Pentecost Sunday

GOSPEL John 14:23-31 At that time, Jesus said to His disciples: "If anyone love Me, he will keep My word, and My Father will love him and We will come to him and will make Our abode with him. He who does not love Me, does not keep My word. And the word that you have heard is not Mine, but the Father's, Who sent Me. "These things I have spoken to you while yet dwelling with you. But the Paraclete, the Holy Ghost, Whom the Father will send in My Name, He will teach you all things and bring all things to your mind, whatsoever I shall have said to you. Peace I leave with you, My peace I give unto you; not as the world gives, do I give unto you. Let not your heart be troubled: nor let it be afraid. You have heard that I said to you: 'I go away, and I am coming to you.' If you loved Me you would indeed be glad, because I go to the Father: for the Father is greater than I. And now I have told you before it comes to pass, that when it shall come to pass, you may believe.

I will no longer speak much with you, for the Prince of the world is coming and in Me He has nothing. But He comes that the world may know that I love the Father and that I do as the Father has commanded Me."

Saint Anthony of Padua, was born Fernando Martins in Lisbon, Portugal (15 August 1195 – 13 June 1231).

He was born into a wealthy family and by the age of fifteen asked to be sent to the Abbey of Santa Cruz in Coimbra, the then capital of Portugal. During his time in the abbey, he learned theology and Latin. Fernando eventually received permission to leave the abbey so he could join the new Franciscan Order. When he was admitted, he changed his name to Anthony.

St. Anthony then traveled to Morocco to spread God's truth, but became extremely sick and was to return to Portugal to recover. The return voyage was blown off-course and the party arrived in Sicily, from which they traveled to Tuscany. In 1226, after attending the General Chapter of his order, St. Anthony was appointed provincial superior of northern Italy. He chose the city of Padua as his location.

St. Anthony had a book of psalms that contained notes and comments to help when teaching students and, in a time when a printing press was not yet invented, he greatly valued it. When a novice decided to leave the hermitage, he stole St. Anthony's valuable book. When he discovered it was missing, St. Anthony prayed it would be found or returned to him. The thief did return the book and in an extra step returned to the Order as well. St. Anthony is typically depicted with a book and the Infant Child Jesus and is commonly referred to today as the "finder of lost articles."

So simple and resounding was his teaching of the Catholic Faith, most uneducated and the innocent could understand his messages. It is for this reason St. Anthony was declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope Pius XII in 1946.

St. Anthony was only 36-years-old when he died and was canonized less than one year afterward by Pope Gregory IX. Upon exhumation some 336 years after his death, his body was found to be corrupted, yet his tongue was totally incorrupt, so perfect were the teachings that had been formed upon it. regulate the the second to the the

The infant Church was gathered together in the upper room at Jerusalem. At the third hour the Holy Ghost descended upon the apostles in the form of tongues of fire, thus completing the first step in their sanctification, thus bringing them to spiritual maturity.

The Holy Ghost excludes no one. Men of all nations and of all peoples unite to confess:

"The Spirit of the Lord hath filled the whole world, alleluia; and that which containeth all things hath knowledge of the voice, alleluia"(Introit).

He lives in the hearts of those who will receive Him. He is the source and the bond of unity, of mutual understanding and reciprocal love. Sin and its author, the evil spirit, breed disharmony, strife and contention. Therefore, we pray in the Introit, "Let God arise and let His enemies be scattered. This plea for action on the part of God is continued in the Kyrie and in the Collect of the Mass. The Epistle gives us the historical

account of the events that occurred on Pentecost. But the work begun on Pentecost is not yet complete and must be renewed and repeated in us. Hence, we kneel after the Epistle and sing: "Come, Holy Ghost, fill the hearts of Thy faithful, and enkindle in them the fire of Thy love" Then we rise to our feet and sing:

Come, Thou Holy Spirit, come, and from Thy celestial home, send Thy light and brilliancy.

Come, Thou father of the poor. Come, thou source of gifts secure, come, our heart's true radiancy.

The Holy Ghost comes to us to dwell in our hearts with the Father and the Son, truly and personally. He is our teacher;

He brings peace. At the Offertory we sing psalm 67, which sings of the victory of Christ and His Church. We join in this victorious procession, decked out in the royal livery of Christ (through baptism and confirmation).

Having conquered evil within ourselves and in our surroundings, we proceed like glorious victors to the "temple which is in Jerusalem," that is, to the altar. We pray that God may confirm and perfect in us what we received at Easter through baptism, and that it may be renewed and strengthened by the Holy Ghost.

In the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass the wonderful things related in the Epistle are re-enacted in us. As we offer our sacrifice, we turn from self-love and offer our own souls to God. Thus, we make room for the entry of the Holy Ghost. We receive Holy Communion and thus receive a new and more perfect incorporation in Christ. We become more perfectly united to the body of Christ than ever before if we live by the Spirit of Christ, the Holy Ghost. This thought is presented to us in the Communion chant, for if we devoutly receive Holy Communion, we shall be "filled with the Holy Ghost" Baur

FATHER SAFREED'S REFLECTIONS

THE CRISIS OF TRUTH I

Let me begin the discussion of Truth by disclosing three examples of individuals who have trouble with the truth.

[1] Some time ago, a [traditional] bishop came calling unexpectedly. We eventually went out to breakfast and began discussing various Church related matters. When it came to the question of who can or cannot receive Holy Communion, he stated: "I give Communion to anyone in church because if they think that they're Catholic, then they are."

[2] I was visiting the home of some of our parishioners when in a discussion with an older lady, who is 90 years old, told me that she held a grudge toward me because I told her "that the truth is not dependent upon her feelings." "What else is there but feelings?" she asked.

[3] Years ago, a women asked to speak to me after Sunday Mass. She was very upset that from the pulpit I said that the Catholic Faith is the one true Faith. She said that she had never heard this before, and accused me of fostering a "cult of self." "It's all about you," she declared. She was just a few years younger than myself.

Over the years it has become increasingly clear to me that the problem in the world, the Church, and in American society is not really one of faith exactly, but a problem of REASON—its a crisis of philosophical first principles. Put another way, it's a crisis of a breakdown of the logic of correct thinking that leads to Truth.

Where did this begin? Well, with Original Sin humanity became estranged from God, and therefore from the Truth, so it really began in the Garden of Eden. Adam and Eve disobeyed God's command, which is a violation of the Truth, is it not? They put fig leaves on themselves so as to keep their sin hidden from themselves as well as God, but God knew the truth and found them out anyway. Of course!

This problem accentuated massively beginning with the period of the Enlightenment, [c.1685-1815] the hallmark of which was characterized by "the turn to the subject."

The three scenarios depicted above, in relatively small ways, manifest this phenomenon of turning to the subject in form that is typical of the world presently. It brought us the Protestant Revolt, and the general revolt against God, creation, and reason that we see all around us today.

And so, once again, issues of social justice are not at the forefront of the problems we confront.

It is, rather, for want of truth that the world suffers. For without truth, there can be no justice.

Truth, simply understood, is conformity to what is real, not woke imposition of the unreal...

Nor does one need to have read Thomas Aquinas to know this. Anyone with half a brain can

intuit the principle laid down by the Common Doctor seven centuries ago: "Truth is the correspondence of the mind and reality..." There can be no advantage therefore, in anyone having the right to be wrong. To insist that two plus two equals five is not a right exercise, of which any sentient human being ought to defend. To believe otherwise amounts to a *deliberate stupidity*, which is how the late Bernard Lonergan, SJ once described sin. From an essay by Regis Martin in *Crisis Magazine*, January 5, 2022
