## FATHER SAFREED'S REFLECTIONS

#### PHILOSOPHY YOU SAY!

We are all philosophers whether we know it or not. Philosophy was born when man looked up into the sky and was overtaken by the wonder of what he saw. To walk along the beach and to be engrossed with the beauty of the water, sand, and birds in flight is to understand as a philosopher. Philosophy came along before any other discipline.

Philosophy deals with ultimate things and realities. It's not so much concerned with how something works, but more as to where it comes from, what its end and purpose is, etc.

Take a Golden Retriever for example. The breeder should be concerned with the quality of the genetic strain, so as to incorporate the best genetic material as possible. This is his concern, his object, so to speak. The veterinarian's concern is the health of the animal, his object largely, is to help the sick dog to regain or improve its health. People who sell dog food are concerned with the nutrition of the animal, etc.

But the philosopher's concern is with questions like: [1] how did this creature come into existence; (other than in the physical sense) [2] why is it here, and what is its purpose; [3] how does Fido understand reality; [4] can dogs love, or do they merely operate on instinct; [5] does the retriever have a purpose in the social order, [6] do dogs have a "moral" capacity, etc.

So, you see, people philosophize after all, perhaps without really understanding what they are doing. Philosophy is important because, in the best sense of the word, it teaches us how to think, how to use logic in our mental operations rather than just sentiment or emotion. Once a person becomes familiar with its terminology and approach, the discipline becomes less ominous, less foreboding.

When you hang a picture on the wall, you need a proper tool. More often than not a hammer is your instrument of choice, or perhaps a screwdriver. But a can opener will not do — as the purpose of that device is to open a can, and nothing else. Likewise in philosophy one must properly utilize the correct tool — and that tool is REASON. Reason, if used properly, opens the door to WISDOM. And that is contained in the very word "philosophy." It comes from two Greek words— PHILO, which is LOVE, or love of; and SOPHY, which is WISDOM. Therefore "Love of Wisdom." We shall discuss this more later.

Here are some of the divisions in philosophy:


Metaphysics: The Science of philosophy that deals with concepts like being, one, true, "the good"

Ontology: Simply the study of being as such.

Epistemology: The branch of philosophy concerned with the nature of "knowledge." This is a very important consideration in the modern world. More next week.
