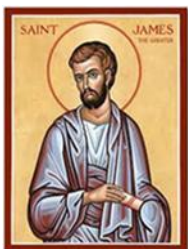

Eighth Sunday after Pentecost

GOSPEL Luke 16: 1-9 At that time, Jesus spoke to His disciples this parable: "There was a certain rich man, who had a steward; and the same was accused unto him that he was wasting his goods. And he called him, and said to him, 'What is this that I hear of thee? render the account of thy stewardship; for thou canst be no longer steward.' "And the steward said within himself, 'What shall I do, seeing that my lord taketh away the stewardship from me? I have not strength to dig; to beg I am ashamed. I am resolved what to do, that, when I am put out of the stewardship, they may receive me into their houses.' And calling to him each one of his lord's debtors, he said to the first, 'How much owest thou unto my lord?' And he said, 'A hundred measures of oil.' And he said unto him, 'Take thy bond, and sit down quickly and write fifty.' Then said he to another, 'And how much owest thou?' And he said, 'A hundred measures of wheat.' He saith unto him, 'Take thy bond, and write fourscore.' "And his lord commended the unrighteous steward because he had done wisely: for the sons of this world are for their own generation wiser than the sons of the light. And I say unto you, make to yourselves friends by means of the mammon of unrighteousness; that, when it shall fail, they may receive you into the eternal tabernacles."



St. James, also called James, son of Zebedee, or James the Greater, (born, Galilee, Palestine—died 44 AD, Jerusalem; feast day July 25), one of the Twelve Apostles, distinguished as being in Jesus' innermost circle and the only apostle whose martyrdom is recorded in the New Testament (Acts 12:2).

James is styled "the Greater" to distinguish him from the Apostle James "the Less", with greater meaning older or taller, rather than more important. James the Greater was the brother of John the Apostle.

James is described as one of the first disciples to join Jesus. The Synoptic Gospels state that James and John were with their father by the seashore when Jesus called them to follow him.[Matt. 4:21–22] [Mk. 1:19–20]

James was one of only three apostles whom Jesus selected to bear witness to his Transfiguration.

Salome, the mother of James and John asked Jesus to grant them seats on His right and left in His glory. Jesus asked if they were ready to drink from the cup He was going to drink from and said the honor was not even for Him to grant.

James and his younger brother, St. John the Apostle, are designated Boanerges (from the Greek boanerges), or "Sons of Thunder" (Mark 3:17), perhaps because of their characteristic fiery zeal (Mark 9:38 and Luke 9:54). James and his brother wanted to call down fire on a Samaritan town but were rebuked by Jesus.

Following Christ's Ascension, James spread the Gospel across Israel and the Roman kingdom as well. He traveled and spread the Word for many years in Spain.

Later, James returned to Jerusalem but was martyred for his faith, beheaded by order of King Herod Agrippa I of Judaea. According to Spanish tradition, his body was taken to Santiago de Compostela.

Saint James is the patron saint of Spain. The traditional pilgrimage to the grave of the saint, known as the "Way of St. James", has been the most popular pilgrimage for Western European Catholics from the Early Middle Ages onwards.

When July 25th falls on a Sunday, it is a "Holy Year" and a special east door is opened for entrance into Santiago Cathedral. In the 2004 Holy Year, 179,944 pilgrims were received at Compostela. In the 2010 Holy Year the number was 272,412 and in 2021 it was 178,912. The next Holy Year is 2027.

Gospel Commentary ~ Why should Christians "make friends" with the "mammon of iniquity"? Is our Lord offering the unjust steward as an exemplar for our own business dealings? Is Jesus commending dishonesty? What is going on here?

Our Lord is not commending dishonesty, but He is making a comparison similar to the one He makes when talking about the woman who pounds on the judge's door all night long in the parable of the unjust judge in Luke 18. In that parable, it is not the injustice of the judge that is commended, but the perseverance of the woman. In the story of the steward, the unjust steward knows he is about to be thrown out, so to care for his future, he remits half of the debts of all his debtors. Thus, instead of being in financial debt to his master, they will have a moral debt to him. When he gets thrown out, they will "owe" him. In other words, he is preparing for his future, and this is the point of the parable. This parable follows in a long string of parables about the perseverance and tenacity needed to take hold of eternal life.

Jesus essentially says that if even unjust people take heed about their future state, how much more should the children of the kingdom prepare for the judgment? But because the worldly people are more faithful in preparing for their temporal future than the faithful are about the eternal life, Jesus says worldly people are more prudent with dishonest wealth than we are with true wealth, which is why He goes on to exhort us to be faithful with little so that we can be entrusted with true riches in the remainder of the parable.

Strictly speaking, the parable is not about our use of money, but about the necessity of preparing our souls for the judgment, just as the unjust steward took care to make preparations for his future. Bauer

We gladly welcome visitors and newcomers. At the same time, we respectfully remind you that to receive Our Lord in Holy Communion, one must be:
A baptized Catholic free from any mortal sin committed since one's last Confession. Fasting for three hours from any food and/or alcoholic beverage.
One hour from any other beverage except water.

DRESS POLICY ~ If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes of Vatican II in the Church, few parishes have had any kind of dress code: we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of respect for the True Presence of Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, and for the edification of our neighbor, we kindly request that all who come to our parish observe the basic traditional Catholic standards of dress for church attendance
and to receive communion at the communion rail:

Women and girls must cover their heads. (Chapel veils or mantillas are available for loan or purchase in the vestibule.)

Women and girls must wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting. Slacks, jeans, shorts, sleeveless, tight or low-cut clothing, and dresses or skirts with long slits above the knees are not permitted.

It is recommended for men and boys to wear suit coats and ties for Sunday Mass.

Jeans and other casual attire are inappropriate for attendance at church.



Remember, also, Lord, Your servants and handmaids below who are gone hence before us, marked with the sign of faith, and sleep the sleep of peace. To them, Lord and to all that rest in Christ, grant, we implore You a place of happiness, light and peace through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

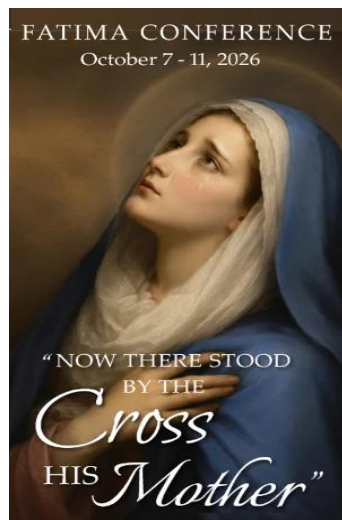
