## Sixteenth Sunday After Pentecost

**GOSPEL Luke 14:1-11** At that time, when Jesus went into the house of one of the chiefs of the Pharisees on the Sabbath-day to eat bread, they watched Him. And behold there was a certain man before Him that had the dropsy. And Jesus answering spoke to the lawyers and Pharisees, saying: Is it lawful to heal on the Sabbath-day? But they held their peace. But He taking him, healed him, and sent him away. And answering them, He said: Which of you shall have an ass or an ox fall into a pit and will not immediately draw him out on the Sabbath-day? And they could not answer Him to these things. And He spoke a parable also to them that were invited, marking how they chose the first seats at the table, saying to them when thou art invited to a wedding, sit not down in the first place, lest perhaps one more honorable than thou be invited by him; and he that invited thee come and say to thee: Give this man place: and then thou begin with shame to take the lowest place: But when thou art invited, go, sit down in the lowest place: that when he who invited thee cometh he may say to thee: Friend, go up higher. Then shalt thou have glory before them that sit at the table with thee; because everyone that exalts himself shall be humbled, and he that humbles himself shall be exalted."



*Gospel Commentary* ~ At the sight of the sick man, who stands before Him, Jesus is filled with compassion. He cures the affliction even though He knows that there are those who will criticize Him for curing on the Sabbath.

Jesus acts in a forthright manner. He pays no heed to what others will say. His critics consider themselves to be the authentic interpreters of the Law.

Later on, the Lord will show them that mercy should be exercised even on the Sabbath.

He provides an example gleaned from the common sense of the countryside. *He said: Which of you shall have an ass or an ox fall into a pit and will not immediately draw him out on the Sabbath?*

We may find obstacles to our faith, in the environment around us, such as envy, prejudice and misunderstandings due to ignorance. Our response should be the same as that of Jesus. We should not be afraid to give clear testimony to our beliefs. This type of behavior can be of great apostolic value.

On the other hand, it is terrible how much harm we can do if we allow ourselves to be carried away by the fear or the shame of being seen as Christians in ordinary life. Let us not fail to make manifest our Christian faith, always with humility and naturalness, whenever the situation requires it. We will never regret having acted in a manner so consistent with our deepest beliefs. The Lord will be filled with joy at such evidence of our fidelity. By Fr. Fernandez-Cavajal

## FATHER SAFREED'S REFLECTIONS

We have been discussing the reality that the changes instigated by the Vatican II sect to the form of the Consecration of bishops have rendered that rite invalid. This represents a substantial change, that closely resembles the form used by the Anglican church and was declared invalid by Pope Leo XIII. Ordinations performed by these bishops must be considered invalid and presents a significant problem for the Church. It is a problem however that will not be solved by human reckoning— the solution must come from God Himself.

In addition, underneath the defective form of the invalid new rite, there lies hidden the heretical ideas of “Spirit Christology,” rather than “Logos Christology” which is the proper and orthodox theology. A form that doesn't recognize Jesus as God, but only his acquired “sonship” has no power to consecrate a bishop or ordain a priest.

How did we end up in this dreadful situation? We gain insight from the great Henry Edward Cardinal Manning from a lecture he gave in the 19th century:

The Word of God tells us that toward the end of time the power of this world will become so irresistible and so triumphant that the Church of God will sink underneath its hand. **IT WILL BE DEPRIVED OF PROTECTION.** It will be weakened, baffled, and prostrate, and will lie bleeding at the feet of the powers of this world. The Church will seem, for a while, to be defeated, and the power of the enemies of the faith to prevail.

“It will be deprived of protection...” this refers to the absence of the Holy Ghost which in normal times protects the Church from error with regard to dogma, morality and the sacraments. It is impossible for the Church which is the “pillar and ground of the truth,” to officially and universally promulgate evil, heresy and invalid sacraments. Not improbable—impossible. The Church operates under the charisms of Infallibility and Indefectibility and cannot substantially change itself or what it formally teaches. “Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today and forever” Heb. 13:8. If it does change, then it cannot be the Church of Christ. But this defected church, is still thought of as the true Church in the minds of many. Such are the evil times in which we live.

Padre Pio had a realization of this, in spite of those who maintain that he did not. In the book “The Best Kept Secret of Fatima,” Jose Maria Zavala reports:

Fr. Gabriele Amorth who was the chief exorcist of the Diocese of Rome reports that Padre Pio stated the following to him about the year 1960: **“It is Satan who has been introduced into the Church and within a very short time will come to rule a false church.”**

Fr. Amorth said that he was not concerned with catastrophes such as wars, epidemics and such, but only for the Great Apostasy that was soon to afflict the Church. It tormented him, and for which he offered a great part of his suffering, as many souls would be lost because of this situation.

Again, from Cardinal Manning:

At this time...”the Church shall be scattered, driven into the wilderness, and shall be for a time, as it was in the beginning, invisible; hidden in catacombs, in dens, in mountains, in lurking places; for a time, it shall be swept, as it were from the face of the earth. **Such is the universal testimony of the Fathers of the early Church.**” But the Church will rise again, as did Our Lord Jesus Christ!


