Second Sunday of Advent

GOSPEL Matt. 11:2-10 At that time, when John had heard in prison the works of Christ: sending two of his disciples he said to Him: "Art thou He that art to come, or look we for another?" And Jesus making answer said to them: "Go and relate to John what you have heard and seen. The blind see, the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead rise again, the poor have the gospel preached to them. And blessed is he that shall not be scandalized in Me."

And when they went their way, Jesus began to say to the multitudes concerning John: "What went you out into the desert to see? a reed shaken with the wind? But what went you out to see? a man clothed in soft garments? Behold they that are clothed in soft garments, are in the houses of kings. But what went you out to see? A prophet? Yea I tell you, and more than a prophet. For this is He of whom it is written: 'Behold I send My angel before My face, who shall prepare thy way before thee.' "



Recently I read something I had written about Advent in an essay rather a while ago, and in it I pointed out that this holy season every year is a healthy kind of crisis. The Chinese character for "crisis" consists of two strokes: one stands for "danger" and the other "opportunity." Advent is an opportunity to think deeply about Death, Judgment, Heaven and Hell. If The Four Last Things are dangerous subjects, they also are an opportunity to be rescued from living life superficially. The tradition of discussing these mysteries is especially important when foolish worldliness distorts the globe.

Without Advent, the only thing to do is to "rush" Christmas, with celebrations without much purpose. That turns Christmas inside out and can even make it depressing. Superficial Christmas is "joy without a cause" as G.K. Chesterton said in his epic poem, The Ballad of the White Horse. He also said a couple of years earlier: "There is no more dangerous or disgusting habit than that of celebrating Christmas before it comes."

Our Lord spoke of people who "loved the dark rather than the light" (John 3:19), and we see that today in those who would ban any mention of Christmas. The tendency to set up Christmas decorations before Christmas is at least a clumsy way of expressing a desire for light rather than dark, but it is futile without a moral awareness of what light and dark are.

Advent is awkward because its mysteries are not the sort of things entertainers dressed as elves sing about. While the Church calls attention to reality, avuncular clergymen often succumb to fantasy themselves, with Christmas parties in Advent and wreaths without reason. Of course, this is illogical; because it contradicts the way the Logos arranged the world. The Logos, or the Word, is Jesus Himself, who uttered all things into being by saying, "Fiat" — "Let there be." And the first thing He let there be was light: "Light from Light" as the Creed chants it. But the only way to recognize the illogic of Christmas without Advent is to "walk as children of light" (Ephesians 5:8).

The choice of darkness rather than light is a preference for the Prince of Darkness rather than Christ the Light. The best way to walk in the Light is to get rid of the darkness in the soul, and so Advent is a prime time for confessing sins in the Sacrament of Penance. Then the penitent is re-united with the Light of the World. Christ sheds light on Death, Judgment, Heaven and Hell, giving moral cogency to the mystery of life itself. "He is before all things, and by Him all things are held together" (Colossians 1:17). As the highest truths are very simple, the simplest logic is this: Without the Christ of Christmas, all things fall apart. Father Rutler

FATHER SAFREED'S REFLECTIONS

MODERNISM II

SEPARATION FROM THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

Individuals can separate themselves from the Catholic Church by heresy, apostasy, and schism. Heresy is a rejection of one or more de fide teachings of the Catholic Church. Heresy is derived from the Greek word for "choice." Well-known heretics include Arius, Luther and Cranmer.

Apostasy occurs when a baptized Catholic completely abandons the Faith. Apostasy is so widespread today that this age is called the Post-Christian Era.

Schism occurs when "a baptized person...rejects the authority of the Supreme Pontiff or refuses Communion with members of the Church who are subject to him." Schism comes from the Greek word for "division." Schismatics deny Papal Primacy and Papal Infallibility.

Papal Primacy means the pope is above all bishops and exercises universal jurisdiction over the entire Church. Papal Infallibility means the pope cannot err when teaching the universal Church in matters of faith and morals. Both doctrines are de fide dogmas of the Church.

HERETICS ARE EXCOMMUNICATED AND LOSE THEIR OFFICE

A heretic is one who

...after Baptism, while remaining nominally a Christian, pertinaciously [with conscious and intentional resistance to the authority of God and the Church] denies or doubts any of the truths which must be believed of divine and Catholic Faith.

The 1917 Code of Canon Law further explains:

All apostates from the Christian faith, and all heretics and schismatics 1. Are ipso facto excommunicated. 2. If after due warning they fail to amend, they are to be deprived of any benefice, dignity, pension, office, or other position which they may have in the Church, they are to be declared infamous, and clerics after a repetition of the warning are to be deposed.

Canon Law uses the term ipso facto (by the fact itself) and excommunicated (cut off from the Catholic Church) to denote that a person is immediately and instantly separated from the Catholic Church by heresy, apostasy and schism. No official declaration is necessary.

Canon Law lists eight cases where clerics are deposed from ecclesiastical offices for public profession of heresy without any declaration. Canon 188, no. 4, states:

Through tacit resignation, accepted by the law itself, all offices become vacant ipso facto and without any declaration if a cleric... 4. Has publicly forsaken the Catholic Faith.

When an external violation of the law occurs, in the external forum the existence of malice is presumed until the contrary is proved, because in the ordinary case man acts knowingly and freely.

DRESS POLICY ~ If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes of Vatican II in the Church, few parishes have had any kind of dress code: we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of reverence for the Most Blessed Sacrament. Please observe these minimum standards of dress for attendance at Church and when attending any functions at the Chapel:

Everyone should refrain from jeans, shorts or T-shirts. Ladies, use a head covering, available in the back of the church for loan or purchase.



Remember, also, Lord, Your servants and handmaids below who are gone hence before us, marked with the sign of faith, and sleep the sleep of peace. To them, Lord and to all that rest in Christ, grant, we implore You a place of happiness, light and peace through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
