Quinquagesima Sunday

GOSPEL Luke 18:31-43 At that time, Jesus took unto Him the twelve and said to them: "Behold, we go up to Jerusalem; and all things shall be accomplished which were written by the prophets concerning the Son of Man. For He shall be delivered to the Gentiles and shall be mocked and scourged and spit upon. And after they have scourged Him, they will put Him to death. And the third day He shall rise again."

And they understood none of these things and this word was hidden from them, and they understood not the things that were said. Now it came to pass, when He drew nigh to Jericho, that a certain blind man sat by the wayside, begging. And when he heard the multitude passing by, he asked what this meant. 12 Traditional Catholic - Lenten Practices

On Ash Wednesday, all over the world, traditional Catholics are going to be praying and fasting. It is a powerful day to ask for God's forgiveness and for the salvation of Souls. All of us need to pray for unity and purity of Catholic dogma. We also want to repent of individual and collective sins that are destroying the Mystical Body of Christ.

Here are some suggestions of what we can do for Lent:

- 1) **Do a very humble and sorrowful confession.** Take the time to go over a very good examination of conscience and write down your sins so as to not forget them. Often, we get nervous in the confessional and can forget them. Stating how many times and when was the last time you committed the sins. This helps the confessor to give you the right penance and to help you root out these vices. Especially be sorrowful for sacrilegious sins such as receiving Holy Communion with a mortal sin on your soul.
- 2) **Holy Mass every day.** It takes a lot of discipline to get up early to go to Holy Mass, but the fruits are well worth it. There is no greater prayer than the prayer of Jesus to the Father through the Holy Ghost during the Holy Mass in which we participate.
- 3) **Pray the Holy Rosary.** Meditate prayerfully on the Passion of Jesus (Sorrowful Mysteries) every day during lent. It would be even more effective if the whole family prays it together. Try to put your heart into the words and meditations on the passion.
- 4) **Read the Bible.** Read and meditate on all that led up to the passion and crucifixion of Jesus. Each Gospel depicts the passion and crucifixion a little differently.
- 5) **Pray the Stations of the Cross.** Take yourself back in time to the Holy Land, retracing the steps of Jesus on His way to Calvary. *Every Wednesday during Lent after the 9:00 AM Mass. Also, on Fridays during Lent, there will be Stations of the Cross and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament starting at 7:00 PM.*
- 6) **Read a traditional Catholic book.** Like the "Imitation of Christ" or "The Secret of the Rosary", to encourage and inspire you to be happier and holier.
- 7) **Make time for heart felt prayer.** This is best done in front of the Blessed Sacrament. If for some reason you cannot go to a church, pray at home facing where ever the closest Tabernacle is. Then have faith that God has heard your prayers.
- 8) **Disconnect from social media.** Fast from Facebook, blogs and use your cell phone and computer, to the absolute minimum. We need to be connected to God instead, not the internet and the cell phone. Help your children to not use video games and electronic devices at all. If you haven't already disconnected cable and TV antennas, lent is the perfect time to do this. There is no good left on TV.
- 9) **Stop watching the news.** Instead use this time to pray for the world governments. What good does it do us to be depressed over all the evil things going on in the world that we have no control over? This time can be much better used to love and communicate with our families and make our home a happier world where they can see the difference. Take time to communicate with each other and love each other more.
- 10) **Fast by eating healthy and as a family.** Make a firm promise to absolutely, not buy any fast food. Sacrifice time to make delicious healthy homemade meals that everyone can enjoy. Stay away from desserts and sodas.
- 11) **Forgive and Pray for those who have hurt you.** Forgive everything from the past, once and forever. Holding on to pain from our childhood, our parish, our spouses, does more harm to our spiritual life than you can imagine. "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us", "Love your enemy", "Pray for those who persecute you", says Jesus. Pray for all those who are destroying Catholic doctrine and liturgy too.
- 12) **Stop taking the Salvation of The World on your shoulders.** Jesus is the savior of the world. We are just to help those with whom we have influence. And let us not forget, salvation starts with our own souls and family. Every time you get depressed about the pope, bishops, priests, religious and laity, get down on our knees and pray about it. Then, give it over to God, Mary and the Saints to take care of it. We are not God. Invite people this lent to attend a Holy Mass at Chapel of the Holy Family. God is still in charge of the Church and the world. We are only His humble servants.

FATHER SAFREED'S REFLECTIONS

MODERNISM XI

We continue with the series from *Vatican II Exposed as Counterfeit Catholicism* by Frs. Francisco and Dominic Radecki, CMRI.

ROLE REVERSAL

Catholic clergy are ordained to teach and guide souls. They have a serious obligation to lead their flock to Heaven. Sadly, clergy infected with Modernism led astray those under their care. This role reversal is typified by Communist leaders who often appoint an atheist to be the Minister of Religion and a criminal as Chief of Police. **Pope Pius XII** and the Roman Curia strenuously opposed the New Theology that was subtly undermining the faith. Modernist theologians were seen as saboteurs and spiritual assassins. In 1933, Cardinal Pacelli called the Nazis, "false prophets with the pride of Lucifer," and "bearers of a new faith and a new gospel." Modernists also fit that description perfectly.

Modernists were not simply progressive thinkers who wanted to help, but cruel wolves who sought to destroy. Once the barriers were removed following the death of **Pope Pius XII** and the neutralization of the Roman Curia by John XXIII and Paul VI, Modernism reigned supreme. A relatively small number of Modernists had a tremendous scope of influence. Those in power chose like-minded auxiliary bishops and zealous theologians (fellow heretics) to assist them in the sinister task of constructing a Counterfeit Church. This nucleus of Modernists was extremely well organized in all fronts and influenced bishops from all over the world..

MODERNIST CLERGY

There were two types of Modernists: wolves that rarely used a disguise and wolves that donned sheep's clothing. Both deceived the masses and were compensated in different ways.

Radical Priests Edward Schillebeeckx, Karl Rahner, Hans Kung, John Courtney Murray, Bernhard Haring, and Marie-Dominique Chenu led many astray by their writings. They rarely concealed their heretical beliefs and true motives. Their work was indispensable and their reward was world-wide fame. By writing, teaching, giving lectures, and using the mass media, they were at the forefront of change.

Bishops Annibale Bugnini, Karel Calewart, Dom Helder Camara, Emile De Smedt, Augustin Bea, Manuel Larrain, Stephen Leven, and Paul Hallinan used their office to promote Modernist heresies.

DRESS POLICY ~ If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes of Vatican II in the Church, few parishes have had any kind of dress code: we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of reverence for the Most Blessed Sacrament. Please observe these minimum standards of dress for attendance at Church and when attending any functions at the Chapel:
