Good Shepard Sunday (Second Sunday After Easter)

GOSPEL John 10:11-16 At that time, Jesus said to the Pharisees: "I am the Good Shepherd. The good shepherd lays down His life for His sheep. He who is a hired hand and not a shepherd, who does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and flees, and the wolf snatches them and scatters them.

He flees because he is a hired hand and cares nothing for the sheep.

"I am the Good Shepherd. I know Mine and Mine know Me, just as the Father knows Me and I know the Father; and I lay down My life for My sheep. And I have other sheep that are not of this fold.

I must bring them also, and they will hear My voice, and there will be one-fold and one Shepherd."

Many other signs also did Jesus in the sight of His disciples, which are not written in this book.

But these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God: and that believing, you may have life in His name.



Saint Catherine of Siena was born during the outbreak of the plague in Siena, Italy on March 25, 1347. She was the 25th child born to her mother, although half of her brothers and sisters did not survive childhood. Catherine herself was a twin, but her sister did not survive infancy. Her mother was 40 when she was born. Her father was a cloth dyer. At the age of 16, Catherine's sister, Bonaventura, died, leaving her husband as a widower. Catherine's parents proposed that he marry Catherine as a replacement, but Catherine opposed this. She began fasting and cut her hair short to mar her appearance. Her parents attempted to resist this move, to avoid marriage, but they were unsuccessful. Her fasting and her devotion to her family, convinced them to relent and allow her to live as she pleased.

Catherine once explained that she regarded her father as a representation of Jesus and her mother as Our Lady, and her brothers as the apostles, which helped her to serve them with humility.

Despite Catherine's religious nature, she did not choose to enter a convent and instead she joined the Third Order of St. Dominic, which allowed her to associate with a religious society while living at home. Fellow Dominican sisters taught St. Catherine how to read. Meanwhile, she lived quietly, isolated within her family home.

St. Catherine developed a habit of giving things away and she continually gave away her family's food and clothing to people in need. She never asked permission to give these things away, and she quietly put up with their criticisms.

Something changed her when she was 21. She described an experience she referred to as her "mystical marriage to Christ." In her vision, she was told to reenter public life and to help the poor and sick. She often visited hospitals and homes where the poor and sick were found. Her activities quickly attracted followers who helped her in her mission to serve the less fortunate.

St. Catherine was drawn further into the world as she worked, and eventually she began to travel, calling for reform of the Church and for people to confess and to love God totally.

She became involved in politics and was key in working to keep Italian city states loyal to the Pope. She was also credited with helping to start a crusade to the Holy Land. From 1375 onwards, St. Catherine began dictating letters to scribes. She petitioned for peace and was instrumental in persuading the Pope in Avignon to return to Rome. She was influential in restoring the Papacy to Rome and in brokering peace deals during a time of factional conflict and war between the Italian city states.

St. Catherine also established a monastery for women in 1377 outside of Siena. She is credited with composing over 400 letters, her Dialogue, which is her definitive work, and her prayers. These works are so important that St. Catherine would later be declared a Doctor of the Church. She is one of the most well-known saints in the Church.

By 1380, the 33-year-old had become ill, possibly because of her habit of extreme fasting. Her confessor ordered her to eat, but she replied that she found it difficult to do so, and that possibly she was ill. In January of 1380, her illness accelerated her inability to eat and drink. Within weeks, she was unable to use her legs. She died on April 29th, following a stroke just a week prior.

St. Catherine's Feast Day is April 29th. She is the patroness of the United States, Italy, nurses and people ridiculed for their faith. She is also the patroness against fire, illness, miscarriages, and sexual temptation.

FATHER SAFREED'S REFLECTIONS

FRANCIS CARDINAL SPELLMAN Archbishop of New York (1889-1967)

From "Vatican II Exposed as Counterfeit Catholicism" by Frs. Francisco and Dominic Radecki, CMRI

SPELLMAN AND POPE PIUS XII

After being ordained in 1916, Francis Spellman studied at the North American College in Rome. In 1918, he served Cardinal O'Connell of Boston as assistant to the archdiocesan chancellor, becoming very proficient in financial matters. His life was obscure until he was asked to accompany a pilgrimage to Rome in 1925 as interpreter. Msgr. Borgongini-Duca, his former professor in Rome, recognized him and asked him to assist another group in the same capacity. When **Pope Pius XI** saw how accurately he translated his speech, he had him assist Cardinal Gasparri in the Vatican office of the Secretary of State.

He would work closely with Cardinal Pacelli, the future **Pope Pius XII**, and the two became close friends. Spellman was an efficient opportunist, who had many contacts and knew how to get things done. Cardinal Pacelli consecrated him bishop at St. Peters Basilica on September 8, 1932 and Spellman was appointed Auxiliary Bishop of Boston. In 1939, he became the Archbishop of New York. Spellman recognized the threat of Communism to the United States and the world. **Pope Pius XII** who also saw the danger, became the strongest anti-Communist pope of the twentieth century.

In 1946, **Pope Pius XII** made Spellman a cardinal and worked closely with him and the Dulles brothers since he needed America's support against Communist aggression. Moscow, amazingly, knew exactly what America and the Vatican were doing **since much of the classified information between them went through pro-Communist secretary Msgr. Montini.** [Always the traitor— Montini, the future Paul VI, promulgated the Vatican II anti-council and the new mass—My comment.]

Through Spellman, **Pius XII** could work almost directly with the Catholic lobby in Washington, with the Senate and the Pentagon, and other key figures in the U.S. government.

Incidentally, it will be recalled that Spellman was also the Military Vicar of the American armed forces.

In May 1949, "Look" magazine asked Spellman to write a cover story titled "The Pope's War on Communism." He wrote that Pius had embarked on a crusade against the atheistic philosophies of Communist Russia...

[the pope's armies] are the God-loving peoples of the earth...

During the 1960's Communism was at the height of its power as it attempted to gain world domination as the Iron Curtain towered over Europe and the Bamboo Curtain over Asia.

Many in the Vatican were glad when Cardinal Spellman came to Rome, since he customarily brought a check for a million dollars for the Peter's Pence.

DRESS POLICY ~ If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes of Vatican II in the Church, few parishes have had any kind of dress code: we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of reverence for the Most Blessed Sacrament. Please observe these minimum standards of dress for attendance at Church and when attending any functions at the Chapel:

Everyone should refrain from jeans, shorts or T-shirts. Ladies, use a head covering, available in the back of the church for loan or purchase.



Remember, also, Lord, Your servants and handmaids below who are gone hence before us, marked with the sign of faith, and sleep the sleep of peace. To them, Lord and to all that rest in Christ, grant, we implore You a place of happiness, light and peace through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.


