By their fruits you shall know them. Do men gather grapes of thorns, or figs of thistles? Even so every good tree bringeth forth good fruit, and the evil tree bringeth forth evil fruit. A good tree cannot bring forth evil fruit, neither can an evil tree bring forth good fruit. Every tree that bringeth not forth good fruit, shall be cut down, and shall be cast into the fire. Wherefore by their fruits you shall know them. Not everyone that saith to me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven: but he that doth the will of My Father who is in heaven, he shall enter into the kingdom of heaven."



Saint Jerome Emiliani's Story ~ Born 1481 at Venice, Italy to a wealthy family. Jerome's father died when he was a teenager, and he ran away from home at age 15. After a dissolute youth, he became a soldier in 1506.

A careless and irreligious soldier for the city-state of Venice, Jerome was captured in a military campaign at an outpost town and chained in a dungeon. In prison Jerome had a lot of time to think, and he gradually learned how to pray. When he escaped, he hung his metal chains in the nearby church -- in gratitude not only for being freed from physical prison but

from his spiritual dungeon as well. Jerome returned to Venice where he took charge of the education of his nephews-and began his own studies for the priesthood. He is believed to have developed the question-andanswer catechism technique for teaching children religion.

In the years after his ordination, events again called St. Jerome to a decision and a new lifestyle. Plague and famine swept northern Italy. St. Jerome began caring for the sick and feeding the hungry at his own expense. While serving the sick and the poor, he soon resolved to devote himself and his property solely to others, particularly to abandoned children. He founded three orphanages, a shelter for penitent prostitutes and a hospital. Around 1532, St. Jerome and two other priests established a congregation, the Clerks Regular of Somasca, dedicated to the care of orphans and the education of youth.

St. Jerome died in 1537, at the age of 56, from the disease he contracted while tending the sick.

St Jerome was beatified September 29, 1747 by Pope Benedict XIV, and canonized July16, 1767 by Pope Clement XIII. In 1928, Pius XI named him the patron of orphans and abandoned children. His Liturgical Feast Day is July 20th.

Reflection:

Very often in our lives it seems to take some kind of "imprisonment" to free us from the shackles of our selfcenteredness. When we're "caught" in some situation we don't want to be in, we finally come to know the power of prayer. Only then can we become available to "the imprisoned" and "the orphaned" all around us.

Prayer:

Saint Jerome Emiliani, watch over all children who are abandoned or unloved. Give us the courage to show them God's love through our care. Help us to lose the chains that keep us from living the life God intended for us. Amen

Dear God, I offer Thee today, All I do, think, suffer and say. Please bless me, Dear Jesus and help me through the day.


Angel of God, my guardian dear, to whom God's love entrust me here, ever this day be at my side to light and guard, to rule and guide.

Gospel Commentary - Wolves In Sheep's Clothing

Jesus and the Apostles warned us that there would come false prophets and apostles into the Catholic Church. This has been the case from the very beginning of the Church.

Jesus warns us: "Beware of false prophets, who come to you in the clothing of sheep, but inwardly they are ravening wolves.

By their fruits you shall know them.

Do men gather grapes of thorns, or figs of thistles? Even so every good tree brings forth good fruit, and the evil tree brings forth evil fruit. A good tree cannot bring forth evil fruit; neither can an evil tree bring forth good fruit. Every tree that brings not forth good fruit, shall be cut down, and shall be cast into the fire. Wherefore by their fruits you shall know them." Matt. 7:15.

St. Paul teaches St. Timothy what to do in times when sound doctrine will not be endured: "I charge thee, before God and Jesus Christ, who shall judge the living and the dead, by his coming, and his kingdom: Preach the word: be instant in season, out of season; reprove, entreat, rebuke in all patience and doctrine. For there shall be a time, when they will not endure sound doctrine; but, according to their own desires, they will heap to themselves teachers, having itching ears: And will indeed turn away their hearing from the truth, but will be turned unto fables." 2 Tim. 4:1-4.

In these terrible times with the Vatican watering down Catholic teaching, we faithful traditional Catholics need to: "Preach the word: be instant in season, out of season: reprove, entreat, rebuke in all patience and doctrine". It will not be easy, but we'll do it nonetheless.

When all is said and done, there have always been wolves in sheep's clothing and false prophets since the beginning of the Church. If we stay faithful, God will take care of His Church as He has for the last 2000 years. But it has always taken saints who spoke up and suffered for the defense of the true Catholic faith.
