Extended Solemnity of Corpus Christi

GOSPEL for Corpus Christi John 6:56-59 At that time, Jesus said to the crowds of the Jews: "For My Flesh is food indeed: and My Blood is drink indeed. He who eats My Flesh, and drinks My Blood, abides in Me and I in him. As the living Father has sent Me, and as I live because of the Father, so he who eats Me, he also shall live because of Me. This is the Bread that came down from heaven; not as your fathers ate the manna and died. He who eats this Bread shall live forever."



Saint Anthony of Padua, was born Fernando Martins in Lisbon, Portugal (15 August 1195 – 13 June 1231).

He was born into a wealthy family and by the age of fifteen asked to be sent to the Abbey of Santa Cruz in Coimbra, the then capital of Portugal. During his time in the Abbey, he learned theology and Latin. Fernando eventually received permission to leave the Abbey so he could join the new Franciscan Order. When he was admitted, he changed his name to Anthony.

Anthony then traveled to Morocco to spread God's truth, but became extremely sick and was to return to Portugal to recover. The return voyage was blown off-course and the party arrived in Sicily, from which they traveled to Tuscany. In 1226, after attending the General Chapter of his order, Anthony was appointed provincial superior of northern Italy. He chose the city of Padua as his location.

Anthony had a book of psalms that contained notes and comments to help when teaching students and, in a time when a printing press was not yet invented, he greatly valued it. When a novice decided to leave the hermitage, he stole Anthony's valuable book. When Anthony discovered it was missing, he prayed it would be found or returned to him. The thief did return the book and in an extra step returned to the Order as well. He is typically depicted with a book and the Infant Child Jesus and is commonly referred to today as the "finder of lost articles."

So simple and resounding was his teaching of the Catholic Faith, most unlettered and the innocent could understand his messages. It is for this reason he was declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope Pius XII in 1946.

He was only 36-years-old when he died and was canonized less than one year afterward by Pope Gregory IX. Upon exhumation some 336 years after his death, his body was found to be corrupted, yet his tongue was totally incorrupt, so perfect were the teachings that had been formed upon it. St Anthony's Feast Day is June 13th.

From Traditio: True Catholics, seek out traditional Catholic priests, who are independent from Newchurch, or groups that are independent of Newchurch. True Catholics seek what is doctrinally, liturgically, and morally Catholic, and have nothing to do with the pretenders who took possession of the buildings. On that occasion, it took a century or more for the heretics to be routed out of the high offices of the Catholic Church, and the true Catholic Church restored.

THE TRUE ENEMIES OF THE CHURCH ARE BAD CATHOLICS (From Rorate)

It is a well-known account. Sister Marie Bernarde (Bernadette) Soubirous is in the convent of the Sisters of Charity in Nevers, it is 1870, war is raging throughout northern France as the Prussian-led German armies march towards Paris. The first printed version of the account, published while she was still living, is the following. A visitor came to Bernadette at that time and made her the following questions:

- *Did you receive, in the grotto of Lourdes, or after then, any revelations related to the future and fate of France? Did not the Blessed Virgin deliver any warning for France, any threats?*

- No

- *The Prussians are at our gates; does that not cause you any fear?*

- No.

- *There is thus nothing to fear?*

- *I only fear bad Catholics.*

- *You do not fear anything else?*

- *No, nothing else.*

These are words of great wisdom from the Saint.

The true enemies of the Church, those who can cause Catholics great harm and peril of damnation, are those who are within, the **"bad Catholics"** Saint Bernadette feared so much. And they are more dangerous the more powerful they are, **the higher in the Hierarchy they are**, and the more empowered they feel, their fury, deception and bold vulgarity unleashed.

A baptized Catholic free from any mortal sin committed since one's last Confession. Fasting for three hours from any food and/or alcoholic beverage.

One hour from any other beverage except water.

DRESS POLICY ~ If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes of Vatican II in the Church, few parishes have had any kind of dress code: we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of respect for the True Presence of Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, and for the edification of our neighbor, we kindly request that all who come to our parish observe the basic traditional Catholic standards of dress for church attendance

and to receive communion at the communion rail:

Women and girls must cover their heads. (Chapel veils or mantillas are available for loan or purchase in the vestibule.)

Women and girls must wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting. Slacks, jeans, shorts, sleeveless, tight or low-cut clothing, and dresses or skirts with long slits above the knees are not permitted.

It is recommended for men and boys to wear suit coats and ties for Sunday Mass.

Jeans and other casual attire are inappropriate for attendance at church.



Remember, also, Lord, Your servants and handmaids below who are gone hence before us, marked with the sign of faith, and sleep the sleep of peace. To them, Lord and to all that rest in Christ, grant, we implore You a place of happiness, light and peace through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
