

Feast of Christ the King

GOSPEL (**St. John 18:33-37**) At that time, Pilate therefore went into the hall again and called Jesus and said to him: "Art Thou the King of the Jews?" Jesus answered: "Sayest thou this thing of thyself, or have others told it thee of Me?" Pilate answered: "Am I a Jew? Thy own nation and the chief priests have delivered Thee up to me. What hast Thou done?" Jesus answered: "My kingdom is not of this world. If My kingdom were of this world My servants would certainly strive that I should not be delivered to the Jews: but now My kingdom is not from hence." Pilate therefore said to Him: "Art Thou a King then?" Jesus answered: "Thou sayest that I am a King. For this was I born, and for this came I into the world; that I should give testimony to the truth. Every one that is of the truth heareth My voice."

Feast of Christ the King



The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, commonly referred to as the Feast of Christ the King, is observed on the last Sunday of October. Pope Pius XI instituted the Feast of Christ the King in his encyclical letter Quas primas of 1925, in response to growing secularism.

According to Cyril of Alexandria, "Christ has dominion over all creatures, ...by essence and by nature." His kingship is founded upon the hypostatic union. "...The Word of God, as consubstantial with the Father, has all things in common with him, and therefore has necessarily supreme and absolute dominion over all things created."

"From this it follows that to Christ, angels and men are subject. Christ is also King by acquired, as well as by natural right, for he is our Redeemer. ...' We are no longer our own property, for Christ has purchased us "with a great price"; our very bodies are the "members of Christ." A third ground of sovereignty is that God bestowed upon Christ the nations of the world as His special possession and dominion. "All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me." (Matthew 28:18)

The feast has an eschatological dimension pointing to the end of time when the kingdom of Jesus will be established in all its fullness to the ends of the earth. It also leads into Advent, when the Church commemorates the arrival of the newborn king.

FATHER SAFREED'S REFLECTIONS

THE THIRD SECRET OF FATIMA

As far back as I can remember, I have heard talk about Fatima and especially the so-called "Third Secret" of Fatima. Well known is the vision of Hell to the children, as well as the much talked about Consecration, of which there is no consensus about whether it has actually happened or not. I will not venture an opinion concerning that matter.

Of the Third Secret, I think it can be safely stated that we are at least ninety percent certain as to what it is. From Novus Ordo Watch:

In May of 1994—77 years after Our Lady first appeared to the three children at Fatima, Portugal—a French priest was listening to a CD entitled "Mysterium Fidei," with French lyrics and sung by French choirs. As he was listening devoutly, suddenly the music faded into the background and a clear voice, which was perceived quite normally and not as an interior inspiration, said: "The Church will bleed from all her wounds." Then, there followed this text:

There will be a wicked council planned and prepared that will change the countenance of the Church. Many will lose the Faith; confusion will reign everywhere. The sheep will search for their shepherds in vain.

A schism will tear apart the holy tunic of My Son. This will be the end of times, foretold in the Holy Scriptures and recalled to memory by Me in many places. The abomination of abominations will reach its peak and it will bring the chastisement announced at La Sallette. My Son's arm, which I will not be able to hold back anymore, will punish this poor world, which must expiate its crimes.

One will only speak about wars and revolutions. The elements of nature will be unchained and will cause anguish even among the best (the most courageous). The Church will bleed from all Her wounds. Happy are they who will persevere and search for refuge in My Heart, because in the end My Immaculate Heart will triumph.

After this message, the priest heard only one more sentence: "This is the Third Secret of Fatima."

This text has been reported and published before, in the R&R book The Devil's Final Battle as well as in a newsletter of the then-SSPX Bishop William Richardson in the year 2000. I will offer commentary on this text next week.

ALL SAINTS DAY ~ On May 13, 609 A.D. Pope Boniface IV dedicated the Pantheon in Rome in honor of all Christian martyrs, and the Catholic feast of All Martyrs Day was established in the Western church. Pope Gregory III later expanded the feast day to include all saints as well as all martyrs and moved the observance from May 13th to November 1st.

ALL SOUL'S DAY ~ In the Catholic Church, "the faithful" refers specifically to baptized Catholics; "all souls" commemorates the church penitent souls in Purgatory. It is called the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed and is celebrated on November 2nd.

We can pay no greater honor to the Saints than by offering up to God in their name the Blood of Jesus. The efficacy of their past merits and present prayers are greatly increased when offered to God in close association with the merits and prayers of our Lord. Therefore, the Church commemorates on this day all the Saints in heaven without exception, and thus honors also those who are unknown and who have no public recognition in the Liturgy. DRESS POLICY ~ If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes of Vatican II in the Church, few parishes have had any kind of dress code: we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of reverence for the Most Blessed Sacrament.
