

Fifteenth Sunday After Pentecost

GOSPEL Luke 7:11-16 At that time, Jesus went into a city that is called Naim: and there went with Him His disciples and a great multitude. And when He came nigh to the gate of the city, behold a dead man was carried out, the only son of his mother: and she was a widow. And a great multitude of the city was with her. Whom when the Lord had seen, being moved with mercy towards her, He said to her: "Weep not." And He came near and touched the bier. And they that carried it stood still. And He said: "Young man, I say to thee, arise." And he that was dead sat up and begun to speak. And He gave him to his mother. And there came a fear upon them all: and they glorified God saying: "A great prophet is risen up among us: and God hath visited His people."



Padre Pio, original name Francesco Forgione, born May 25, 1887, Pietrelcina, Italy-died September 23, 1968, San Giovanni Rotondo; canonized June 16, 2002; feast day September 23

Born into a devout Roman Catholic family, he consecrated himself to God at age 5. As a youth, Francesco reported that he had experienced heavenly visions and ecstasies. At age 15 he joined the Capuchin order and took the name Pio in honor of St. Pius I. One of Pio's fellow friars later claimed to have seen him in ecstasy, and allegedly levitating above the ground. In 1910, the year in which he

became a priest, he received the stigmata for the first time, though they eventually healed.

He was drafted into the Italian military in 1915 for medical service during World War I but was discharged because of his poor health.

In 1916 Pio was ordered to return to his community life. He moved to an agricultural community, Our Lady of Grace Capuchin Friary, located in the Gargano Mountains in San Giovanni Rotondo in the Province of Foggia. He remained at San Giovanni Rotondo until his death in 1968. In the priesthood, Padre Pio was known to perform a number of successful conversions to Catholicism.

He received the stigmata again in 1918, and this time they remained with him until his death.

Padre Pio increasingly became well known among the wider populace. He became a spiritual director and developed five rules for spiritual growth: weekly confession, daily Communion, spiritual reading, meditation, and examination of conscience.

Pio was said to have had the gift of reading souls and the ability to bilocate, among other preternatural phenomena. He was said to communicate with angels and work favors and healings before they were requested of him.

He had a special mission to the souls in Purgatory and encouraged everyone to pray for them. He used to say, "We must empty Purgatory with our prayers."

Early in the morning of 23 September 1968, Pio made his last confession and renewed his Franciscan vows. Pio was devoted to rosary meditations and as was customary, he had his rosary in his hands. Till the end, he repeated the words "Gesù, Maria" (Jesus, Mary). At around 2:30 a.m., he said, "I see two mothers" (taken to mean his mother and Mary). With his last breath he whispered, "Maria!" Pio died at the age of 81.

His body was buried on 26 September in a crypt in the Church of Our Lady of Grace. His Requiem Mass was attended by over 100,000 people. He had often said, "After my death, I will do more. My real mission will begin after my death."

He was known for his piety, charity and the quality of his preaching. He famously advised, "Pray, hope and don't worry."

FATHER SAFREED'S REFLECTIONS

When I was living in Minnesota and working as an administrator for a group of Novus Ordo parishes many years ago (mea culpa), it was my custom to visit the town of Brainerd on Saturday. It was the day to go to a restaurant and pay a call on the shopping mall, such as it was in that venue.

While in a bookstore there, I picked up a book about Freemasonry, which had a lot of pictures in it. Almost smack-dab in the middle of this work was a large picture of John Paul II imposing hands on a man in the act of "ordaining" him! Good heavens I thought!— what is going on here — a book about the enemies of Christ and the Church and they are depicting a Catholic ordination?!?

Well, as will be explained, this picture was hardly an accident or a gesture of good will on the part of the Freemasonic brotherhood. It was a manifestation of what Wojtyla (JP II) believed about what he was doing — and what the Freemasons believed he was doing. That's why this picture was presented there.

This is the result of what is known as "Spirit Christology," as opposed to traditional and orthodox "Logos Christology." I will not burden you with extremely technical explanations of the differences between these two "theologies," suffice it to know that so-called Spirit Christology is extremely heretical, and should be exposed for what it is. Of course, it has been adopted by all the big names in the Vatican II sect.

The Spirit Christologists maintain essentially that Christ was not eternally God but assumed some type of god identity in his earthly life. Many say this was at the baptism of Jesus where the Spirit was made manifest and the Father's voice was heard. Jesus assumed divine sonship by virtue of the "Spirit," he was not the Divine Logos from all eternity, nor the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity. This closely resembles the heresy of Adoptionism that was condemned by Pope Leo III and a Council held at Rome in 798. The great theologian Thilo Stopka writes:

Spirit Christology presents the Redeemer as a human being who becomes Christ only through the "gift of the Spirit." This corresponds to the new rite of episcopal consecration. In addition, not only is the divinity of Christ denied, but another heresy concerning the Holy Trinity is immediately implied, for the new form (of episcopal consecration) also denies the procession of the Holy Ghost from the Son. For mainstream Spirit Christology clearly states that the 'spirit' proceeds from the Father INTO the Son, as if the later was in need of this gift, so that he could pass it on the apostles.

This obviously is not the Holy Spirit so...

Stopka goes on to say:

When John Paul II mixed manioc flour in a "sacred grove" with African witch doctors, in Togo during a ceremony of pagan nature worship, and poured it on the earth...he was deeply convinced that the cosmic SPIRIT was also active in the rites of these diabolical magicians.

So, JP II's understanding of the "Spirit" which has melded with witch doctors and Freemasons, is diabolical, as is the new rite of consecration of bishops. This was done to break apostolic succession, invalidate the priesthood and sacraments, so as to destroy the Church.


