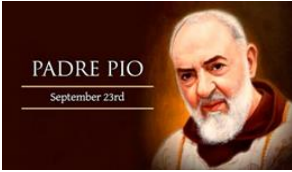

Seven Sorrows of the Blessed Virgin Mary

GOSPEL John 19:25-27 At that time, there stood by the cross of Jesus, His mother and His mother's sister, Mary of Cleophas, and Mary Magdalen. When Jesus therefore had seen His mother and the disciple standing whom He loved, He said to His mother: "Woman, behold thy son." After that, He said to the disciple: "Behold thy mother." And from that hour, the disciple took her to his own.



St. Padre Pio, original name Francesco Forgione, born May 25, 1887, Pietrelcina, Italy- died September 23, 1968, San Giovanni Rotondo; canonized June 16, 2002; feast day September 23

Born into a devout Roman Catholic family, he consecrated himself to God at age 5. As a youth, Francesco reported that he had experienced heavenly visions and ecstasies. At age 15 he joined the Capuchin order and took the name Pio in honor of St. Pius I. One of Pio's fellow friars later claimed to have seen him in ecstasy, and allegedly levitating above the ground. In 1910, the year in which he became a priest, he received the

stigmata for the first time, though they eventually healed.

He was drafted into the Italian military in 1915 for medical service during World War I but was discharged because of his poor health.

In 1916 Pio was ordered to return to his community life. He moved to an agricultural community, Our Lady of Grace Capuchin Friary, located in the Gargano Mountains in San Giovanni Rotondo in the Province of Foggia. He remained at San Giovanni Rotondo until his death in 1968. In the priesthood, Padre Pio was known to perform a number of successful conversions to Catholicism.

He received the stigmata again in 1918, and this time they remained with him until his death.

Padre Pio increasingly became well known among the wider populace. He became a spiritual director and developed five rules for spiritual growth: weekly confession, daily Communion, spiritual reading, meditation, and examination of conscience.

Pio was said to have had the gift of reading souls and the ability to bilocate, among other preternatural phenomena. He was said to communicate with angels and work favors and healings before they were requested of him.

He had a special mission to the souls in Purgatory and encouraged everyone to pray for them. He used to say, "We must empty Purgatory with our prayers."

Early in the morning of 23 September 1968, Pio made his last confession and renewed his Franciscan vows. Pio was devoted to rosary meditations and as was customary, he had his rosary in his hands. Till the end, he repeated the words "Gesù, Maria" (Jesus, Mary). At around 2:30 a.m., he said, "I see two mothers" (taken to mean his mother and Mary). With his last breath he whispered, "Maria!" Pio died at the age of 81.

His body was buried on 26 September in a crypt in the Church of Our Lady of Grace. His Requiem Mass was attended by over 100,000 people. He had often said, "After my death, I will do more. My real mission will begin after my death."

He was known for his piety, charity and the quality of his preaching. He famously advised, "Pray, hope and don't worry."



GOSPEL for the 17th Sunday After Pentecost GOSPEL Matt. 22, 34-46 At that time, the Pharisees, came to Jesus and one of them, a doctor of the Law, putting Him to the test, asked Him, "Master, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?" Jesus said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with your whole heart, and with your whole soul, and with your whole mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. And the second is like it, You shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments depend the whole Law and the Prophets." Now while the Pharisees were gathered together, Jesus questioned them saying, "What do you think of the Christ? Whose son is He?" They said to Him, "David's". He said to them, "How then does David in the Spirit call Him Lord", saying, "The Lord said to my Lord: Sit at My right hand, till I make Your enemies Your footstool?" If David, therefore, calls Him Lord, how is He, his son?" And no one could answer Him a word; neither did anyone dare from that day forth to ask Him any more questions.

FATHER SAFREED'S REFLECTIONS

JOHN XXIII part 18

TRYING TO REMOVE THE STIGMA OF BEING A MODERNIST

The Holy Office defends Catholic teaching on faith and morals. “It censors and condemns books judged dangerous to faith and morals... It also judges heresy and all offenses leading to a suspicion of heresy.” Since the reign of **Pope St. Pius X** the members of the Holy Office were especially vigilant for Modernists and their false doctrines. John XXIII had been carefully observed by Rome since June 1, 1914 and a large dossier had been compiled regarding his questionable words, actions and associations. Since he was accused of Modernist beliefs early in his priestly career, later in his teaching, he “tended to avoid controversial questions.”

After his election, he made the following remark to Cardinal Suenens, “The Holy Office is doing what it can to discover heresies in my writings and plans... but for now they have not succeeded.”

John XXIII told Archbishop Lefebvre that one of the first things he did after his election was to see his large personnel file at the Sacred Congregation of the Holy Office. It said, “Suspected of Modernism.” He laughed and scornfully said, “Imagine me - a Modernist!” or some such absurdity. If a devout Catholic was accused of heresy, he would do everything possible to clear his reputation. What was John XXII’s response? He laughed it off, and instead of removing all doubt and mistrust by his defense of the Faith, he worked feverishly to achieve the long-awaited goal of the Modernists: the systematic destruction of the Catholic Faith.

Due to the posts he held in the service of Rome for many years prior to his election, Roncalli did not publicly state his political and theological opinions, but secretly remained a Modernist and Socialist. In preparation for Vatican II, John XXIII brought together exiled Modernists such as Kung, Rahner and Congar, who were muzzled during the reign of **Pope Pius XII** and made them conciliar theological experts who authored the Council’s decrees and documents. Rahner said, “The transitional Pope John XXIII effected the transition of the Church into the future.”

John XXIII displayed his own Modernistic beliefs in his speeches, including the inaugural address of the Second Vatican Council, which echoed the teaching of Teilhard de Chardin. His plans for *aggiornamento* (updating) included “revision” of Canon Law and changes to the liturgy.

DRESS POLICY ~ If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes of Vatican II in the Church, few parishes have had any kind of dress code: we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of reverence for the Most Blessed Sacrament. Please observe these minimum standards of dress for attendance at Church and when attending any functions at the Chapel:

Everyone should refrain from jeans, shorts or T-shirts. Ladies, use a head covering, available in the back of the church for loan or purchase.



Remember, also, Lord, Your servants and handmaids below who are gone hence before us, marked with the sign of faith, and sleep the sleep of peace. To them, Lord and to all that rest in Christ, grant, we implore You a place of happiness, light and peace through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

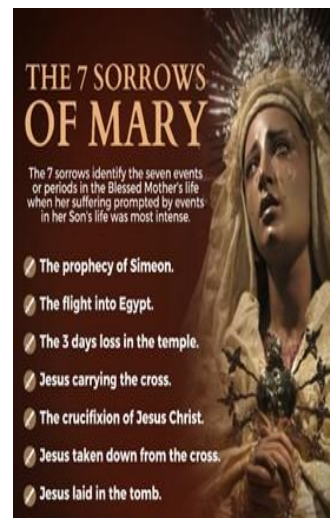
