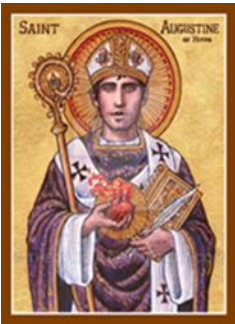

Thirteenth Sunday After Pentecost

GOSPEL Luke 17:11-19 At that time, as Jesus was going to Jerusalem, He passed through the midst of Samaria and Galilee. And as He entered into a certain town, there met Him ten men that were lepers, who stood afar off. And lifted up their voices, saying: "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us." Whom when He saw, He said: "Go, show yourselves to the priests."

And it came to pass, as they went, they were made clean. And one of them, when he saw that he was made clean, went back, with a loud voice glorifying God. And he fell on his face before His feet, giving thanks. And this was a Samaritan. And Jesus answering, said: "Were not ten made clean? And where are the nine? There is no one found to return and give glory to God, but this stranger?" And He said to him: "Arise, go thy way; for thy faith hath made thee whole."

St. Augustine, Bishop and Confessor, Doctor of the Church



St. Augustine was born in 354 to a pagan father and a Christian mother, St. Monica. His early education was that of a young pagan gentleman, but he went on to become one of the most influential and genius Doctors of the Catholic Church.

St. Augustine's infamous life of impurity and practice of the heretical Manichaeism reveal the magnitude of his conversion to Christianity, mainly through the intercession of his mother, St. Monica.

He finally began to pull away from his pagan ways and was eventually baptized in 387 by St. Ambrose, Bishop of Milan, who became a great counselor and friend to his mother as she prayed for her son.

Saint Augustine went on to become the Bishop of Hippo (in modern day Algeria) and one of the greatest Catholic Christian writers and thinkers in the history of the Church.

For thirty-five years he was the center of ecclesiastical life in Africa, and the Church's strongest champion against heresy. His writings, which compose many volumes, have been accepted everywhere as a major source of both Christian spirituality and theological speculation. His most well-known works are his "Confessions" and "The City of God".

The great Doctor died, deeply regretted by the entire Christian world, in 430. His feast is celebrated in the Church on August 28th, the day after that of his holy mother, St. Monica. It is entirely fitting that their feasts are side-by-side on the liturgical calendar, given that Monica won her son's deep conversion to Christ through her many years of patient and persistent prayer.

St. Augustine is a perfect example of how God works miracles in our lives, often through the intercession of other people. Once St. Augustine cried out to God, "Too late have I loved you!" in sorrow over the many years he lived a dissolute life while putting off the call of God.

It is never too late to commit ourselves to conversion and service to our Lord! St. Augustine, pray for us.

FATHER SAFREED'S REFLECTIONS

JOHN XXIII part 14

WHAT REALLY HAPPENED AT THE 1958 CONCLAVE? part 2

[At the 1958 conclave]:

Questions began to arise whether the smoke was white or gray. To quell such doubts Monsignor Santaro, Secretary of the Conclave of Cardinals, informed the press that the smoke, indeed had been white and that a new pope had been elected. The waiting continued. By evening, Vatican Radio announced that the results remained uncertain.

According to Lawrence Elliot,

In fact, the result was sometimes confusing. On Sunday, the smoke seemed white enough and the Vatican Radio and at least one news agency flashed word that a pope had been chosen. But as the minutes passed without light or any sign of activity in the Hall of Benedictions on the second floor of St. Peter's and the facade of white-curtained windows remained dark and mute, the people in the piazza and the millions around the world who also waited realized that the wait still went on.

The partly white, partly dark smoke confused even Vatican Radio announcers. They had to apologize frequently for their error. The column of smoke which rose from the chimney of the Sistine Chapel was first whitish, then definitely white, and only later definitely black.

In his book, "Above All a Shepherd: Pope John XXIII," Ugo Groppi wrote an account of an eyewitness who was just feet away from the Sistine Chapel chimney:

An editor of the "Osservatore Romano" who was in the office of the Secretary of State saw the smoke from a distance of several yards and immediately dashed off to the newspaper in order to prepare an 'extra.' But as he entered the editorial room he heard the radio announcing that the result of the balloting was negative; a black smoke signal had followed the first white one. The same mistake was repeated on Sunday afternoon. On Monday morning learned discussions were taking place all over Rome, especially among so-called experts, on the nature and the color of the smoke signal.



Remember, also, Lord, Your servants and handmaids below who are gone hence before us, marked with the sign of faith, and sleep the sleep of peace. To them, Lord and to all that rest in Christ, grant, we implore You a place of happiness, light and peace through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
