated in medicine so the family would have a resident physician. Luke became a close companion of Paul of Tarsus and accompanied him on his missionary journeys. It is very possible that Luke provided medical assistance to Paul when he had been beaten, stoned or nearly drowned while evangelizing to the Western Roman Empire.

Luke is the only Gentile to have written books in the Bible. He is the writer of the third Gospel and the Acts of the Apostles and his writings have been proven to be historically accurate.

In the third Gospel, Luke emphasizes Christ's compassion for sinners and for those who suffer. One will also find in Luke's account of the gospel, a strong emphasis on the role women played in Christ's ministry. Luke's Christian ministry can be followed in the book of Acts. Up until the sixteenth chapter the story of Acts is written in the third person, much like an historian recording facts. The voice of the narrator then changes to first person and scholars believe this is done at the time Luke first joined Paul at Troas in the year 51. The book of Acts switches back to third person and scholars believe that this reflects a period in time when Luke was not present during the events that are recorded. It is believed that Luke lived a long life and died AD 74 in Greece. He was the first Christian physician and was venerated by the Catholic Church as the patron saint of physicians and surgeons. Saint Luke is also considered the patron saint of painters because according to tradition, he had painted images of Mary and of Jesus. This was later proven to be incorrect. Saint Luke's feast day is celebrated on October 18th.
