Twenty Second Sunday After Pentecost

GOSPEL Matt. 22:15-21 At that time, the Pharisees went and took counsel how they might trap Jesus in His talk. And they send to Him their disciples, with the Herodians, saying, "Master, we know that You art truthful, and that You teach the way of God in truth, and that You care not for any man: for You do not regard the person of men. Tell us therefore, what do You think?

Is it lawful to give tribute to Caesar, or not?" But Jesus perceived their wickedness, and said, "Why do you test Me, you hypocrites? Show Me the tribute money." And they brought unto Him a penny. Then Jesus said to them, "Whose are this image and inscription?" They said to Him, "Caesar's." Then He said to them, "Render therefore unto Caesar the things that are Caesar's; and unto God the things that are God's."



Saint John Cantius, Confessor (23 June 1390 – 24 December 1473) was a Polish priest, scholastic philosopher, physicist and theologian. He was born in Kęty, a small town in Poland. He attended the Kraków Academy at which he attained a bachelor degree. In 1418 he became a Doctor of Philosophy. Upon graduation he spent the next three years conducting philosophy classes at the university, while preparing for the priesthood.

Upon his ordination, he became rector at the school of the Canons Regular of the Most Holy Sepulcher in Miechow. While there, he was offered a professorship of Sacrae Scripturae (Sacred Scripture) back at his alma mater. He attained a doctorate in theology and eventually became director of the theology department.

St. John held the professorship until his death in 1473.

He spent many hours copying manuscripts of the Holy Scriptures, theological tracts, and other scholarly works. He became well known in the city for his generosity and compassion toward the poor, especially needy students at the university. St. John subsisted on what was strictly necessary to sustain his life, giving alms regularly to the poor. He made one pilgrimage to Jerusalem and four pilgrimages on foot to Rome.

John Cantius was beatified in Rome by Pope Clement X on 28 March 1676. He was named patron of Poland and Lithuania by Pope Clement XII in the year 1737. Ninety-one years after his beatification, Blessed John Cantius was canonized on 16 July 1767, by Pope Clement XIII.

The Roman Breviary distinguishes him with three hymns; he is the only confessor not a bishop who has been given this honor in the Roman Catholic liturgy.

St. John Cantius is a popular saint in Poland. A number of churches and schools founded by Polish communities throughout North America are named in his honor. St. John Cantius's feast day was inserted into the General Roman Calendar in 1770, it is assigned to October 20th.

DRESS POLICY ~ If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes of Vatican II in the Church, few parishes have had any kind of dress code: we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of respect for the True Presence of Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, and for the edification of our neighbor, we kindly request that all who come to our parish observe the basic traditional Catholic standards of dress for church attendance:

Women and girls must cover their heads. (Chapel veils or mantillas are available for loan in the vestibule.) Women and girls must wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting. Slacks, shorts, sleeveless, tight or low-cut clothing, and dresses or skirts with long slits above the knees are not permitted. It is recommended for men and boys to wear suit coats and ties for Sunday Mass.
