# Fifth Sunday After Pentecost

GOSPEL Matt. 5:20-24 At that time, Jesus said to His disciples: "Unless your justice abound more than that of the scribes and Pharisees, you shall not enter into the kingdom of heaven. You have heard that it was said to them of old: 'Thou shalt not kill.' And whosoever shall kill, shall be in danger of the judgment. But I say to you, that whosoever is angry with his brother, shall be in danger of the judgment. And whosoever shall say to his brother, 'Raca,' shall be in danger of the council. And whosoever shall say, 'Thou fool', shall be in danger of hell fire.

If therefore thou offer thy gift at the altar, and there thou remember that thy brother hath anything against thee; Leave there thy offering before the altar, and go first to be reconciled to thy brother, and then coming thou shalt offer thy gift."

St. John the Baptist was born through the intercession of God to Zachariah and Elizabeth, who was otherwise too old to bear children.



According to scriptures, the Angel Gabriel visited Elizabeth and Zachariah to tell them they would have a son and that they should name him John. Zachariah was skeptical and for this he was rendered mute until the time his son was born and named John, in fulfillment of God's will.

When Elizabeth was pregnant with John, she was visited by Mary, and John leapt in her womb. This revealed to Elizabeth that the child Mary carried was to be the Son of God.

John began public ministry around 30 AD, and was known for attracting large crowds across the province of Judaea and around the Jordan River. When Jesus came to him to be baptized, John recognized him and said, "It is I who need baptism from you." Jesus told John to baptize Him anyway, which he did, whereupon the heavens opened, and the Spirit of God was seen like a dove. The voice of God spoke, saying, "This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased."

John's attitude toward Jesus was: "He must increase; I must decrease." John instructed his followers to turn to Christ, calling Him the "Lamb of God" and these people were among the first Christians.

Following his baptism of Christ, John's popularity grew so much that he alarmed King Herod. Herod ordered him arrested and imprisoned. John spoke with Herod on several occasions and condemned his marriage to his half-brother's wife.

This condemnation would be his downfall as King Herod promised to grant a wish to his daughter. In revenge for John the Baptist's condemnation of her mother's scandalous marriage to Herod, she asked for John's head. King Herod reluctantly obliged.





The Feast of Saints Peter and Paul is a liturgical feast in honor of the martyrdom in Rome of the apostles Saint Peter and Saint Paul, which is observed on 29 June. The celebration is of ancient Christian origin, the date selected being the anniversary of either their death or the translation of their relics.

The Feast is almost entirely devoted to St. Peter, the Bishop of Rome. St. Paul, the great apostle of the Gentiles is more especially honored on 30 June.

After the Descent of the Holy Ghost, St. Peter preached the Gospel in Judea and was cast into prison by Herod. He was miraculously delivered by an angel and established his See first at Antioch, and then, finally at Rome.

Like St. Paul, he died at Rome during the persecution of Nero (64-68), by being crucified head downward.

# JOHN XXIII part 6

## THE CHURCH'S OPPOSITION TO MODERNISM

**Pope St. Pius's** encyclical "Pascendi Dominici Gregis" (Feeding the Lord's Flock) initiated a comprehensive and intense attack against Modernism. Implementation of the Holy Father's orders resulted in a crackdown on Modernist and Secular Humanistic belief within the hierarchy, clergy and seminary professors. During his relatively short reign, **Pope St. Pius X** effectively limited the spread of Modernism. However, he warned that if Church authorities were not vigilant, it would grow and become more dangerous than ever.

Modernism was devised by Satan as an ingenious attack against the Church from within. It is a heresy that spreads like wildfire and becomes deeply rooted. Despite all the efforts used to destroy it, Modernism continued to thrive. It started underground, but now operates openly and brazenly. Toward the end of 1917, the Vatican let it be known that anyone who disagreed with "Pascendi" would be excommunicated. The impact was felt by both Radini Tedeschi, a proponent of Humanism, and Roncalli, a Modernist.

#### WALKING THE FENCE

Given Roncalli's liberal tendencies, **Pope St. Pius X's** measures to destroy Modernism now made his methods of teaching Apologetics, Church History and Patrology, at the Bergamo seminary from 1906-1912, very problematic. In keeping with his motto, "I will bend, but not break," Roncalli tread cautiously in his lectures, taking his usual double stance. In 1908, Bergamo was one of the Italian cities most influenced by the works of the Modernist Alfred Loisy.

Fr. Roncalli admitted that humanistic thinkers had made errors, but quickly referred to the ancient and narrow-minded doctrines of the Church that had lost meaning due to the changing conditions of the times. He added that some believed that the Church was locked into these formulations. Roncalli, however, did not include himself, cleverly remaining on the fence, disguising his own views.

#### EVIDENCE OF RONCALLI'S MODERNISM

Modernist clergy often worked underground to avoid being excommunicated for heresy. They had to craftily infiltrate the Church in order to circulate their false doctrines. Concerning this subject, Fr. Roncalli wrote, "Faith and good intentions are not enough to influence a civilization with wholesome principles and reform it in the spirit of the gospel. For this purpose, it is necessary to penetrate into...institutions and work effectively from within them."

DRESS POLICY ~ If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes of Vatican II in the Church, few parishes have had any kind of dress code: we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of reverence for the Most Blessed Sacrament. Please observe these minimum standards of dress for attendance at Church and when attending any functions at the Chapel:

Everyone should refrain from jeans, shorts or T-shirts. Ladies, use a head covering, available in the back of the church for loan or purchase.



Remember, also, Lord, Your servants and handmaids below who are gone hence before us, marked with the sign of faith, and sleep the sleep of peace. To them, Lord and to all that rest in Christ, grant, we implore You a place of happiness, light and peace through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.


