Twelfth Sunday After Pentecost

GOSPEL Luke 10:23-37 At that time, Jesus said to His disciples: "Blessed are the eyes that see the things which you see. For I say to you that many prophets and kings have desired to see the things that you see and have not seen them; and to hear the things that you hear and have not heard them." And behold a certain lawyer stood up, tempting Him and saying, "Master, what must I do to possess eternal life?" But He said to him: "What is written in the law? How do you read?" He answered and said, "Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with thy whole heart and with thy whole soul and with all thy strength and with all thy mind: and thy neighbor as thyself." And He said to him, "You have answered rightly. Do this and you shall live." But he wishing to justify himself, said to Jesus: "And who is my neighbor?"

Jesus answered and said: "A certain man went down from Jerusalem to Jericho and fell among robbers, who also stripped him and having wounded him went away, leaving him half dead. And it chanced, that a certain priest went down the same way: and seeing him, passed by. In like manner also a Levite, when he was near the place and saw him, passed by. But a certain Samaritan, being on his journey, came near him: and seeing him, was moved with compassion: And going up to him, bound up his wounds, pouring in oil and wine: and setting him upon his own beast, brought him to an inn and took care of him. And the next day he took out two denarii and gave them to the innkeeper and said: 'Take care of him; and whatever more you spend, I, on my way back, will repay you.' "Which of these three, in your opinion, was neighbor to him that fell among the robbers?" And he said: "He who took pity on him." And Jesus said to him: "Go and do also in like manner."



Saint Rose of Lima was born Isabel Flores de Olivia in the city of Lima, Peru on April 20, 1586. Her later nickname "Rose" comes from an incident in her infancy: a servant claimed to have seen her face transform into a rose. In 1597 Isabel was confirmed and she formally took the name of Rose at that time.

As a young girl, in emulation of the noted Dominican tertiary Catherine of Siena, she began to fast three times a week and performed severe penances in secret. Despite the censure of her parents, she spent many hours contemplating the Blessed Sacrament, which she received daily, an extremely rare practice in that period.

After daily fasting, she took to permanently abstaining from eating meat. She helped the sick and hungry around her community, bringing them to her room and taking care of them. Rose sold her fine needlework, and took flowers that she grew to market, to help her family. She made and sold lace and embroidery to care for the poor, and she prayed and did penance in a little grotto that she had built. Otherwise, she became a recluse, leaving her room only for her visits to church.

She attracted the attention of the friars of the Dominican Order. St. Rose wanted to become a nun, but her father forbade it, so she instead entered the Third Order of St. Dominic while living in her parents' home. In her twentieth year she donned the habit of a tertiary and took a vow of perpetual virginity. She only allowed herself to sleep two hours a night at most, so that she had more hours to devote to prayer. She donned a heavy crown made of silver, with small spikes on the inside, in emulation of the Crown of Thorns worn by Christ. For eleven years she lived this way, with intervals of ecstasy, and eventually died on August 24, 1617, at the young age of 31. It is said that she prophesied the date of her death. Her funeral was held in the cathedral, attended by all the public authorities of Lima. Her feast day is on August 30th.

Saint Rose was beatified by Pope Clement IX on May 10, 1667, and canonized on April 12, 1671, by Pope Clement X. She was the first Catholic in the Americas to be declared a saint. Her shrine, alongside those of her friends Martin de Porres and John Macias, is located inside the convent of Saint Dominic in Lima.

The Catholic Church says that many miracles followed her death: there were stories that she had cured a leper, and that, at the time of her death, the city of Lima smelled like roses; roses also started falling from the sky. Many places in the New World are named Santa Rosa after her.

Saint Rose is the patroness of the Americas, especially of Lima, Peru, of Sittard in the Netherlands, of India, and of the Philippines, as well as embroiderers, gardeners, florists and people ridiculed or misunderstood for their piety and for the resolution of family quarrels.

FATHER SAFREED'S REFLECTIONS

In 1948, merely 14 years before the beginning of Vatican II, Archbishop Fulton Sheen wrote these words in his book "Communism and the Conscience of the West:"

"Satan will set up a counter church which will be the ape of the Church because he, the Devil, is the ape of God. It will have all the notes and characteristics of the Church, but in reverse and emptied of its divine content. It will be a mystical body of the Antichrist that will in all externals resemble the Mystical Body of Christ...but the twentieth century will join the counter church because it claims to be infallible when its visible head speaks ex cathedra."

Fulton Sheen was something of a phenomenon not only with Catholic faithful circa the 1950's and 60's but gained a following among Protestants and secular individuals as well. He was on television every week opposite the comedian Milton Berle, even gaining popularity over and above the comic. Until the 1960's he spoke ardently against Communism, but to my knowledge never a word against Freemasonry. Correct me if I am wrong.

It was very unfortunate, then, that Sheen morphed into a "conservative creature of the ecclesiastical swamp" by signing all the documents of Vatican II, and celebrating the New Mass. It was clear that he knew what happened at Vatican II: "Satan will set up a counter church," but then, after it was set up, went right along with it. God rest his soul.

But even as a broken clock is right twice a day, let's examine what Msgr. Sheen has to say by analyzing the above statement, which is remarkable in its seeming prophetic utterance.

"Satan will set up a counter church": St. Paul in 2 Thessalonians 2:10 warns of the "operation of error" as being a major occurrence before the Second Coming of Our Lord Jesus Christ. The term "operation of error" is a perfect description of the Novus Ordo church, as everything about it is false. This false church, this operation of error, comes about because people "have not the love of the truth" and this indifference to the truth impedes salvation. "...there shall arise false christs and false prophets, who will show great signs and wonders, in as much to deceive (if possible) even the elect" It is easy for many to believe that this false church is the true Church—thus deception enters into the equation. The elect are being led astray as Our Lord predicted in the Gospel of St. Matthew. Christ also says:

"...and immediately after the tribulation of those days, the sun shall be darkened and the moon shall not give her light...

The great St. Augustine, Doctor of the Church, gives us profound insight into this passage of Sacred Scripture. In his letter to Hesychius he writes:

"For when the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, and the stars will fall from the sky, and the powers of heaven will be shaken, as is recalled by other two Evangelists is this place, the Church will not appear. Then the wicked persecutors will rage beyond measure, unafraid, enjoying worldly happiness, saying "peace and security." Then the stars will fall from the sky, and the powers of heaven will be moved; because many who were seen shining with grace, will yield to their persecutors and will fall, and some of the strongest of the faithful will be shaken." 
