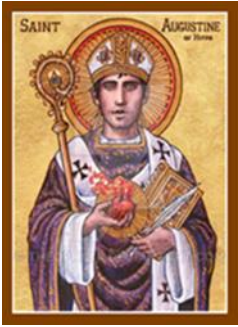

Eleventh Sunday After Pentecost

GOSPEL Mark 7:31-37 At that time, Jesus went out from the borders of Tyre, and came through Sidon unto the sea of Galilee, through the midst of the district of Decapolis. And they brought to Him one that was deaf and had an impediment in his speech; and they beseeched Him to lay His hand upon him. And He took him aside from the multitude privately, and put His fingers into his ears, and He spat, and touched his tongue; and looking up to heaven, He sighed, and saith unto him, "Ephphatha," that is, "Be opened." And his ears were opened, and the bond of his tongue was loosed, and he began to speak correctly. And He charged them to tell no man. But the more He charged them, so much the more a great deal they published it. And they were beyond measure astonished, saying, "He hath done all things well. He made the deaf to hear, and the dumb to speak."

St. Augustine, Bishop and Confessor, Doctor of the Church



St. Augustine was born in 354 to a pagan father and a Christian mother, St. Monica. His early education was that of a young pagan gentleman, but he went on to become one of the most influential and genius Doctors of the Catholic Church.

St. Augustine's infamous life of impurity and practice of the heretical Manichaeism reveal the magnitude of his conversion to Christianity, mainly through the intercession of his mother, St. Monica.

He finally began to pull away from his pagan ways and was eventually baptized in 387 by St. Ambrose, Bishop of Milan, who became a great counselor and friend to his mother as she prayed for her son.

Saint Augustine went on to become the Bishop of Hippo (in modern day Algeria) and one of the greatest Catholic Christian writers and thinkers in the history of the Church.

For thirty-five years he was the center of ecclesiastical life in Africa, and the Church's strongest champion against heresy. His writings, which compose many volumes, have been accepted everywhere as a major source of both Christian spirituality and theological speculation. His most well-known works are his "Confessions" and "The City of God".

The great Doctor died, deeply regretted by the entire Christian world, in 430. His feast is celebrated in the Church on August 28th, the day after that of his holy mother, St. Monica. It is entirely fitting that their feasts are side-by-side on the liturgical calendar, given that Monica won her son's deep conversion to Christ through her many years of patient and persistent prayer.

St. Augustine is a perfect example of how God works miracles in our lives, often through the intercession of other people. Once St. Augustine cried out to God, "Too late have I loved you!" in sorrow over the many years he lived a dissolute life while putting off the call of God.

It is never too late to commit ourselves to conversion and service to our Lord! St. Augustine, pray for us.

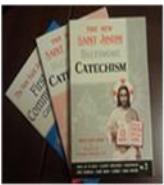
Catechism Class for Confirmation to be held after the 9am Mass every Sunday starting on September 18th.

FATHER SAFREED’S REFLECTIONS

How are we to understand the great and unprecedented crisis that has afflicted the Church these past fifty to sixty years? How can we proceed as faithful believers without the loss of Faith? The answer consists, I believe, in the understanding of Christ’s enduring passion in his Mystical Body, and that the Church, which still exists, is undergoing an almost total eclipse. It’s still visible but darkened. These ideas have a basis in Sacred Scripture, the mind of the Fathers of the Church, and in private revelation.

St. Therese of Lisieux recommended the book “The End of the Present World and the Mysteries of the Future life.” The author is Fr. Charles Arminjon and he explains the situation this way:

Now, the mystical and collective body of Jesus Christ is modeled upon his individual body...What was accomplished in Jesus Christ individually must be continued in His collective, or mystical body. Such is the law of indestructible solidarity, established between the head and the members. It would scarcely be fitting if the latter were to soar up into glory without passing through the transformations endured by the head. It cannot be granted that Jesus Christ wanted to open up two differing paths leading to heaven, one for himself, rough and excruciating, the other for his followers comfortable, and strewn with flowers.

Pope Pius XII teaches us that:

...the society established by the Redeemer of the human race resembles it’s divine Founder who was persecuted, calumniated and tortured by the very men whom he had undertaken to save.

Our Lord Jesus Christ himself commanded:

If any man come after me, let him deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. (Mt. 16:24)

In the 18th and 19th centuries the Popes warned repeatedly that the Church is suffering persecution from all sides, and that a war is raging to bring about its very destruction. From “Humanum Genus, Pope Leo XIII’s great encyclical against Freemasonry:

They are planning the destruction of holy Church publicly and openly, and this with the set purpose of utterly despoiling the nations of Christendom, if it were possible, of the blessings obtained through Jesus Christ our Savior.

It is not possible to be uninterested and unconcerned with what is happening. The true disciples of Christ cannot remain aloof from the Passion of Christ in His Mystical Body presently. We must carry not only our own crosses, but those of Christ’s Body on earth.
