Saint Michael the Archangel

GOSPEL Matt. 18:1-10 At that time, the disciples came to Jesus, saying: "Who then is the greater in the kingdom of heaven?" And Jesus, calling unto him a little child, set him in the midst of them. And said: "Amen I say to you, unless you turn, and become like little children, you shall not enter into the kingdom of heaven. Whosoever therefore shall humble himself as this little child, he is the greater in the kingdom of heaven. And he that shall receive one such little child in My name, receives Me. But whoever causes one of these little ones that believe in Me to sin, it were better for him that a millstone should be hanged about his neck, and that he should be drowned in the depth of the sea. Woe to the world because of scandals! For it must needs be that scandals come, but woe to the man to whom scandal does come! And if your hand, or your foot, is an occasion of sin to you, cut it off, and cast it from you! It is better for you to go into life maimed or lame, than having two hands or two feet, to be cast into everlasting fire. And if your eye is an occasion of sin to you, pluck it out, and cast it from you! It is better for you to enter into life with one eye, than having two eyes to be cast into hell fire. See that you despise not one of these little ones: for I say to you, that their Angels in heaven always see the face of my Father who is in heaven."



The Feast of St. Michael is September 29th - Pope Leo XIII in 1888 after his startling vision as to the future of the Church composed this vital prayer.

The prayer was dedicated for the Feast of St. Michael 1448 years from the date of the election of the first Leo - Pope Saint Leo the Great. Everyone is familiar with the prayer below which was mandated by His Holiness as part of the Leonine Prayers after Low Mass. Following Vatican II, in league with the devil, Giovanni Montini outlawed this necessary prayer and then one wonders how "the smoke of Satan" got into the sanctuary? The Conciliarists wanted to make sure these words would never see the light of day again for in the long version of the prayer, Leo foretold what would happen: The shepherd would be struck, the sheep scattered. Below is the short version of this poignant prayer, which should never be forgotten.

"Saint Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle, be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him we humbly pray, and do thou, O Prince of the heavenly hosts, by the power of God, cast into hell Satan and all the evil spirits who roam about the world seeking the ruin of souls." Amen.

GOSPEL for the 19th Sunday After Pentecost Matt. 22:1-14 At that time, Jesus spoke to the chief priests and the Pharisees in parables, saying: "The kingdom of heaven is likened to a king, who made a marriage for his son; and he sent his servants, to call them that were invited to the marriage, and they would not come. Again, he sent other servants, saying: Tell them that were invited: Behold, I have prepared my dinner; my oxen and fatlings are killed, and all things are ready: come ye to the marriage. But they neglected; and went their way, one to his farm, and another to his merchandise; and the rest laid hands on his servants and having treated them shamefully, put them to death.

But when the king had heard of it, he was angry; and sending his armies, he destroyed those murderers and burnt their city. Then he said to his servants: The marriage indeed is ready, but they that were invited were not worthy. Go ye therefore into the highways, and as many as you shall find, call to the marriage. And his servants going forth into the ways, gathered together all that they found, both bad and good; and the marriage was filled with guests. And the king went in to see the guests, and he saw there a man who had not on a wedding garment: and he said to him: Friend, how camest thou in hither, not having on a wedding garment? but he was silent. Then the king said to the waiters: Bind his hands and feet and cast him into the exterior darkness: there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth. For many are called, but few are chosen."

FATHER SAFREED’S REFLECTIONS

JOHN XXIII part 20

Continuing with “Vatican II Exposed as Counterfeit Catholicism” by Frs. Francisco and Dominic Radecki, CMRI

REVOLUTIONARY UPDATING

The reason John XXIII was so successful in his endeavors was because, unlike other heretics who had limited influence, Roncalli’s position as “pope” enabled the effects of his revolution to be felt across the world. Leon de Poncins wrote, “With the election of John XXIII... one had clearly the impression of a methodically organized international campaign.”

His blueprint for revolution was the work of Vatican II. Due to his advanced age and poor health, John XXIII knew that he had limited time to accomplish his revolutionary *aggiornamento* (updating).

However, he knew what he wanted and succeeded in turning things upside down in order to accomplish his agenda. “His opinion of himself was simple, “I’m the Pope who keeps stepping on the accelerator.” He would find a way and said, “Where the horses fail ages get through.” John XXIII is responsible for initiating the greatest crisis in the history of the Church, causing peril to countless souls.

ECUMENICAL LEADER

In his first public address on October 29, 1958, John XXIII stressed the reunion of “all who are separated from this Apostolic See,” but carefully avoided the word “conversion.”

Months into his papacy, Pope John expressed his desire that the ‘faithful of the separated Churches’ be invited as observers at the Second Vatican Council, and in his opening address at the Council, he exclaimed that it was the duty of Christians to work actively for unity.

The secular world was ecstatic when the Catholic Church, which had always been the bulwark of truth against deviant ideologies, appeared to accept its values. On January 4, 1963, *Time* selected John XXIII as “Man of the Year.”

Non-Catholics hailed him as “Good Pope John” because he accommodated Church teaching to the trends and tendencies of the world. John XXIII was the most important leader of the worldwide Ecumenical Movement.

As a Modernist, John XXIII believed that truth is relative, not absolute. To him, truth was to be interpreted according to the needs of the times. He deceived many with his worldly charisma and seemingly good intentions in working for the unity of Christians.

DRESS POLICY ~ If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes of Vatican II in the Church, few parishes have had any kind of dress code: we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of reverence for the Most Blessed Sacrament. Please observe these minimum standards of dress for attendance at Church and when attending any functions at the Chapel:

Everyone should refrain from jeans, shorts or T-shirts. Ladies, use a head covering, available in the back of the church for loan or purchase.



Remember, also, Lord, Your servants and handmaids below who are gone hence before us, marked with the sign of faith, and sleep the sleep of peace. To them, Lord and to all that rest in Christ, grant, we implore You a place of happiness, light and peace through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
