Twentieth Sunday After Pentecost

GOSPEL John 4:46-53 At that time, there was a certain ruler, whose son was sick at Capharnaum. When he heard that Jesus had come from Judea into Galilee, he sent to Him and prayed Him to come down and heal his son: for he was at the point of death.

Jesus therefore said to him: "Unless you see signs and wonders, you believe not." The ruler said to him: "Lord, come down before my son dies." Jesus saith to him: "Go thy way. Thy son lives."

The man believed the word which Jesus said to him and went his way. And as he was going down, his servants met him: and they brought word, saying, that his son lived. He asked therefore of them the hour wherein he grew better. And they said to him: "Yesterday at the seventh hour, the fever left him." The father therefore knew that it was at the same hour that Jesus said to him: "Thy son lives." And himself believed, and his whole house.



Saint Teresa of Ávila

Saint Teresa of Ávila (1515–1582) canonized 1622; feast day October 15) was a Spanish writer and reformer of the Carmelite order. She was an influential and pivotal figure of her generation.

St. Teresa (Teresa de Cepeda y Ahumada) was born in Avila, Spain on 28th March 1515. Her parents were both pious Catholics and in some ways inspired their daughter to take up a life of prayer.

As a young child Teresa showed signs of a deeply religious nature; she would often retreat into silence for prayer and would enjoy giving alms to the poor. She was very close to her mother, who provided a warm counterbalance to the strictness of her father. However, in her teens, Teresa's mother passed away, leaving the young Teresa distraught at the void she felt. The young St. Teresa tells of her despair and how she turned instinctively to the Virgin Mary for comfort.

At the age of 16, her father decided to send Teresa to a convent school to be educated. This reignited in Teresa an interest in following a spiritual life and after some deliberation resolved to become a nun of the Carmelite Order. Shortly after becoming a nun, Teresa experienced a severe illness (malaria), which left her in great pain for a long period. At one point it was feared that her illness was so severe that she would not be able to recover. However, during this period of intense physical pain, she began to increasingly experience divine visions and an inner sense of peace.

At the age of 43, St. Teresa decided she wanted to found a new order recommitting to the values of poverty and simplicity. She guided the nuns not just through strict disciplines, but also through the power of love, and common sense and stressed the importance of experiencing God's Love.

She died on October 4 at the age of 67.

- **Parishioners, friends and visitors** are welcome to refreshments in the church hall following the 9:00 AM Mass.

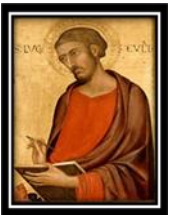
Gospel Commentary ~ God permitted the son of the ruler to fall sick, that he, being thereby led to seek assistance from Christ, might obtain faith and salvation. In like manner, in order to convert sinners, He often permits manifold evils and misfortunes to come upon them, either in their own persons, or in their children, or their goods. If God sends upon us tribulations, floods, hail, famine, war, sickness or death of those we love, He thereby seeks nothing else than to move us at least to abandon sin and to turn to Him. God, indeed, sometimes sends afflictions upon the pious and innocent, or allows them to be troubled and tormented by misfortune, but He does this only to try their patience and love for Him; to detach them from the world; to set them on their guard against sin; and to give them opportunity for gaining the greatest merits; for "to them that love God, all things work together unto good" (Rom. viii. 28). Such were the designs of God in regard to Job, Tobias, and others; and how profitable to them were these trials from God! But can we compare ourselves with these pious men when, instead of turning our trials to advantage by patience, we instead consider as our enemies those whom God makes use of, to sanctify us?

The father of a family, by example, can accomplish a great good! Hardly had this ruler received the faith, when his whole household was converted and believed in Jesus Christ. Thus, fathers and mothers of families, by their good example, their piety, their zeal in prayer, their frequent receiving of the holy sacraments, by their meekness, their moderation, their modesty, may do incalculable good to their dependents and the members of their houses. Would that they might reflect on this! "For if they have no care for their own, and especially those of their own house, they have denied the faith and are worse than the infidel" (I. Tim. v. 8).



Saint Luke was born a Greek and a Gentile in Antioch, Syria. He was a physician and it is believed that he may have also been a slave, as it was not uncommon in his day for slaves to be educated in medicine so the family would have a resident physician. Luke became a close companion of Paul of Tarsus and accompanied him on his missionary journeys. It is very possible that Luke provided medical assistance to Paul when he had been beaten, stoned or nearly drowned while evangelizing the Western Roman Empire. Luke is the only Gentile to have written books in the Bible. He is the writer of the third Gospel and the Acts of the Apostles and his writings have been proven to be historically accurate.

In the third Gospel, Luke emphasizes Christ's compassion for sinners and for those who suffer. One will also find in Luke's account of the gospel, a strong emphasis on the role women played in Christ's ministry. Luke's Christian ministry can be followed in the book of Acts. Up until the sixteenth chapter the story of Acts is written in the third person, much like an historian recording facts. The voice of the narrator then changes to first person and scholars believe this is done at the time Luke first joined Paul at Troas in the year 51. The book of Acts switches back to third person and scholars believe that this reflects a period in time when Luke was not present during the events that are recorded. It is believed that Luke lived a long life and died AD 74 in Greece. He was the first Christian physician and was venerated by the Catholic Church as the patron saint of physicians and surgeons. Saint Luke is also considered the patron saint of painters because according to tradition, he had painted images of Mary and of Jesus. This was later proven to be incorrect. Saint Luke's feast day is celebrated on October 18th.
