

Sixteenth Sunday After Pentecost

GOSPEL Luke 14:1-11 At that time, when Jesus went into the house of one of the chiefs of the Pharisees on the Sabbath-day to eat bread, they watched Him. And behold there was a certain man before Him that had the dropsy. And Jesus answering spoke to the lawyers and Pharisees, saying: Is it lawful to heal on the Sabbath-day? But they held their peace. But He taking him, healed him, and sent him away. And answering them, He said: Which of you shall have an ass or an ox fall into a pit and will not immediately draw him out on the Sabbath-day? And they could not answer Him to these things. And He spoke a parable also to them that were invited, marking how they chose the first seats at the table, saying to them when thou art invited to a wedding, sit not down in the first place, lest perhaps one more honorable than thou be invited by him; and he that invited thee come and say to thee: Give this man place: and then thou begin with shame to take the lowest place: But when thou art invited, go, sit down in the lowest place: that when he who invited thee cometh he may say to thee: Friend, go up higher. Then shalt thou have glory before them that sit at the table with thee; because everyone that exalts himself shall be humbled, and he that humbles himself shall be exalted."



St. Padre Pio, original name Francesco Forgione, born May 25, 1887, Pietrelcina, Italy- died September 23, 1968, San Giovanni Rotondo; canonized June 16, 2002; feast day September 23

Born into a devout Roman Catholic family, he consecrated himself to God at age 5. As a youth, Francesco reported that he had experienced heavenly visions and ecstasies. At age 15 he joined the Capuchin order and took the name Pio in honor of St. Pius I. One of Pio's fellow friars later claimed to have seen him in ecstasy, and allegedly levitating above the ground. In 1910, the year in which he became a priest, he received the stigmata for the first time, though they eventually healed.

He was drafted into the Italian military in 1915 for medical service during World War I but was discharged because of his poor health.

In 1916 Pio was ordered to return to his community life. He moved to an agricultural community, Our Lady of Grace Capuchin Friary, located in the Gargano Mountains in San Giovanni Rotondo in the Province of Foggia. He remained at San Giovanni Rotondo until his death in 1968. In the priesthood, Padre Pio was known to perform a number of successful conversions to Catholicism.

He received the stigmata again in 1918, and this time they remained with him until his death.

Padre Pio increasingly became well known among the wider populace. He became a spiritual director and developed five rules for spiritual growth: weekly confession, daily Communion, spiritual reading, meditation, and examination of conscience.

Pio was said to have had the gift of reading souls and the ability to bilocate, among other preternatural phenomena. He was said to communicate with angels and work favors and healings before they were requested of him.

He had a special mission to the souls in Purgatory and encouraged everyone to pray for them. He used to say, "We must empty Purgatory with our prayers."

Early in the morning of 23 September 1968, Pio made his last confession and renewed his Franciscan vows. Pio was devoted to rosary meditations and as was customary, he had his rosary in his hands. Till the end, he repeated the words "Gesù, Maria" (Jesus, Mary). At around 2:30 a.m., he said, "I see two mothers" (taken to mean his mother and Mary). With his last breath he whispered, "Maria!" Pio died at the age of 81.

His body was buried on 26 September in a crypt in the Church of Our Lady of Grace. His Requiem Mass was attended by over 100,000 people. He had often said, "After my death, I will do more. My real mission will begin after my death."

He was known for his piety, charity and the quality of his preaching. He famously advised, "Pray, hope and don't worry."

FATHER SAFREED'S REFLECTIONS

COUNTERFEIT CHURCH VIII

We continue with a selection from "Vatican II Exposed as Counterfeit Catholicism" by Frs. Francisco and Dominic Radecki, CMRI

Bella Dodd in a conversation with Alice Von Hildebrand told Mrs. Von Hildebrand that there were four cardinals within the Vatican 'who are working for the Communists.' This was twelve years before Vatican II. [It was a] thoroughly organized and minutely crafted plan, which Communists believed, would ultimately destroy the United States of America. The methods she detailed required Communist Party members and other idealists, who would inadvertently be willing conduits, to be planted in every social, religious and political aspect of American life.

In 1954, Rev. Charles McIntyre, representing the International Council of Christian Churches, defended statements by J. Matthews from the American Mercury Magazine, that "the Communist Party has enlisted the support of at least 7,000 Protestant clergymen. The clergymen, he added, had served Communist as 'party members, fellow-travelers, espionage agents, party-line adherents and unwitting dupes.' He also said,"...outside the known leadership the Communist Party of the U.S., the five top pro-Soviet propagandists in this country are all Protestant clergymen." They come from many denominations and include 23 bishops. Many American elite accepted and promoted Modernist beliefs. Hollywood glorified aspects of Communism once Stalin joined America and England to defeat Nazi Germany.

COMMUNIST SLAUGHTER

The history of Communism is a bloody trail of revolution, persecution and terrorism that concentrates power in the hands of a few and enslaves its subjects. Consider the Russian Revolution of 1917, the Chinese Revolution of 1949, the reprisals against Hungary in 1956, purges in Cuba, North Korea, Vietnam, and Cambodia and the vile revolutions that occurred in Africa. In 1968, Moscow quickly put down the rebellion in Czechoslovakia by sending half a million Warsaw Pact troops and numerous Soviet tanks to her border. Mao Zedong, leader of Communist China, was responsible for the deaths of 76 million Chinese who were mercilessly executed, died under forced slave labor or starved.

[In 1954] Only 594 of the once 5,700 foreign Catholic missionaries were still in China as the red regime set in motion a new wave of persecution. There were only 30 American missionaries, 17 of whom were in jail and 5 under house arrest.


