## Eleventh Sunday After Pentecost

**GOSPEL Mark 7:31-37** At that time, Jesus went out from the borders of Tyre, and came through Sidon unto the sea of Galilee, through the midst of the district of Decapolis. And they brought to Him one that was deaf and had an impediment in his speech; and they beseeched Him to lay His hand upon him. And He took him aside from the multitude privately, and put His fingers into his ears, and He spat, and touched his tongue; and looking up to heaven, He sighed, and saith unto him, "Ephphatha," that is, "Be opened." And his ears were opened, and the bond of his tongue was loosed, and he began to speak correctly. And He charged them to tell no man. But the more He charged them, so much the more a great deal they published it. And they were beyond measure astonished, saying, "He hath done all things well. He made the deaf to hear, and the dumb to speak."

**St. Dominic** ~ Truth was St. Dominic's motto and his goal. He was born in Spain, (8 August 1170 – 6 August 1221)



the youngest of four children. He was educated by his uncle, a priest. St. Dominic became a priest and joined a religious community. Soon he became the prior, or head.

St. Dominic might have lived his whole life in that monastery if he had not gone with his bishop to northern Europe in 1204. As they traveled, St. Dominic saw that many people were following heretics, or false teachers. St. Dominic, his bishop, and three Cistercian monks went from city to city preaching the truth of Christ, using the Bible. They went on foot, depending on others for food and a place to sleep. Soon people returned to the faith—not only because of what these preachers said, but because of how they lived.

By 1215 a few men had joined St. Dominic in his work of preaching. He founded the Order of Preachers, better known as the Dominicans. He urged his members to study and to pray. Then they would be ready to preach.

St. Dominic realized that to be true witnesses of the Gospel, Dominicans could not be wealthy. His followers also deeply loved the Blessed Virgin Mary and spread devotion to her through the rosary.

St. Dominic's community was different from most because his friars traveled and preached instead of staying in their monastery. His order tried to reach the well-educated who were deceived by heresy, while the Franciscans went to the poor and uneducated.

St. Dominic fell ill with fever while he was on a preaching mission through northern Italy, he died, only six years after he had founded his community.

St. Dominic was able to draw the members of this community together and inspire them to love and forgive one another. He was outstanding for his love of truth, his clear thought, his organizing ability, and his sensitive, loving nature.

For St. Dominic, love for people was part of his love for God.

Under the authority of Pope Gregory IX, Dominic was canonized in 1234 and his feast day is August 4th. St. Dominic is the patron saint of astronomers, the Dominican Republic, and the innocent who are falsely accused of crimes. He is commonly depicted in icons with a dog, or lilies, holding a book.



**The month of August is dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary.** On October 31, 1942, Pope Pius XII made a solemn Act of Consecration of the Church and the whole world to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The Immaculate Heart is often venerated together with the Sacred Heart of Jesus (the devotion we celebrate in June) and, with good reason. Just as the Sacred Heart represents Christ's love for mankind, the Immaculate Heart represents the desire of the Blessed Virgin to bring all people to her Son.

There is no better example of the Christian life than that offered by Mary. We do not worship Mary or place her above Christ, but we come to Christ through Mary, as Christ came to us through her.

**DRESS POLICY** ~ If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes of Vatican II in the Church, few parishes have had any kind of dress code: we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of reverence for the Most Blessed Sacrament. Please observe these minimum standards of dress for attendance at Church and when attending any functions at the Chapel:

**Everyone should refrain from jeans, shorts or T-shirts.** Ladies, use a head covering, available in the back of the church for loan or purchase.

## FATHER SAFREED'S REFLECTIONS

JOHN XXIII part 12

### THE CLOUDED ELECTION OF JOHN XXIII part 4

From "Vatican II Exposed as Counterfeit Catholicism" by Frs. Francisco & Dominic Radecki, CMRI

It is presumed that at first neither side could get the necessary votes.

Angelo Roncalli was put forward as a 'compromise' or 'transitional' pope to bridge the gap between the 19 year-old reign of Pope Pius and the election of a younger man. Roncalli later stated, 'When the cardinals designated me to the supreme responsibility of the government of the Church, at seventy-seven years of age, the belief was widespread that I would be a provisional pope of transition.' There were certain irregularities about the election during the 1958 conclave, as Cardinal Tisserent himself acknowledged. Some say Agagianian was elected, others Siri, others some other cardinal.

Three months after the 1958 conclave, when John XXIII visited the Armenian college in Rome, he recalled the balloting and said the names of Roncalli and Agagianian "went up and down like two chickpeas in boiling water." In addition to Agagianian, Roncalli had other rivals.

In his book, "The Vatican Exposed," Paul Williams has written:

In 1958 when the cardinals were locked away in the Sistine Chapel to elect a new pope, mysterious events began to unfold. Siri, according to FBI sources, obtained the necessary votes and was elected...[But did not accept the papal office.] On the fourth ballot, according to FBI sources, Siri again obtained the necessary votes and was elected Supreme Pontiff. But the French cardinals, [including the camerlengo, the presider over the conclave] annulled the results, claiming that the election would cause widespread riots and the assassination of several prominent bishops behind the Iron Curtain.

Fr. Jean-Marie Charles-Roux gives insight into the 1958 conclave when he noted:

I knew Angelo Roncalli, (who was elected John XXIII), in Paris. I saw him often. In mentality, he was a Modernist...He was elected by a very small margin.
