Fifteenth Sunday After Pentecost

GOSPEL Luke 7:11-16 At that time, Jesus went into a city that is called Naim: and there went with Him His disciples and a great multitude. And when He came nigh to the gate of the city, behold a dead man was carried out, the only son of his mother: and she was a widow. And a great multitude of the city was with her. Whom when the Lord had seen, being moved with mercy towards her, He said to her: "Weep not." And He came near and touched the bier. And they that carried it stood still. And He said: "Young man, I say to thee, arise." And he that was dead sat up and begun to speak. And He gave him to his mother. And there came a fear upon them all: and they glorified God saying: "A great prophet is risen up among us: and God hath visited His people."

September ~ Month of the Holy Cross

Thanks be to God that His wisdom often turns human plans upside down and inside out. We see this in the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. The instrument of torture becomes the throne of glory.

He Who was nailed to the Cross like a criminal is in fact the King of kings before Whom one day every knee shall bow.

The splendor of the Holy Cross guarantees that in our war against the forces of darkness we are already well and truly on the winning side. The principal and decisive battle has already been fought and won by the Son of God. What now remains are the continuing skirmishes by which the Enemy tries to undermine our confidence in Christ's victory.

How do we exalt the Holy Cross? By showing forth in our daily lives the Gospel truth that suffering can be salvific. We also exalt Christ the Lord by reaching out in charity to our neighbors, especially to those who do not yet share our faith.

How are people going to know about Christ unless we tell them? How will they come to believe in Him unless we prepare the ground for them to receive the Holy Ghost's supernatural gift of faith?

We cannot hope to prepare the ground unless we ourselves are credible witnesses. We bear witness to Christ (among many other ways) by being of genuine service to our fellow citizens, serving them after the pattern of His own compassion and generosity.

We serve our neighbors in order to share with them something of what we ourselves have received; the countless blessings of that infinite charity which the Sacred Heart of Jesus unremittingly intends for the whole of mankind.

O God, who willed that your Only Begotten Son should undergo the Cross to save the human race, grant, we pray, that we, who have known His mystery on earth, may merit the grace of His redemption in heaven. FATHER SAFREED'S REFLECTIONS

JOHN XXIII part 16

JOHN XXIII

By choosing the name John XXIII, Roncalli surprised everyone because for more than 550 years no pope had used that name. The last time the name John XXIII had been used was in 1410 by Baldassar Costa, an illegitimately elected antipope. He was deposed by the Council of Constance on May 29, 1415. Throughout the history of the Catholic Church there have been 41 illegitimate popes called **antipopes.** These men were either imposters or were uncanonically elected, making them illegitimate successors of St. Peter. The name John XXIII was considered unsuitable because "the last claimant to the name was an ex-pirate who had massacred, cheated and perjured his way to the papacy"

"One wonders why Angelo Roncalli chose to take the name of such a scandalous character." Fr. Charles-Roux said, "I'm quite sure John XXIII chose this name, the name of an antipope of the fifteenth century, quite consciously, to show he had been irregularly elected." Roncalli's use of the name John XXIII should have raised red flags to those familiar with Church history and caused Catholics to seriously question his pontificate and actions.

FROM MY FILES ABOUT THE ELECTION OF RONCALLI:

FROM THE LETTERS OF CARDINAL EUGENE TISSERANT WHO WAS DEAN OF THE COLLEGE OF CARDINALS WHEN JOHN XXIII WAS "ELECTED:"

"THE ELECTION OF RONCALLI WAS DONE QUICKLY...IT WAS DISCUSSED AT NUMEROUS MEETINGS...IT IS COMPLETELY RIDICULOUS TO SAY THAT ANY CARDINAL WOULD HAVE BEEN ELECTED. BECAUSE OF SECRECY, I CAN SAY NO MORE."

IN ANOTHER LETTER, CARDINAL TISSERANT TOLD A PRIEST TEACHING CANON LAW THAT: "THE ELECTION OF JOHN XXIII WAS ILLEGITIMATE BECAUSE IT WAS WILLED AND PLANNED FOR BY FORCES ALIEN TO THE HOLY SPIRIT."

This confirms that Roncalli's "election" was programed by infiltrators and traitors, and therefore invalid. And, as some French bishops said at the time, Roncalli was himself an antipope, and a precursor to the Antichrist.
