

Tenth Sunday After Pentecost

GOSPEL Luke 18:9-14 At that time, Jesus spoke this parable also to some who trusted in themselves as just and despised others. "Two men went up into the temple to pray: the one a Pharisee and the other a publican. The Pharisee standing, prayed thus with himself: 'O God, I give thee thanks that I am not as the rest of men, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, as also is this publican. I fast twice in a week: I give tithes of all that I possess.' And the publican, standing afar off, would not so much as lift up his eyes towards heaven; but struck his breast, saying: 'O God, be merciful to me a sinner.' I say to you, this man went down into his house justified rather than the other: because everyone that exalts himself shall be humbled: and he that humbles himself shall be exalted."

The Story of the Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary



The Catholic Church teaches that when Mary ended her earthly life, God assumed her, body and soul into heaven.

This belief traces its roots back to the earliest years of the Church. While a site outside of Jerusalem was recognized as the tomb of Mary, the earliest Christians maintained that "no one was there".

According to St. John of Damascus, in the 5th century, at the Council of Chalcedon in 451, Roman Emperor Marcian requested the body of Mary, Mother of God. St. Juvenal, who was Bishop of Jerusalem replied "that Mary died in the presence of all the Apostles, but that her tomb, when opened upon the request of St. Thomas, was found empty; wherefrom the Apostles concluded that the body was taken up to heaven," the saint recorded.

By the 8th century, around the time of Pope Adrian, the Church began to change its terminology, renaming the feast day of the Memorial of Mary to the Assumption of Mary.

The belief in the Assumption of Mary was a widely held tradition, and a frequent meditation in the writings of saints throughout the centuries. However, it was not defined officially until the past century. In 1950, Pope Pius XII made an infallible, ex-cathedra statement in the Apostolic Constitution Munificentissimus Deus officially defining the dogma of the Assumption.

"By the authority of our Lord Jesus Christ, of the Blessed Apostles Peter and Paul, and by our own authority, we pronounce, declare, and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma: that the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory," the pope wrote.

Monday, August 15th is the Feast of the Assumption which marks a major feast day and a public holiday in many countries. In most countries, including the United States, it is a Holy Day of Obligation.

FATHER SAFREED'S REFLECTIONS

The present Ecclesial crisis has prompted the faithful to ask questions such as: "Where are we going to get the next true Pope?" "Has God forgotten us?" "Will He ever restore the Church to its once former glory?" They are legitimate questions, and it is important to know that there are answers to these queries, but the answers may not satisfy everyone. We are on uncharted territory, and people may disagree in understanding the situation and how to solve the problem, which is very distressing.

With regard to the "Pope question" Fr. Anthony Cekada, God rest his soul, wrote the following:

"If the post-Vatican II popes are not true popes, how might the Church one day get a true pope again? Here are some theories:

- [1] Direct Divine intervention. This scenario is found in the writings of some approved mystics.
- [2] The Material/Formal Thesis. This holds that should a post-Vatican II pope publicly renounce the heresies of the post-Conciliar church he would automatically become a true pope. [Bishop Donald Sanborn and his priests adhere to this opinion]
- [3] An imperfect General Council. The theologian Cajetan (1469-1534) and others teach that should the College of Cardinals become extinct, the right to elect a pope would devolve to the clergy of Rome, and then to the universal Church."

Each of these seems to present some difficulties. But this should not be surprising, because the precise solution to an unusual problem in the Church cannot always be predicted beforehand. This can be seen from the following comment in the 1913 Catholic Encyclopedia: "No canonical provisions exist regulating the authority of the College of Cardinals — in the case the pope became insane, or personally a heretic; in such cases it would be necessary to consult the dictates of right reason and the teachings of history."

Some private revelations, which we are not bound to accept, even speak of Sts. Peter and Paul returning to Earth to choose the pope themselves. No one could contest that election! Some even believe that there will not be a true pope ever again — everything would be restored, in some manner, only at the Second Coming of Christ.

In my opinion, and in the opinion of other respected individuals, we look to two Biblical and theological concepts for insight into the reality we are living through today. They are the ideas of the "Church in eclipse," and the Church undergoing its "Mystical Passion." We will explore these ideas in the next few weeks of my Reflections.





Remember, also, Lord, Your servants and handmaids below who are gone hence before us, marked with the sign of faith, and sleep the sleep of peace. To them, Lord and to all that rest in Christ, grant, we implore You a place of happiness, light and peace through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
