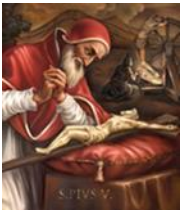

Third Sunday After Easter

GOSPEL John 16:16-22. At that time, Jesus said to His disciples: "A little while, and you shall see Me no longer; and again, a little while and you shall see Me, because I go to the Father." Some of His disciples therefore said one to another, "What is this He says to us, 'A little while and you shall not see Me, and again a little while, and you shall see Me'; and 'I go to the Father'?" They said therefore: "What is this 'little while' of which He speaks? We do not know what He is saying." And Jesus knew that they had a mind to ask Him. And He said to them: "Of this do you inquire among yourselves, because I said, 'A little while, and you shall not see Me, and again a little while, and you shall see Me.' Amen, amen, I say to you, that you shall lament and weep, but the world shall rejoice: and you shall be made sorrowful, but your sorrow shall be turned into joy. A woman, when she is in labour, hath sorrow, because her hour is come; but when she hath brought forth the child, she no longer remembers the anguish, for her joy that a man is born into the world. And you therefore have sorrow now; but I will see you again and your heart shall rejoice, and your joy no one shall take from you."



Saint Pius V, Pope ~ Pope from 1566-1572 and one of the foremost leaders of the Catholic Reformation. Born Antonio Ghislieri in Bosco, Italy, to a poor family, he labored as a shepherd until the age of fourteen and then joined the Dominicans, being ordained in 1528.

Called Brother Michele, he studied at Bologna and Genoa, and then taught theology and philosophy for sixteen years before holding the posts of master of novices and prior for several Dominican houses.

Named inquisitor for Como and Bergamo, he was so capable in the fulfillment of his office that by 1551, and at the urging of the powerful Cardinal Carafa, he was named by Pope Julius III commissary general of the Inquisition.

In 1555, Carafa was elected Pope Paul IV and was responsible for Ghislieri's swift rise as a bishop of Nepi and Sutri in 1556, cardinal in 1557, and grand inquisitor in 1558.

While out of favor for a time under Pope Pius IV who disliked his reputation for excessive zeal, Ghislieri was unanimously elected a pope in succession to Pius on January 7, 1566. As pope, Pius saw his main objective as the continuation of the massive program of reform for the Church, in particular the full implementation of the decrees of the Council of Trent.

He published the Roman Catechism, the revised Roman Breviary, and the Roman Missal; he also declared Thomas Aquinas a Doctor of the Church, commanded a new edition of the works of Thomas Aquinas, and created a commission to revise the Vulgate. The decrees of Trent were published throughout all Catholic lands, including Europe, Asia, Africa, and the New World, and the pontiff insisted on their strict adherence.

In 1571, Pius created the Congregation of the Index to give strength to the Church's resistance to Protestant and heretical writings, and he used the Inquisition to prevent any Protestant ideas from gaining a foot hold in Italy.

In dealing with the threat of the Ottoman Turks who were advancing steadily across the Mediterranean, Pius organized a formidable alliance between Venice and Spain, culminating in the Battle of Lepanto, which was a complete and shattering triumph over the Turks. The day of the victory was declared the Feast Day of Our Lady of Victory in recognition of Our Lady's intercession in answer to the saying of the Rosary all over Catholic Europe.

Pius also spurred the reforms of the Church by example. He insisted upon wearing his coarse Dominican robes, even beneath the magnificent vestments worn by the popes, and was wholeheartedly devoted to the religious life.

His reign was blemished only by the continuing oppression of the Inquisition; the often-brutal treatment of the Jews of Rome; and the ill-advised decision to excommunicate Queen Elizabeth I of England in February 1570, an act which also declared her deposed and which only worsened the plight of English Catholics.

These were overshadowed in the view of later generations by his contributions to the Catholic Reformation. Pope Clement beatified him on May 1, 1672, and Pope Clement XI canonized him on May 22, 1712.

FATHER SAFREED'S REFLECTIONS

FRANCIS CARDINAL SPELLMAN AND JOHN XXIII

Continuing with "Vatican II Exposed as Counterfeit Catholicism" by Frs. Francisco and Dominic Radecki, CMRI

Following the death of **Pope Pius XII** on October 9, 1958, Spellman and other American cardinals formed an anti-Communist bloc to prevent the election of Cardinal Roncalli (the future John XXIII). Leading KGB official Mr. Broslow listed Roncalli and Montini (Paul VI) on the Kremlin's "papabile" list since they favored Communism and never opposed it. John XXIII personally banned Cardinal Spellman from Rome except to attend the Council.

John never forgave Spellman for the role he played in the Cold War, nor for propelling anti-Communist President Diem [brother of Archbishop Ngo Dinh Thuc] into a position of power in South Vietnam; nor indeed, for his steady expounding of an anti-Russian hard line. The ban was even more significant in that it gave clear notice to Spellman and the forces he represented that the special relationship between Washington and the Vatican, which flourished under Pius XII, was now permanently at an end.

SPELLMAN'S ROLE AT THE SECOND VATICAN COUNCIL

Cardinal Spellman, viewed as the leader of the Catholic Church in America, was a member of the Vatican II Coordinating Commission and a Council President. While courageously defending the Latin Mass, he accepted the New Theology as the Council progressed. His love of power may have undermined his traditional beliefs. [One wonders if Spellman might also have been blackmailed. My comment]

He gave 131 oral and written interventions during the Council. Spellman was so adamant about having John Courtney Murray, a proponent of False Religious Liberty, as his theologian during Vatican II, that he threatened not to come unless Murray came too. There are allegations that Cardinal Spellman was a homosexual.

Francis Spellman...was long rumored to be gay, according to a book by John Cooney, who said that many whom he interviewed took his homosexuality for granted. In addition, a book published in 1998 claims that in World War II Spellman was carrying on a relationship with a chorus boy in the Broadway review "One Touch of Venus."

[I have heard more than once that his nickname around New York and environs was "Franny" LOL! My comment]
