Thirteenth Sunday After Pentecost

GOSPEL Luke 17:11-19 At that time, as Jesus was going to Jerusalem, he passed through the midst of Samaria and Galilee. And as he entered into a certain town, there met him ten men that were lepers, who stood afar off. And lifted up their voice, saying: "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us." Whom when he saw, he said: "Go, show yourselves to the priests." And it came to pass, as they went, they were made clean. And one of them, when he saw that he was made clean, went back, with a loud voice glorifying God. And he fell on his face before his feet, giving thanks. And this was a Samaritan. And Jesus answering, said: "Were not ten made clean? And where are the nine? There is no one found to return and give glory to God, but this stranger?" And he said to him: "Arise, go thy way; for thy faith hath made thee whole."



September – Month of the Holy Cross

Thanks be to God that His wisdom often turns human plans upside down and inside out. We see this in the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. The instrument of torture becomes the throne of glory.

He Who was nailed to the Cross like a criminal is in fact the King of kings before Whom one day every knee shall bow.

The splendor of the Holy Cross guarantees that in our war against the forces of darkness we are already well and truly on the winning side. The principal and decisive battle has already been fought and won by the Son of God. What now remains are the continuing skirmishes by which the Enemy tries to undermine our confidence in Christ's victory.

How do we exalt the Holy Cross? By showing forth in our daily lives the Gospel truth that suffering can be salvific. We also exalt Christ the Lord by reaching out in charity to our neighbors, especially to those who do not yet share our faith.

How are people going to know about Christ unless we tell them? How will they come to believe in Him unless we prepare the ground for them to receive the Holy Ghost's supernatural gift of faith?

We cannot hope to prepare the ground unless we ourselves are credible witnesses. We bear witness to Christ (among many other ways) by being of genuine service to our fellow citizens, serving them after the pattern of His own compassion and generosity.

We serve our neighbors in order to share with them something of what we ourselves have received; the countless blessings of that infinite charity which the Sacred Heart of Jesus unremittingly intends for the whole of mankind.

PRAYER

O God, who willed that your Only Begotten Son should undergo the Cross to save the human race, grant, we pray, that we, who have known His mystery on earth, may merit the grace of His redemption in heaven. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Ghost, one God, for ever and ever. Amen

FATHER SAFREED'S REFLECTIONS

Last week, we cited Archbishop Fulton Sheen's comment in his book "Communism and the Conscience of the West" that "Satan will set up a counterchurch," and that it was my conclusion, along with many others, that this so-called church is the Vatican II sect. It is the false church which most people in the world think of as the Catholic Church.

This entity says Sheen "...will have all the notes and characteristics of the Church, but in reverse, AND EMPTIED OF ITS DIVINE CONTENT. It will be a mystical body of the Antichrist that will in all externals resemble the Mystical Body of Christ."

What does "emptied of its divine content mean?" It means that the Church has essentially become a human institution, devoid of its supernatural powers — that is for the honor and glory of God and the salvation of souls. Did this in all actually come about? It most certainly did!

On June 18, 1968 Giovanni Battista Montini, known by his stage name as "Pope" Paul VI, signed into Church Law an "apostolic constitution" that changed the Catholic rite of consecration of bishops and the ordination of priests. It must be remembered that these changes were not superficial to the rite, but they went to the very essence of what makes up the true validity of a Catholic Bishop and Priest

The traditional Roman Catholic form of the consecration of bishops defined by Pope Pius XII in 1947 reads as follows: "Comple in Sacerdote tuo ministerio tui summam et omamentis totius glorificationis instructum coelestis unguenti rore sanctifica."

In English:

"Perfect in thy priest the fullness of thy ministry and, clothing him in all the ornaments of spiritual glorification, sanctify him with the Heavenly anointing."

It must be noted that this form is of ancient origin — no later than the 4th or 5th centuries. It is the "traditional" form, therefore, for the consecration of bishops.

The Modernist Novus Ordo form given by Antipope Montini in 1968:

"Et nunc effunde super nunc Electum eam virtutem, quae a te est, SPIRITUM PRINCIPALEM, quem dedisti dilecto Filio Tuo Jesu Christo, quem ipse donavit sanctis Apostolis, qui consituerunt Ecclesiam per singula loca, ut sanctuarium tuum, in gloriam et laudem indeficientem nominis tui."

In English:

"So now pour out upon this chosen one that power which is from you, the GOVERNING SPIRIT whom you gave to your beloved Son, Jesus Christ, and the Spirit given by him to the holy apostles, who founded the Church in every place to be your temple for the unceasing glory and praise of your name."

These changes are subtle but also quite deliberate and serious. And, as we shall see, they have radically altered the essential nature of the episcopacy and the priesthood. The new form of Paul VI has been emptied of its Divine content. More next week.
