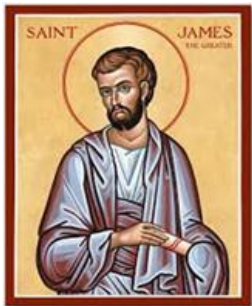

Seventh Sunday After Pentecost

GOSPEL Matt. 7:15-21 At that time, Jesus said to His disciples: "Beware of false prophets, who come to you in the clothing of sheep, but inwardly they are ravening wolves. By their fruits you shall know them. Do men gather grapes of thorns, or figs of thistles? Even so every good tree bringeth forth good fruit, and the evil tree bringeth forth evil fruit. A good tree cannot bring forth evil fruit, neither can an evil tree bring forth good fruit. Every tree that bringeth not forth good fruit, shall be cut down, and shall be cast into the fire. Wherefore by their fruits you shall know them. Not everyone that saith to me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven: but he that doth the will of My Father who is in heaven, he shall enter into the kingdom of heaven."



St. James, also called James, son of Zebedee, or James the Greater, (born, Galilee, Palestine—died 44 AD, Jerusalem; feast day July 25), one of the Twelve Apostles, distinguished as being in Jesus' innermost circle and the only apostle whose martyrdom is recorded in the New Testament (Acts 12:2).

James is styled "the Greater" to distinguish him from the Apostle James "the Less", with greater meaning older or taller, rather than more important. James the Greater was the brother of John the Apostle.

James is described as one of the first disciples to join Jesus. The Synoptic Gospels state that James and John were with their father by the seashore when Jesus called them to follow him. [Matt. 4:21–22] [Mk. 1:19–20]

James was one of only three apostles whom Jesus selected to bear witness to his Transfiguration.

Salome, the mother of James and John asked Jesus to grant them seats on His right and left in His glory. Jesus asked if they were ready to drink from the cup He was going to drink from and said the honor was not even for Him to grant.

James and his younger brother, St. John the Apostle, are designated Boanerges (from the Greek boanerges), or "Sons of Thunder" (Mark 3:17), perhaps because of their characteristic fiery zeal (Mark 9:38 and Luke 9:54). James and his brother wanted to call down fire on a Samaritan town but were rebuked by Jesus.

Following Christ's Ascension, James spread the Gospel across Israel and the Roman kingdom as well. He traveled and spread the Word for many years in Spain.

Later, James returned to Jerusalem but was martyred for his faith, beheaded by order of King Herod Agrippa I of Judaea. According to Spanish tradition, his body was taken to Santiago de Compostela.

Saint James is the patron saint of Spain. The traditional pilgrimage to the grave of the saint, known as the "Way of St. James", has been the most popular pilgrimage for Western European Catholics from the Early Middle Ages onwards. When July 25th falls on a Sunday, it is a "Holy Year" and a special east door is opened for entrance into Santiago Cathedral. In the 2004 Holy Year, 179,944 pilgrims were received at Compostela. In the 2010 Holy Year the number was 272,412 and in 2021 it was 178,912. The next Holy Year is 2027.

FATHER SAFREED'S REFLECTIONS

OFFICE OF ANTICHRIST II

This week we continue with a report called "Official Guidelines to Inaugurate the Golden Age of Blessed Peace from the Office for Antichrist" issued by the infamous P2 Freemasonic Lodge of Italy in 1962, just prior to Vatican II:

[8] Profane hymns to the Mother of God and St. Joseph. Call it idolatry. Replace with Protestant songs. This will imply that the Catholic Church is finally admitting that Protestantism is the true religion, or at least equal to the Catholic Church.

[9] Replace all hymns, even to Jesus. These hymns remind people of their sweet childhood, which will in turn remind them of the peace that came from following a rigorous life of self-denial and penance for God. Bring in new songs, to convince people that the former rites were somehow wrong. Be sure to have at least one song in each Mass that never mentions Jesus, but only love of humans. The young will be enthusiastic about love of neighbor. [God centeredness replaced by man centeredness]

[10] Remove all saints relics from altars, and then remove the altars themselves. Replace with pagan, unblessed tables, **which will be used to offer live sacrifice at Satanic Masses.** Repeal the Church law that says that Mass in churches can only be said on altars with saints' relics.

[11] Stop the practice of saying Mass before the Holy Eucharist in the tabernacle...make the altar look like a dinner table, to imply that it is not sacred, but could do double duty for anything, such as a conference table or playing cards...Never let the priest kneel at Mass—nor genuflect—as people don't genuflect or kneel at a mere meal. [The genuflections in the New Mass were reduced to 3, and many "priests" don't even do that]

[12] Remove saints from the Church calendar, a few at a time. Forbid priests to talk about saints, unless mentioned in the Gospel. Say that there might be Protestants in church who might not like it. [Gone especially are the martyrs of the ancient Church. They weren't ecumenical, and didn't engage in "dialog," but gave up their lives for Christ]

[13] When introducing the Gospels, drop the word 'Saint' simply say the Gospel of John, rather than St. John. This will imply that people should not honor them anymore. **Keep rewriting Bibles until identical to Protestant Bibles.** [They did this with their 'New American Version of the Bible' in use in Novus Ordo parishes]

[14] Remove and destroy all prayerbooks...this will effectively reduce thanksgiving after Communion to a sham.

[15] Remove all statues and pictures of angels. Why have statues of our enemies around, anyway? Call it a myth or a bedtime story. [I've heard these things said in the past 60 years, as I am sure many of you have]
