## First Sunday of Advent

**GOSPEL (Luke 21. 25-33)** At that time, Jesus said to His disciples: "There shall be signs in the sun, and in the moon, and in the stars; and upon the earth distress of nations, by reason of the confusion of the roaring of the sea and of the waves: men withering away for fear and expectation of what shall come upon the whole world. For the powers of heaven shall be moved; and then they shall see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with great power and majesty. But when these things begin to come to pass, look up and lift up your heads, because your redemption is at hand." And He spoke to them a similitude: "See the fig tree, and all the trees; when they now shoot forth their fruit, you know that summer is nigh; so, you also, when you shall see these things come to pass, know that the kingdom of God is at hand. Amen, I say to you, this generation shall not pass away till all things be fulfilled. Heaven and earth shall pass away, but My words shall not pass away."



**The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception** celebrates the solemn celebration of the Immaculate Conception of the Virgin Mary. It is universally celebrated on December 8th, nine months before the feast of the Nativity of Mary, celebrated on September 8th. The Immaculate Conception is one of the most important Marian feasts in the liturgical calendar of the Roman Catholic Church and is celebrated worldwide.

A feast called the Conception of Mary arose in the Eastern Church in the seventh century. It came to the West in the eighth century. In the eleventh century it received its present name, the Immaculate Conception. In the eighteenth century it became a feast of the universal Church. It is now recognized as a solemnity.

In 1854, Pius IX solemnly proclaimed: "The most Blessed Virgin Mary, in the first instant of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege granted by Almighty God, in view of the merits of Jesus Christ, the savior of the human race, was preserved free from all stain of original sin."

Mary's predestination to this singular grace—consistent with the suspension of the universal decree by which every man, from the moment of his conception is contaminated with original sin—leads us to ponder in the deepest depths the mystery of the Most Holy Trinity's salvific plan.

God, One and Triune, had foreseen from the very beginning the future incarnation of the Word culminating in the redemption of human nature that had fallen into sin. He therefore predestined pure Mary, so that He could draw from her uncontaminated humanity, which the Son could adopt in order to re-establish in Himself the original purity of creation and re-orientate it to eternal glory.

She is a perfect image of the Church in heaven, the new triumphant Jerusalem, that won't have any marks nor will there be pain and death. She is and will always be the Mother of God, the Mother of the Church, the Queen of the Angels and Saints.

Immaculate Mary is full of grace. She is not only Christ's disciple, who with the help of grace has overcome the chains of sin, but she is totius Trinitatis nobile triclinium, the noble resting place of the Holy Trinity.

(St Thomas Aquinas, Expositio Salutationis Angelicae, I).

The Immaculate, full of grace, will always be Mother and Queen for that elect part of the Church that we hope one day to join, that will one day joyfully sing before the Almighty.



**On the first Sunday of Advent**, the faithful stand at the gate, for this is the beginning of a new year in the cycle of how the Church worships her Creator. The circumstances of the world today seem off-balance in many ways. The weeks of Advent invoke the four facts most important to consider for spiritual maturity: Death, Judgment, Heaven and Hell.

On the last Sunday of October, the feast declared Christ is King of the universe. Sovereign as He is over all things including our souls, it is nonetheless possible to shut our minds to Him by deceitfulness and to turn our actions away from Him by selfishness. Christ limits his access to our souls by an old royal protocol, which William Pitt expressed in terms of earthly monarchs: "The poorest man may in his cottage bid defiance to all the forces of the Crown." Our Lord does not invade, but He does invite: "Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come into him and eat with him, and he with Me" (Revelation 3:20).

In Advent He awaits our invitation: "Come, Lord" (1 Corinthians 16:22).

In death there is a last chance to open the door: "For we know that if the tent that is our earthly home is destroyed, we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens" (2 Corinthians 5:1).

We do know that Christ stands at the gate. As another line in that poem says:

"So, I went forth, and finding the Hand of God, trod gladly into the night.

And He led me towards the hills and the breaking of day in the lone East.

## FATHER SAFREED'S REFLECTIONS

### MODERNISM I

Taken from Vatican II Exposed as Counterfeit Catholicism by Frs. Francisco and Dominic Radecki, CMRI

The Catholic Church founded by Jesus Christ is based on Divine Revelation. It is composed of two unchangeable elements, Sacred Scripture and Apostolic Tradition. St. Augustine explains:

For this is our faith, that is, the true faith, the right faith, the Catholic Faith, which comes, not from private judgement—but from the testimony of the Scriptures, not based on faltering heretical rashness, but on Apostolic Truth.

The Vatican Council of 1869-1870 in its Dogmatic Constitution Concerning the Catholic Faith infallibly declared what one must believe to be a member of the Catholic Church. The theological term used for these infallible teachings is *de fide* (concerning the faith).

All those things are to be believed by divine and Catholic faith which are contained in the Word of God written [Sacred Scripture] or handed down [Apostolic Tradition] and which are proposed for our belief by the Church either in a solemn definition or in its ordinary and universal teaching authority.

Pope Pius XII taught, “This Deposit of Faith our Divine Redeemer has given for authentic interpretation not to each of the faithful, not even to theologians, but only to the Teaching Authority of the Church.” Dr. Ludwig Ott explains: “By dogma in the strict sense is understood a truth immediately (formally) revealed by God which has been proposed by the Teaching Authority of the Church to be believed as such.” The [first] Vatican Council’s Dogmatic Constitution of the Church of Christ, shows the Catholic Church is not a loosely knot organization, but a divine institution based on belief.

We declare that it has been so plainly determined in its founding that any societies whatsoever that are separated from the unity of faith or from communion with this body cannot in any way be said to be a part or a member of it. And it cannot be said to be diffused and distributed among the various Christian denominations; but it is an integrated unit, entirely coherent; and, in its conspicuous unity, it shows itself an undivided and indivisible body, which is the true Mystical Body of Christ.

Catholics must believe all *de fide* Church dogmas. Our Lord said (in Sacred Scripture), “He who is not with me is against me.” “Not everyone who says to Me, Lord, Lord, shall enter the Kingdom of Heaven; but he who does the will of My Father in Heaven shall enter the kingdom of Heaven.”

**DRESS POLICY** ~ If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes of Vatican II in the Church, few parishes have had any kind of dress code: we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of reverence for the Most Blessed Sacrament. Please observe these minimum standards of dress for attendance at Church and when attending any functions at the Chapel:

**Everyone should refrain from jeans, shorts or T-shirts.** Ladies, use a head covering, available in the back of the church for loan or purchase.



*Remember, also, Lord, Your servants and handmaids below who are gone hence before us, marked with the sign of faith, and sleep the sleep of peace. To them, Lord and to all that rest in Christ, grant, we implore You a place of happiness, light and peace through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.*
