Passion Sunday

GOSPEL (John 8:46-59) At that time, Jesus said to the crowds of the Jews, "Which of you can convict Me of sin? If I say the truth to you, why do you not believe Me: He that is of God hears the words of God. Therefore, you hear them not, because you are not of God."

The Jews therefore answered and said to Him: "Are we not right in saying that You are a Samaritan and hast a devil?" Jesus answered: "I have not a devil: but I honor my Father. And you have dishonored Me. But I seek not My own glory: there is One that seeks and judges. Amen, amen, I say to you: If any man keeps My word, he shall not see death forever."

The Jews therefore said: "Now we know that Thou hast a devil. Abraham is dead, and the prophets: and Thou says: If any man keep My word, he shall not taste death forever. Art Thou greater than our father Abraham who is dead?"

And the prophets are dead. Whom dost Thou make Thyself?"

Jesus answered: "If I glorify Myself, My glory is nothing. It is My Father that glorifies Me, of whom you say that He is your God.

And you have not known Him: but I know Him. And if I shall say that I know Him not, I shall be like to you, a liar. But I do know Him and do keep His word. Abraham your father rejoiced that he might see My day: he saw it and was glad."

The Jews therefore said to Him: "Thou art not yet fifty years old. And hast Thou seen Abraham?" Jesus said to them: "Amen, amen, I say to you, before Abraham was made, I AM."

They took up stones therefore to cast at Him. But Jesus hid Himself and went out of the temple.



ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

Come adore the Lord for one hour or more in Eucharistic Adoration. Adoration is when a consecrated host is placed in a monstrance (from the Latin monstrare, to show or view) for adoration (for us to adore Him).

Adoration is a silent time for you to be alone with Jesus to recite your favorite prayers, say the rosary, read the bible, contemplate acts of faith, hope, charity, thanksgiving or reparation, or do whatever type of prayerful devotion that suits you before our Lord. You can sit quietly and say nothing, just keeping Him company like you would with a dear friend.

Day and night Jesus dwells in the Blessed Sacrament because you are the most important person in the world to Him. Stay for one hour. Feel His love and His peace! "Be still and know that I am God." — Psalm 46

The Most Blessed Sacrament will be exposed upon the altar on April 2nd, Holy Thursday from 7:00 pm until 10 am, April 3rd, Good Friday morning. We must have at least two people present during each hour as the Most Blessed Sacrament may not be left alone while exposed. Sign up sheet is available at the back of the church on the bookshelf. May you receive many blessings during Adoration.

EASTER DUTY

All the faithful who have reached the use of reason are gravely obliged to receive Holy Communion worthily at least once during the Easter season. In the United States, this extends from the first Sunday of Lent to Trinity Sunday (the Sunday after Pentecost).

The Angel Gabriel is a messenger who was entrusted to deliver several important messages on God’s behalf. Gabriel appears to at least three people in the Bible: first to the prophet Daniel (Daniel 8:16); next to the priest Zechariah to foretell and announce the miraculous birth of John the Baptist (Luke 1:19); and finally, to the Virgin Mary to tell her that she would conceive and bear a son (Luke 1:26–38).

Gabriel’s name means “God is great,” and, as the angel of the annunciation, he is the one who revealed that the Savior was to be called “Jesus” (Luke 1:31)

In all three appearances, Gabriel was met with fear, and he had to begin his conversations with words of comfort and cheer for Daniel, Zechariah, and Mary. It is possible that Gabriel was also the angel that appeared to Joseph in Matthew 1:20, but this is not certain, since that angel is unnamed in Scripture. What we do know is that Gabriel is one of God’s good and holy angels. He has a favored position as an angel who “stands in the presence of God” (Luke 1:19), and he was selected to deliver important messages of God’s particular love and favor to individuals chosen to be part of God’s plan.

The Angel Gabriel or Saint Gabriel’s feast day was exclusively celebrated on the 18th of March according to many sources dating from the years 1588 to 1921. The feast was included for the first time in the General Roman Calendar in 1921, for celebration on March 24th. Saint Gabriel is the patron saint of messengers, those who work for broadcasting and telecommunications such as radio and television, postal workers, clerics and diplomats.

We gladly welcome visitors and newcomers. At the same time, we respectfully remind you that to receive Our Lord in Holy Communion, one must be:

A baptized Catholic free from any mortal sin committed since one’s last Confession. Fasting for three hours from any food and/or alcoholic beverage. One hour from any other beverage except water.

DRESS POLICY ~ If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes of Vatican II in the Church, few parishes have had any kind of dress code: we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of respect for the True Presence of Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, and for the edification of our neighbor, we kindly request that all who come to our parish observe the basic traditional Catholic standards of dress for church attendance **and to receive communion at the communion rail:**

Women and girls must cover their heads. (Chapel veils or mantillas are available for loan or purchase in the vestibule.)

Women and girls must wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting. Slacks, jeans, shorts, sleeveless, tight or low-cut clothing, and dresses or skirts with long slits above the knees are not permitted.

It is recommended for men and boys to wear suit coats and ties for Sunday Mass.

Jeans and other casual attire are inappropriate for attendance at church.



Remember, also, Lord, Your servants and handmaids below who are gone hence before us, marked with the sign of faith, and sleep the sleep of peace. To them, Lord and to all that rest in Christ, grant, we implore You a place of happiness, light and peace through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
