Passion Sunday

GOSPEL (John 8:46-59) At that time, Jesus said to the crowds of the Jews, "Which of you can convict Me of sin? If I say the truth to you, why do you not believe Me: He that is of God hears the words of God. Therefore, you hear them not, because you are not of God."

The Jews therefore answered and said to Him: "Are we not right in saying that You are a Samaritan and hast a devil?" Jesus answered: "I have not a devil: but I honor my Father. And you have dishonored Me. But I seek not My own glory: there is One that seeks and judges. Amen, amen, I say to you: If any man keeps My word, he shall not see death forever."

The Jews therefore said: "Now we know that Thou hast a devil. Abraham is dead, and the prophets: and Thou says: If any man keep My word, he shall not taste death forever. Art Thou greater than our father Abraham who is dead?"

And the prophets are dead. Whom dost Thou make Thyself?"

Jesus answered: "If I glorify Myself, My glory is nothing. It is My Father that glorifies Me, of whom you say that He is your God. And you have not known Him: but I know Him. And if I shall say that I know Him not, I shall be like to you, a liar. But I do know Him and do keep His word. Abraham your father rejoiced that he might see My day: he saw it and was glad." The Jews therefore said to Him: "Thou art not yet fifty years old. And hast Thou seen Abraham?" Jesus said to them: "Amen, amen, I say to you, before Abraham was made, I AM." They took up stones therefore to cast at Him. But Jesus hid Himself and went out of the temple.



The Annunciation (from Latin *annuntiatio*), also referred to as the Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, is the Catholic celebration of the announcement by the Archangel Gabriel to the Blessed Virgin Mary that she would conceive and become the mother of Jesus, the Son of God, marking His Incarnation. "I am the Lord's servant," Mary answered. "May your word to me be fulfilled."

According to Luke 1:26, the Annunciation occurred "in the sixth month" of Elizabeth's pregnancy with John the Baptist. Many Christians observe this event with the Feast of the Annunciation on March 25th, an approximation of the northern vernal equinox nine full months before Christmas, the ceremonial birthday of Jesus.

The Annunciation is a key topic in Christian art. Depictions of the Annunciation go back to early Christianity, with the Priscilla catacomb including the oldest known fresco of the Annunciation, dating to the 4th century. It has been a favorite artistic subject in both the Christian East and as Roman Catholic Marian art, particularly during the Middle Ages and Renaissance, and figures in the repertoire of almost all of the great masters. The figures of the Virgin Mary and the Angel Gabriel, being emblematic of purity and grace, were favorite subjects of Roman Catholic Marian art, where the scene is also used to represent the perpetual virginity of Mary via the announcement by the Angel Gabriel that Mary would conceive a child to be born the Son of God.

Works on the subject have been created by artists such as Sandro Botticelli, Leonardo da Vinci, Caravaggio, Duccio, Jan van Eyck, and Murillo among others. The mosaics of Pietro Cavallini in Santa Maria in Trastevere in Rome (1291), the frescos of Giotto in the Scrovegni Chapel in Padua (1303), Domenico Ghirlandaio's fresco at the church of Santa Maria Novella in Florence (1486), and Donatello's gilded sculpture at the church of Santa Croce, Florence (1435) are famous examples.

Both the Roman Catholic and Eastern Orthodox Churches hold that the Annunciation took place at Nazareth, but slightly differ as to the precise location. The Basilica of the Annunciation marks the site preferred by the former, while the Greek Orthodox Church of the Annunciation marks that preferred by the latter.

FATHER SAFREED'S REFLECTIONS

MODERNISM XVI

From Vatican II Exposed as Counterfeit Catholicism by Frs. Francisco and Dominic Radecki, CMRI

ARCHBISHOP FULTON SHEEN

Fulton Sheen was the most charismatic religious figure in American history. Peter Sheen, who was born in El Paso, Illinois on May 8, 1895, soon began to be called by his mother's maiden name, Fulton. After Vatican II, he became a champion of Modernism. How did this occur?

SHEEN'S MENTOR, BISHOP JOHN SPALDING

After Fulton Sheen served Mass for Bishop Spalding (1840-1916) at Peoria Cathedral, the prelate told him he would sponsor him to study in Louvain, Belgium. Sheen was ordained a diocesan priest in Peoria, Illinois on September 20, 1919. Bishop John Spalding had also studied at Louvain, Belgium and had been ordained there on December 19, 1863. He and his uncle, Archbishop Martin Spalding of Baltimore, who founded the American College of Louvain in 1857, established the Catholic University of America in 1889. Archbishop Spalding opposed Freemasonry, Modernism and False Religious Liberty. Both prelates attended Councils held in Baltimore during the nineteenth century. The Catholic University of Louvain and the Catholic University of America may have had good beginnings, but both became Modernist centers by the early or mid-twentieth century.

ON TO LOUVAIN

Sheen studied at the Catholic University for two years (1920-1922) and then took philosophy courses at the Catholic University of Louvain for a year. In 1923, he took classes at the Sorbonne in Paris and the Angelicum in Rome and returned to Louvain, where he received his doctorate in philosophy and received the Cardinal Mercier Award for his thesis. After some parish work, Sheen began teaching the philosophy of religion and other subjects at the Catholic University of America in Washington, DC in 1926. His career was just beginning.

THE "PROFESSIONAL" THEOLOGIAN

Sheen pioneered the era of professional theologians, who sold millions of books, are known by their secular names (See, Ratzinger, Kung, etc.) and were very influential at Vatican II. It is interesting to note that the title page in a number of Sheen's books stress his training at Louvain, professing he is a member of a special, elite group. America was a major obstacle to the revolutionary changes proposed at Vatican II. Modernists knew they had to convince thinking Americans that the alterations on doctrine and worship were just a part of keeping up with the times. His training at Louvain taught Sheen how to make Modernism palatable and socially acceptable to Americans.

DRESS POLICY ~ If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes of Vatican II in the Church, few parishes have had any kind of dress code: we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of reverence for the Most Blessed Sacrament. Please observe these minimum standards of dress for attendance at Church and when attending any functions at the Chapel:

Everyone should refrain from jeans, shorts or T-shirts. Ladies, use a head covering, available in the back of the church for loan or purchase.



Remember, also, Lord, Your servants and handmaids below who are gone hence before us, marked with the sign of faith, and sleep the sleep of peace. To them, Lord and to all that rest in Christ, grant, we implore You a place of happiness, light and peace through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
