## Laetare Sunday - Fourth Sunday in Lent

**GOSPEL** (**John 6:1-15**) At that time, Jesus went away to the other side of the sea of Galilee, which is that of Tiberias. And a great multitude followed Him, because they saw the miracles which He did on them that were diseased. Jesus therefore went up into a mountain: and there He sat with His disciples.

Now the Passover, the festival day of the Jews, was near at hand. When Jesus therefore had lifted up His eyes and seen that a very great multitude had come to Him, He said to Philip: "Whence shall we buy bread, that these may eat?" And this He said to try him: for He Himself knew what He would do.

Philip answered Him: "Two hundred denarii worth of bread is not sufficient for them that everyone may take a little." One of His disciples, Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, said to Him: "There is a boy here that has five barley loaves and two fishes. But what are these among so many?" Then Jesus said: "Make the men sit down."

Now, there was much grass in the place. The men therefore sat down, in number about five thousand. And Jesus took the loaves: and when He had given thanks, He distributed to them that were set down. In like manner also of the fishes, as much as they would. And when they were filled, He said to His disciples: "Gather up the fragments that remain, lest they be lost." They gathered up therefore and filled twelve baskets with the fragments of the five barley loaves which remained over and above to them that had eaten.

Now those men, when they had seen what a miracle Jesus had done, said: "This is indeed the Prophet who is to come into the world." Jesus, therefore, when He knew that they would come to take Him by force and make Him king, fled again into the mountains, Himself alone.

**Laetare Sunday,** the fourth Sunday in the season of Lent. Traditionally, this Sunday has been a day of celebration, within the austere period of Lent. The term "Laetare Sunday" comes from the Latin laetare, the singular imperative of laetari: "to rejoice". This Sunday gets its name from the first few words of the traditional Latin Introit for the Mass of the day, "Laetare Jerusalem" — "Rejoice, O Jerusalem".

Laetare Sunday is also known as Mothering Sunday and Rose Sunday, either because the golden rose sent by Popes to Catholic sovereigns used to be blessed at this time, or because

the use of rose-colored (rather than violet) vestments was permitted on this day.

Laetare Sunday is considered a day of relaxation from normal Lenten duties, a day of hope with Easter within sight. Traditionally, weddings (otherwise banned during Lent) could be performed on this day, and servants were released from service for the day to visit their mothers (hence 'Mothering Sunday').

By its anticipation of the joy of Easter, Laetare Sunday is meant to give us hope and encouragement as we slowly progress towards the Paschal Feast. In addition to attending Sunday Mass, a family might choose to mark Laetare Sunday by anticipating the Easter feast; a Sunday brunch with roses on the table would be appropriate. A family might also wish, during this beginning period of spring, to plant a rose bush on this day.

#### **MODERNISM XV**

#### CARDINAL CUSHING, cont'd

Cardinal Cushing founded the Missionary Society of St. James the Apostle in 1958 with diocesan priests and others from Australia, Canada, England, Ireland, New Zealand, Scotland, the Philippines and Wales to be missionaries in the United States, Bolivia, Ecuador and Peru. This organization promotes Ecumenical dialogue and inculturation, and spreads Modernist beliefs worldwide. The cardinal believed differences in religion were cultural, not religious. When the famous Jesuit author, Walter Abbott, asked why he frequented Protestant churches, he replied, "...we are not trying to make converts." **Pope Pius XII** opposed Cushing's ecumenical views. On August 8, 1949, the Holy Office wrote him a letter reprimanding him and reminding him of the doctrine that the Catholic Church is the one, true Church. It quoted the pope's encyclical *Mystici Corporis Christi* of June 29, 1943.

Only those are really to be included as members of the Church who have been baptized and profess the true faith, and who have not had the misfortune of withdrawing from the body or for grave faults been cut off by legitimate authority.

#### **COLLEGE FOR BISHOPS?**

Since Cardinal Cushing's Latin was very poor, he left the First Session of Vatican II after three weeks. He returned during the Fourth Session to support religious liberty and claimed he lost \$400,000 in donations by being away from his archdiocese during that time. A story surfaced during the Council that Cushing, not understanding Latin well, asked a nearby bishop what was being discussed. The prelate replied, "College of Bishops." Cushing, not realizing this referred to *Collegiality*, and not to a physical structure, is claimed to have said, "Fine, if that's what they want, tell them I'll raise the million dollars to build it."

#### A MAN WHO WORE MANY HATS

Enjoying the spotlight and public acclaim, Cardinal Cushing took every opportunity to make himself the center of attention. He often donned the hats of bystanders, while wearing his episcopal robes. This practice was used by John Paul II and Francis. To his credit, Cardinal Cushing wrote an inspiring book on **Pope Pius XII** in 1959 that is loaded with photos and wonderfully portrays his life. The prelate was deeply moved by his sanctity and admired his practical nature in leading the Church in troubled times.

DRESS POLICY ~ If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes of Vatican II in the Church, few parishes have had any kind of dress code: we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of reverence for the Most Blessed Sacrament. Please observe these minimum standards of dress for attendance at Church and when attending any functions at the Chapel:

Everyone should refrain from jeans, shorts or T-shirts. Ladies, use a head covering, available in the back of the church for loan or purchase.



Remember, also, Lord, Your servants and handmaids below who are gone hence before us, marked with the sign of faith, and sleep the sleep of peace. To them, Lord and to all that rest in Christ, grant, we implore You a place of happiness, light and peace through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
