Fifteenth Sunday After Pentecost

GOSPEL Luke 7:11-16 At that time, Jesus went into a city that is called Naim: and there went with Him His disciples and a great multitude. And when He came nigh to the gate of the city, behold a dead man was carried out, the only son of his mother: and she was a widow. And a great multitude of the city was with her. Whom when the Lord had seen, being moved with mercy towards her, He said to her: "Weep not." And He came near and touched the bier. And they that carried it stood still. And He said: "Young man, I say to thee, arise." And he that was dead sat up and begun to speak. And He gave him to his mother. And there came a fear upon them all: and they glorified God saying: "A great prophet is risen up among us: and God hath visited His people."



ST. MATTHEW THE APOSTLE ~ Little is known about St. Matthew, Apostle and Evangelist, except that he was born Levi, the son of Alpheus, and he was likely born in Galilee. He worked as a tax collector, which was a disliked profession during the time of Christ.

According to the Gospel, Matthew was working at a collection booth in Capernaum when Christ came to him and said, "Follow me." With this simple call, Matthew became a disciple of Christ.

From Matthew we know of the many doings of Christ and the message Christ spread of salvation for all people who come to God through Him. The Gospel account of Matthew tells the same story as that found in the other three Gospels, so scholars are certain of its authenticity. His book is the first of the four Gospels in the New Testament.

Many years following the death of Christ, around 41 to 50AD, Matthew wrote his gospel account. He wrote the book in Aramaic in the hope that his account would convince his fellow people that Jesus was the Messiah and that His kingdom had been fulfilled in a spiritual way. It was an important message at a time when almost everyone was expecting the return of a militant messiah brandishing a sword.

It is thought he departed for other lands to escape persecution sometime after 42AD. According to various legends he fled to Parthia and Persia, or Ethiopia. Like 11 of the 12 apostles, St. Matthew is traditionally thought to have died as a martyr while preaching the Gospel. Saint Matthew is often depicted with one of the four living creatures of Revelation 4:7, which reads, "The first living creature was like a lion, the second like a bull, the third living creature had a human face, and the fourth living creature was like a flying eagle."

Matthew was a tax collector and is therefore the patron saint of bankers and accountants. The Church established St. Matthew's feast day as September 21st.

FATHER SAFREED'S REFLECTIONS

COMMUNIST TECHNIQUES USED IN POLAND

We continue with a selection from "Vatican II Exposed as Counterfeit Catholicism," by Frs. Francisco and Dominic Radecki, CMRI

In the mid-1940's, Communist leaders in Poland told priests to break the confessional seal and report those who opposed them. In Yugoslavia, Tito used laymen disguised as priests to do the job. Polish Secret Police Sluzba Bzpieczenstwa (SB) archives record:

The regime was kept extremely well informed. At any given time, there were well over 1,000 priests who worked as spies and informants for the Polish Communist government. In a shocking betrayal of trust, the confidentiality of the confessional was regularly breached.

In 1949, Polish Communists used pax (peace) priests, who took an oath of loyalty to them, to spread Marxism and Modernism. All who refused to join were imprisoned, exiled or executed. Of the 3,647 priests and 1,117 nuns Communists imprisoned in Poland, 1996 priests and 238 Sisters died there. Cardinal Wyszynski (Warsaw) gained some freedoms for the Church by working with Communist leaders but sacrificed much in return.

TWO CAMPS

It is easy to control a nation where people live in fear. Few have the courage to rebel after leaders are removed and executed. In 1954, a Communist mob beat Auxiliary Bishop Franc (Split, Yugoslavia) for suspending priests who formed the schismatic, pro-Communist SS. Cyril and Methodius Association. At Vatican II, he heroically defended Catholic belief. Those who collaborated with Communists enjoyed special privileges. **Fr. Wojtyla, the future John Paul II, quickly advanced from priest to "pope," and taught, traveled, camped, skied, canoed and pursued hobbies, while faithful Polish clergy and laity were arrested and executed.**

"CATHOLICS" WORKING FOR COMMUNISTS

In Hungary, a number of priests joined the 'Priests of the Peace' movement, showing allegiance to the Kremlin, not Rome. In the 1960's, Communists forced every Catholic priest in Bulgaria to become a member of the Communist Partisans for Peace movement, which according to journalist, Asian Humbaraci, was a, "...great political and military enterprise of Moscow." Chinese Communists formed a schismatic church with "patriot priests" and bishops loyal to them. Czechoslovakian Communists imprisoned bishops or placed them under house arrest, disbanded Religious Orders and sent 487 Jesuits to concentration camps. Communists seized all Catholic schools and Communist propaganda was taught in seminaries. Author Corrado Pallenberg said, "Very many priests have been enrolled in the Communist Party."

COMMUNIST METHODS IN THE UNITED STATES

In 1953, Bella Dodd told the U.S. House Committee on Un-American Activities:

In the late 1920's and 1930's directives were sent from Moscow to all Communist Party organizations. **In order to destroy the Catholic Church from within, party members were to be planted in seminaries and within organizations...I myself put some 1,200 men in Catholic seminaries.** She stated that 'right now they are in the highest places in the Church' where they were working to weaken the Church's effectiveness against Communism. **These changes, she declared, would be so drastic that 'you will not recognize the Catholic Church.'**



DRESS POLICY ~ If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes of Vatican II in the Church, few parishes have had any kind of dress code: we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of reverence for the Most Blessed Sacrament. Please observe these minimum standards of dress for attendance at Church and when attending any functions at the Chapel: **Everyone should refrain from jeans, shorts or T-shirts.**

Ladies, use a head covering, available in the rear of the church either for loan or for purchase.
