## Laetare Sunday - Fourth Sunday in Lent

**GOSPEL (John 6:1-15)** At that time, Jesus went away to the other side of the sea of Galilee, which is that of Tiberias. And a great multitude followed Him, because they saw the miracles which He did on them that were diseased. Jesus therefore went up into a mountain: and there He sat with His disciples.

Now the Passover, the festival day of the Jews, was near at hand. When Jesus therefore had lifted up His eyes and seen that a very great multitude had come to Him, He said to Philip: "Whence shall we buy bread, that these may eat?" And this He said to try him: for He Himself knew what He would do.

Philip answered Him: "Two hundred denarii worth of bread is not sufficient for them that everyone may take a little." One of His disciples, Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, said to Him: "There is a boy here that has five barley loaves and two fishes. But what are these among so many?" Then Jesus said: "Make the men sit down."

Now, there was much grass in the place. The men therefore sat down, in number about five thousand. And Jesus took the loaves: and when He had given thanks, He distributed to them that were set down. In like manner also of the fishes, as much as they would. And when they were filled, He said to His disciples: "Gather up the fragments that remain, lest they be lost." They gathered up therefore and filled twelve baskets with the fragments of the five barley loaves which remained over and above to them that had eaten.

Now those men, when they had seen what a miracle Jesus had done, said: "This is indeed the Prophet who is to come into the world." Jesus, therefore, when He knew that they would come to take Him by force and make Him king, fled again into the mountains, Himself alone.

### ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

Come adore the Lord for one hour or more in Eucharistic Adoration. Adoration is when a consecrated host is placed in a monstrance (from the Latin monstrare, to show or view) for adoration (for us to adore Him).

Adoration is a silent time for you to be alone with Jesus to recite your favorite prayers, say the rosary, read the bible, contemplate acts of faith, hope, charity, thanksgiving or reparation, or do whatever type of prayerful devotion that suits you before our Lord. You can sit quietly and say nothing, just keeping Him company like you would with a dear friend.

Day and night Jesus dwells in the Blessed Sacrament because you are the most important person in the world to Him. Stay for one hour. Feel His love and His peace! "Be still and know that I am God." — Psalm 46

**The Most Blessed Sacrament will be exposed upon the altar on April 2nd, Holy Thursday from 7:00 pm until 10 am, April 3rd, Good Friday morning. We must have at least two people present during each hour as the Most Blessed Sacrament may not be left alone while exposed. Sign up sheet is available at the back of the church on the bookshelf. May you receive many blessings during Adoration.**

### \*EASTER DUTY\*

All the faithful who have reached the use of reason are gravely obliged to receive Holy Communion worthily at least once during the Easter season. In the United States, this extends from the first Sunday of Lent to Trinity Sunday (the Sunday after Pentecost).

*Laetare Sunday  
A day of HOPE  
Easter is near*

**Laetare Sunday**, the fourth Sunday in the season of Lent. Traditionally, this Sunday has been a day of celebration, within the austere period of Lent.

The term "Laetare Sunday" comes from the Latin *laetare*, the singular imperative of *laetari*: "to rejoice". This Sunday gets its name from the first few words of the traditional Latin Introit for the Mass of the day, "Laetare Jerusalem" — "Rejoice, O Jerusalem".

Historically, the day was also known as "the Sunday of the Five Loaves," from the story of the miracle of the loaves and fishes.

Laetare Sunday is also known as Mothering Sunday and Rose Sunday, either because the golden rose sent by Popes to Catholic sovereigns used to be blessed at this time, or because the use of rose-colored (rather than violet) vestments was permitted on this day.

Laetare Sunday is considered a day of relaxation from normal Lenten duties; a day of hope with Easter within sight. Traditionally, weddings (otherwise banned during Lent) could be performed on this day, and servants were released from service for the day to visit their mothers (hence 'Mothering Sunday').

Laetare Sunday is 21 days before Easter Sunday, a moveable feast based on the cycles of the moon. The date can be any between 1 March and 4 April; occurrence in April is considered to be uncommon; the last occurrence was on 3 April 2011 and the next will be on 4 April 2038. The earliest occurrence of Laetare Sunday in the twenty-first century was on 2 March 2008.

By its anticipation of the joy of Easter, Laetare Sunday is meant to give us hope and encouragement as we slowly progress towards the Paschal Feast.

In addition to attending Sunday Mass, a family might choose to mark Laetare Sunday by anticipating the Easter feast; a Sunday brunch with roses on the table would be appropriate. A family might also wish, during this beginning period of spring, to plant a rose bush on this day.

**We gladly welcome visitors and newcomers. At the same time, we respectfully remind you that to receive Our Lord in Holy Communion, one must be:**

A baptized Catholic free from any mortal sin committed since one's last Confession. Fasting for three hours from any food and/or alcoholic beverage.  
One hour from any other beverage except water.

**DRESS POLICY** ~ If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes of Vatican II in the Church, few parishes have had any kind of dress code: we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of respect for the True Presence of Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, and for the edification of our neighbor, we kindly request that all who come to our parish observe the basic traditional Catholic standards of dress for church attendance **and to receive communion at the communion rail:**

Women and girls must cover their heads. (Chapel veils or mantillas are available for loan or purchase in the vestibule.)

Women and girls must wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting. Slacks, jeans, shorts, sleeveless, tight or low-cut clothing, and dresses or skirts with long slits above the knees are not permitted.

It is recommended for men and boys to wear suit coats and ties for Sunday Mass.

Jeans and other casual attire are inappropriate for attendance at church.
