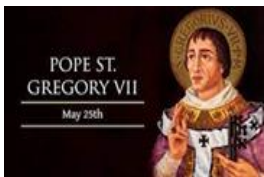

Sunday After the Ascension

GOSPEL John 15:26-27; 16:1-4 At that time, Jesus said to His disciples: "When the Paraclete has come, Whom I will send you from the Father, the Spirit of truth Who proceeds from the Father, He shall give testimony of Me. And you shall give testimony because you are with Me from the beginning." These things have I spoken to you that you may not be scandalized. They will put you out of the synagogues. Yes, the hour is coming, that whosoever kills you will think that he is offering worship to God. And these things will they do to you because they have not known the Father nor Me. But these things I have told you, that when the hour shall come, you may remember that I told you of them."

Saint Gregory VII, Pope, Confessor (1015 – 25 May 1085)



Born Hildebrand of Sovana, probably in southern Tuscany, to an upper-middle-class family with possible connections to Rome. In one of the few personal recollections in his papal letters—preserved in the original register in the Archivio Segreto (“Secret Archives”) of the Vatican—he recalled growing up in the Roman church under the special protection of St. Peter, “Prince of the Apostles.” He attended the palace school at the Lateran with Roman nobles before continuing his education among the canons of San Giovanni a Porta Latina, a collegiate church next to the Lateran basilica and palace. One of his teachers there was Archbishop Lawrence of Amalfi, who was famed for his knowledge of both Greek and Latin, and the head of the community was the archpriest John Gratian, the future Pope Gregory VI (1045–46).

The 10th century and the first half of the 11th were dark days for the Church, partly because the papacy was the pawn of various Roman families. In 1049, things began to change when Pope Leo IX, a reformer, was elected. He brought a young monk named Hildebrand to Rome as his counselor and special representative on important missions. Hildebrand was to become Gregory VII, Pope from 22 April 1073 to his death in 1085.

Three evils plagued the Church then: simony—the buying and selling of sacred offices and things; the unlawful marriage of the clergy; and lay investiture—kings and nobles controlling the appointment of Church officials. To all of these Hildebrand directed his reformer’s attention, first as counselor to the popes and later as pope himself.

Gregory’s papal letters stress the role of the bishop of Rome as the vicar of Christ and the visible center of unity in the Church. He is well known for his long dispute with Holy Roman Emperor Henry IV over who should control the selection of bishops and abbots.

Gregory VII excommunicated Henry IV three times. Consequently, Henry IV would appoint Antipope Clement III to oppose him in the political power struggles between the Catholic Church and his empire. Hailed as one of the greatest of the Roman pontiffs after his reforms proved successful, Gregory VII was, during his own reign, despised by some for his expansive use of papal powers.

Gregory fiercely resisted any attack on the liberty of the Church. For this he suffered and finally died in exile. He said, “I have loved justice and hated iniquity; therefore, I die in exile.” Thirty years later the Church finally won its struggle against lay investiture.

The Liturgical Feast of Saint Gregory VII is May 25th.

FATHER SAFREED'S REFLECTIONS

POPE PIUS XII: BUILDING A PATH FOR THE FUTURE

From "Vatican II Exposed as Counterfeit Catholicism" by Frs. Francisco and Dominic Radecki, CMRI

In 1953, **Pope Pius XII** warned against a superficial understanding of the Catholic Faith. "Beware of being satisfied...with questions learned by heart without any understanding of their meaning." Catholics were to understand the substance of the Faith, not just recite the answers by rote.

Pope Pius XII did not merely lead the Church during his reign; he showed the way for the future. His encyclicals and other writings are like a road map guiding Catholics today. His insight was described by the President of the International Congresses in 1939:

"Every time I came in contact with him, he impressed me by his immediate understanding of the problems presented, his quick grasp of their import, and speedy discovery of the most practical solutions...his crystal-clear mind understands everything with ease and his practical insight works...to supply at once the clues necessary for arriving at the required solutions."

TWO SAINTLY POPES

Pope Pius X and **Pope Pius XII** resemble each other in many ways. They both had a great love for the Sacred Liturgy and Holy Mother Church. They were both very devout and prayerful. Both strenuously opposed Modernism in all forms and did all they could to defend the Catholic Faith. It is providential that both sat on the Throne of Peter during the turbulent twentieth century and they left a "roadmap" for Catholics today to follow. **Pope Pius X** had not been embalmed, however,

...in 1944, when his body was exhumed, it was found 'excellently preserved.' Pius X was beatified by Pius XII on Sept. 3, 1950 and was canonized on May 29, 1954 by that same pope.

PASTOR ANGELICUS

Pope Pius XII as a mortal, surely made some mistakes in his life, as all people do. Yet, he displayed a degree of love of God, defense of the Catholic Faith and love for souls that is unparalleled in recent times. Most Rev. Giacomo Martin, Prefect of the Pontifical Household, while reflecting on the life of Pius XII recalls "the deep religious spirit, the fervor of his prayer and the immobility of his face and whole person during services" His love for prayer, the Mass, sacraments, Divine Office, and Rosary was evidenced by all who came into contact with him. His focus, love of God and reverence are clearly evident in photos.

DRESS POLICY ~ If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes of Vatican II in the Church, few parishes have had any kind of dress code: we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of reverence for the Most Blessed Sacrament. Please observe these minimum standards of dress for attendance at Church and when attending any functions at the Chapel:

Everyone should refrain from jeans, shorts or T-shirts. Ladies, use a head covering, available in the back of the church for loan or purchase.



Remember, also, Lord, Your servants and handmaids below who are gone hence before us, marked with the sign of faith, and sleep the sleep of peace. To them, Lord and to all that rest in Christ, grant, we implore You a place of happiness, light and peace through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
