# Seventeenth Sunday After Pentecost

**GOSPEL Matt. 22, 34-46** At that time, the Pharisees, came to Jesus and one of them, a doctor of the Law, putting Him to the test, asked Him, "Master, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?" Jesus said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with your whole heart, and with your whole soul, and with your whole mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. And the second is like it, You shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments depend the whole Law and the Prophets." Now while the Pharisees were gathered together, Jesus questioned them saying, "What do you think of the Christ? Whose son is He?" They said to Him, "David's". He said to them, "How then does David in the Spirit call Him Lord", saying, "The Lord said to my Lord: Sit at My right hand, till I make Your enemies Your footstool?" If David, therefore, calls Him Lord, how is He, his son?" And no one could answer Him a word; neither did anyone dare from that day forth to ask Him any more questions.

#### **Dedication of St. Michael The Archangel**



The feast of St. Michael the Archangel is on September 29th. The vital prayer was composed by Pope Leo XIII in 1888 after his startling vision as to the future of the Church. This prayer was dedicated for the Feast of St. Michael 1448 years from the date of the election of the first Leo - Pope Saint Leo the Great. Everyone is familiar with the first prayer which was mandated by His Holiness as part of the Leonine Prayers at the end of Low Mass.

After Vatican II, in legion with the devil, Giovanni Montini outlawed this necessary prayer and then one wonders how "the smoke of Satan" got into the sanctuary? The Conciliarists wanted to make

sure the words in bold below would never see the light of day again for in it, Leo foretold what would happen: The shepherd would be struck, the sheep scattered. The longer versions of this poignant prayer should never be forgotten.

O glorious Archangel Saint Michael, Prince of the heavenly host, be our defense in the terrible warfare which we carry on against principalities and powers, against the rulers of this world of darkness, spirits of evil. Come to the aid of man, whom God created immortal, made in His own image and likeness, and redeemed at a great price from the tyranny of the devil. Fight this day the battle of our Lord, together with the holy angels, as already thou hast fought the leader of the proud angels, Lucifer, and his apostate host, who were powerless to resist thee, nor was there place for them any longer in Heaven. That cruel, that ancient serpent, who is called the devil or Satan who seduces the whole world, was cast into the abyss with his angels. Behold this primeval enemy and slaver of men has taken courage. Transformed into an angel of light, he wanders about with all the multitude of wicked spirits, invading the earth in order to blot out the Name of God and of His Christ, to seize upon, slay, and cast into eternal perdition, souls destined for the crown of eternal glory. That wicked dragon pours out, as a most impure flood, the venom of his malice on men of depraved mind and corrupt heart, the spirit of lying, of impiety, of blasphemy, and the pestilent breath of impurity, and of every vice and iniquity. These most crafty enemies have filled and inebriated with gall and bitterness the Church, the spouse of the Immaculate Lamb, and have laid impious hands on Her most sacred possessions. In the Holy Place itself, where has been set up the See of the most holy Peter and the Chair of Truth for the light of the world, they have raised the throne of their abominable impiety with the iniquitous design that when the Pastor has been struck the sheep may be scattered. Arise then, O invincible Prince, bring help against the attacks of the lost spirits to the people of God, and give them the victory. They venerate thee as their protector and patron; in thee holy Church glories as her defense against the malicious powers of hell; to thee has God entrusted the souls of men to be established in heavenly beatitude. Oh, pray to the God of peace that He may put Satan under our feet, so far conquered that he may no longer be able to hold men in captivity and harm the Church. Offer our prayers in the sight of the Most High, so that they may quickly conciliate the mercies of the Lord; and beating down the dragon, the ancient serpent, who is the devil and Satan, do thou again make him captive in the abyss, that he may no longer seduce the nations. Amen.


