Sixteenth Sunday After Pentecost

GOSPEL Luke 14:1-11 At that time, when Jesus went into the house of one of the chiefs of the Pharisees on the Sabbath-day to eat bread, they watched Him. And behold there was a certain man before Him that had the dropsy. And Jesus answering spoke to the lawyers and Pharisees, saying: Is it lawful to heal on the Sabbath-day? But they held their peace. But He taking him, healed him, and sent him away. And answering them, He said: Which of you shall have an ass or an ox fall into a pit and will not immediately draw him out on the Sabbath-day? And they could not answer Him to these things. And He spoke a parable also to them that were invited, marking how they chose the first seats at the table, saying to them when thou art invited to a wedding, sit not down in the first place, lest perhaps one more honorable than thou be invited by him; and he that invited thee come and say to thee: Give this man place: and then thou begin with shame to take the lowest place: But when thou art invited, go, sit down in the lowest place: that when he who invited thee cometh he may say to thee: Friend, go up higher. Then shalt thou have glory before them that sit at the table with thee; because everyone that exalts himself shall be humbled, and he that humbles himself shall be exalted."

ST. MATTHEW THE APOSTLE



Little is known about St. Matthew, Apostle and Evangelist, except that he was born Levi, the son of Alpheus, and he was likely born in Galilee. He worked as a tax collector, which was a disliked profession during the time of Christ.

According to the Gospel, Matthew was working at a collection booth in Capernaum when Christ came to him and said, "Follow me." With this simple call, Matthew became a disciple of Christ.

From Matthew we know of the many doings of Christ and the message Christ spread of salvation for all people who come to God through Him. The Gospel account of Matthew tells the same story

as that found in the other three Gospels, so scholars are certain of its authenticity. His book is the first of the four Gospels in the New Testament.

Many years following the death of Christ, around 41 to 50AD, Matthew wrote his gospel account. He wrote the book in Aramaic in the hope that his account would convince his fellow people that Jesus was the Messiah and that His kingdom had been fulfilled in a spiritual way. It was an important message at a time when almost everyone was expecting the return of a militant messiah brandishing a sword.

It is thought he departed for other lands to escape persecution sometime after 42AD. According to various legends he fled to Parthia and Persia, or Ethiopia. Like 11 of the 12 apostles, St. Matthew is traditionally thought to have died as a martyr while preaching the Gospel. Saint Matthew is often depicted with one of the four living creatures of Revelation 4:7, which reads, "The first living creature was like a lion, the second like a bull, the third living creature had a human face, and the fourth living creature was like a flying eagle."

Matthew was a tax collector and is therefore the patron saint of bankers and accountants. The Church established St. Matthew's feast day as September 21st.

Gospel Commentary ~ At the sight of the sick man, who stands before Him, Jesus is filled with compassion. He cures the affliction even though He knows that there are those who will criticize Him for curing on the Sabbath.

Jesus acts in a forthright manner. He pays no heed to what others will say. His critics consider themselves to be the authentic interpreters of the Law.

Later on, the Lord will show them that mercy should be exercised even on the Sabbath. He provides an example gleaned from the common sense of the countryside. *He said: Which of you shall have an ass or an ox fall into a pit and will not immediately draw him out on the Sabbath?*

We may find obstacles to our faith, in the environment around us, such as envy, prejudice and misunderstandings due to ignorance. Our response should be the same as that of Jesus.

We should not be afraid to give clear testimony to our beliefs. This type of behavior can be of great apostolic value.

On the other hand, it is terrible how much harm we can do if we allow ourselves to be carried away by the fear or the shame of being seen as Christians in ordinary life. Let us not fail to make manifest our Christian faith, always with humility and naturalness, whenever the situation requires it. We will never regret having acted in a manner so consistent with our deepest beliefs. The Lord will be filled with joy at such evidence of our fidelity. By Fr. Fernandez-Cavajal
