## Third Sunday in Lent

**GOSPEL Luke 11:14-28** At that time, Jesus was casting out a devil: and the same was dumb. And when He had cast out the devil, the dumb spoke: and the multitudes, were in admiration at it. But some of them said: "He cast out devils by Beelzebub, the prince of devils." And others tempting, asked of Him a sign from heaven. But He, seeing their thoughts, said to them: "Every kingdom divided against itself shall be brought to desolation; and house upon house shall fall. And if Satan also be divided against himself, how shall his kingdom stand? Because you say that through Beelzebub I cast out devils. Now if I cast out devils by Beelzebub, by whom do your children cast them out? Therefore, they shall be your judges. But if I by the finger of God cast out devils, doubtless the kingdom of God is come upon you. When a strong man armed keeps his court, those things are in peace which he possesses. But if a stronger than he come upon him and overcomes him, he will take away all his armor wherein he trusted and will distribute his spoils. He that is not with Me is against Me; and he that gathers not with Me scatters. When the unclean spirit is gone out of a man, he walks through places without water, seeking rest: and not finding, he says: I will return into my house whence I came out. And when he is come, he finds it swept and garnished. Then he goes and takes with him seven other spirits more wicked than himself: and entering in they dwell there. And the last state of that man becomes worse than the first."

And it came to pass, as He spoke these things, a certain woman from the crowd, lifting up her voice, said to Him: "Blessed is the womb that bore You and the breasts that nursed You." But He said: "Rather, blessed are they who hear the word of God and keep it."

## ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

Come adore the Lord for one hour or more in Eucharistic Adoration. Adoration is when a consecrated host is placed in a monstrance (from the Latin monstrare, to show or view) for adoration (for us to adore Him).

Adoration is a silent time for you to be alone with Jesus to recite your favorite prayers, say the rosary, read the bible, contemplate acts of faith, hope, charity, thanksgiving or reparation, or do whatever type of prayerful devotion that suits you before our Lord. You can sit quietly and say nothing, just keeping Him company like you would with a dear friend.

Day and night Jesus dwells in the Blessed Sacrament because you are the most important person in the world to Him. Stay for one hour. Feel His love and His peace! "Be still and know that I am God." — Psalm 46

**The Most Blessed Sacrament will be exposed upon the altar on April 2nd, Holy Thursday from 7:00 pm until 10 am, April 3rd, Good Friday morning. We must have at least two people present during each hour as the Most Blessed Sacrament may not be left alone while exposed. Sign up sheet is available at the back of the church on the bookshelf. May you receive many blessings during Adoration.**



### \*EASTER DUTY\*

All the faithful who have reached the use of reason are gravely obliged to receive Holy Communion worthily at least once during the Easter season. In the United States, this extends from the first Sunday of Lent to Trinity Sunday (the Sunday after Pentecost).



**St. Joseph** - Everything we know about the husband of Mary and the foster father of Jesus comes from Scripture. We know he was a carpenter, a working man, for the Nazarenes ask about Jesus, "Is this not the carpenter's son?" (Matthew 13:55). He wasn't rich, for when he took Jesus to the Temple to be circumcised and Mary to be purified, he offered the sacrifice of two turtledoves or a pair of pigeons, allowed only for those who could not afford a lamb (Luke 2:24).



Despite his humble work and means, Joseph came from a royal lineage as a descendent of David, the greatest king of Israel (Matthew 1:1-16 and Luke 3:23-38). Indeed, the angel who first tells Joseph about Jesus greets him as "son of David," a royal title used also for Jesus.

Joseph is the patron saint of the dying because, assuming he died before Jesus' public life, he died with Jesus and Mary close to him, the way we all would like to leave this earth. Joseph is also patron saint of the Universal Church, families, fathers, expectant mothers, travelers, immigrants, house sellers and buyers, craftsmen, engineers, and working people in general.

We celebrate two feast days for Joseph: March 19th for Joseph the Husband of Mary and May 1st for Joseph the Worker. March 19th has been the most commonly celebrated feast day, and it wasn't until 1955 that Pope Pius XII established the Feast of "St. Joseph the Worker" to be celebrated on May 1st. This is also May Day (International Workers' Day) and is believed to reflect Joseph's status as the patron of workers.

**We gladly welcome visitors and newcomers. At the same time, we respectfully remind you that to receive Our Lord in Holy Communion, one must be:**

A baptized Catholic free from any mortal sin committed since one's last Confession. Fasting for three hours from any food and/or alcoholic beverage.  
One hour from any other beverage except water.

**DRESS POLICY** ~ If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes of Vatican II in the Church, few parishes have had any kind of dress code: we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of respect for the True Presence of Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, and for the edification of our neighbor, we kindly request that all who come to our parish observe the basic traditional Catholic standards of dress for church attendance  
**and to receive communion at the communion rail:**

Women and girls must cover their heads. (Chapel veils or mantillas are available for loan or purchase in the vestibule.)

Women and girls must wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting. Slacks, jeans, shorts, sleeveless, tight or low-cut clothing, and dresses or skirts with long slits above the knees are not permitted.

It is recommended for men and boys to wear suit coats and ties for Sunday Mass.

Jeans and other casual attire are inappropriate for attendance at church.
