Sixth Sunday after Pentecost

GOSPEL Mark 8:1-9 In those days, when there was a great multitude and they had nothing to eat; calling His disciples together, He said to them: "I have compassion on the multitude, for behold they have now been with Me three days and have nothing to eat. And if I send them away fasting to their home, they will faint on the way, for some of them came from afar off." And His disciples answered Him: "From whence can anyone fill them here with bread in the desert?" And He asked them: "How many loaves have you?" And they said: "Seven." And He commanded the people to sit down on the ground. And taking the seven loaves, giving thanks, He broke and gave them to His disciples and they set them before the crowd. And they had a few little fishes; and He blessed them and commanded them to be set before them. And they ate and were filled; and they took up that which was left of the fragments, seven baskets. And they that had eaten were about four thousand. And He sent them away.

Gospel Commentary: Saint Ambrose, who compares the miraculous repast mentioned in today's Gospel with the other multiplication of loaves brought before us on the fourth Sunday of Lent, remarks how, both in spiritual nourishment and in that which refreshes the body, there are various degrees of excellence.

The Bridegroom does not ordinarily serve up the choicest wine, He does not produce the daintiest dishes, at the beginning of the banquet He has prepared for His dear ones.

Besides, there are many souls here below who are not capable of rising, beyond a certain limit, towards the divine and substantial light, which is the nourishment of the spirit. To these, therefore—and they are the majority and are representative of the five thousand men who were present at the first miraculous multiplication—the five loaves of inferior quality are an appropriate food, and one that, by its very number, is in keeping with the five senses, which, more or less, have dominion over the multitude.

But, as for the privileged favorites of grace; as for those men who are not distracted by the cares of this present life, who scorn to use its permitted pleasures, and who, even while in the flesh, make God the only king of their soul; for these, and for these only, the Bridegroom reserves the pure wheat of the seven loaves, which, by their number, express the plenitude of the Holy Ghost, and mysteries in abundance.

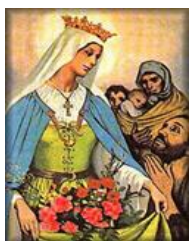

St. Elizabeth of Aragon, also known as Elizabeth of Portugal, T.O.S.F. (1271 – 4 July 1336), was queen consort of Portugal, a tertiary of the Franciscan Order and is a venerated saint. Elizabeth showed an early enthusiasm for her faith. She said the full Divine Office daily fasted and did other penance, as well as attended twice-daily choral Masses. Religious fervor was common in her family, as she could count several members of her family who were already venerated as saints. The most notable example is her great-aunt, St. Elizabeth of Hungary, after whom she was named.

Her marriage to King Denis of Portugal was arranged in 1281 when she was 10 years old. It was only in 1288 that the wedding was celebrated when Denis was 26 years old, while Elizabeth was 17.

Elizabeth quietly pursued the regular religious practices of her youth and was devoted to the poor and sick. Naturally, such a life was a reproach to many around her and caused ill will in some quarters. Eventually, her prayer and patience succeeded in converting her husband, who had been leading a sinful life.

She had two children: a daughter named Constance, who married King Ferdinand IV of Castile; a son Afonso, who later became King Afonso IV of Portugal.

After Denis' death in 1325, Elizabeth retired to the monastery of the Poor Clare nuns, now known as the Monastery of Santa Clara-a-Velha (which she had founded in 1314) in Coimbra. She joined the Third Order of St. Francis, devoting the rest of her life to the poor and sick in obscurity. During the great famine in 1293, she donated flour from her cellars to the starving in Coimbra. She was also known for being modest in her dress and humble in conversation, for providing lodging for pilgrims, distributing small gifts, paying for the dowries of poor girls, and educating the children of poor nobles. She was a benefactor of various hospitals (Coimbra, Santarém and Leiria) and of religious projects (such as the Trinity Convent in Lisbon, chapels in Leiria and Óbidos, and the cloister in Alcobaça

In 1336 St. Elizabeth took to her bed with a fever from which she died on 4 July, in the castle of Estremoz. She earned the title of Peacemaker on account of her efficacy in solving disputes.

Although Denis' tomb was located in Odivelas, Elizabeth was buried in the Convent of Santa Clara in Coimbra, in a magnificent Gothic sarcophagus. After frequent flooding by the Mondego River in the 17th century, the Poor Clares moved her mortal remains to the Monastery of Santa Clara-a-Nova (also in Coimbra). Her body was transferred to the main chapel, where it was buried in a sarcophagus of silver and crystal.

She was beatified in 1526 and canonized by Pope Urban VIII on 25 May 1625. Her feast was inserted in the General Roman Calendar for celebration on 4 July. In the year 1694 Pope Innocent XII moved her feast to 8 July, so it would not conflict with the celebration of the Octave of Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles.

A baptized Catholic free from any mortal sin committed since one's last Confession. Fasting for three hours from any food and/or alcoholic beverage.

One hour from any other beverage except water.

DRESS POLICY ~ If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes of Vatican II in the Church, few parishes have had any kind of dress code: we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of respect for the True Presence of Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, and for the edification of our neighbor, we kindly request that all who come to our parish observe the basic traditional Catholic standards of dress for church attendance

and to receive communion at the communion rail:

Women and girls must cover their heads. (Chapel veils or mantillas are available for loan or purchase in the vestibule.)

Women and girls must wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting. Slacks, jeans, shorts, sleeveless, tight or low-cut clothing, and dresses or skirts with long slits above the knees are not permitted.

It is recommended for men and boys to wear suit coats and ties for Sunday Mass.

Jeans and other casual attire are inappropriate for attendance at church.



Remember, also, Lord, Your servants and handmaids below who are gone hence before us, marked with the sign of faith, and sleep the sleep of peace. To them, Lord and to all that rest in Christ, grant, we implore You a place of happiness, light and peace through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

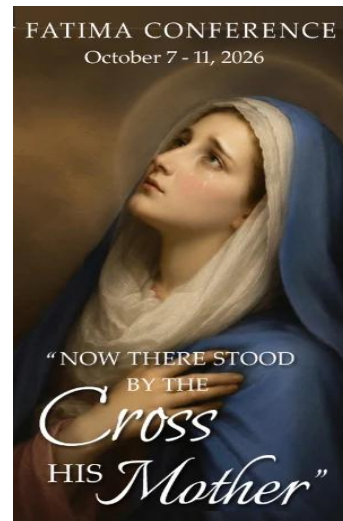
