St. Anne, Mother BVM (Ninth Sunday after Pentecost)

GOSPEL Matt. 13:44-52 At that time, Jesus spoke this parable to His disciples, "The kingdom of heaven is like unto a treasure hidden in a field; he who finds it hides it, and in his joy goes and sells all that he has and buys that field. Again, the kingdom of heaven is like to a merchant seeking good pearls. When he finds a single pearl of great price, he goes and sells all that he has and buys it. Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a net cast into the sea that gathers in fish of every kind. When it was filled, they hauled it out, and sitting by the shore, they gathered the good fish into vessels but threw away the bad. So will it be at the end of the world. The angels will go out and separate the wicked from among the just, and will cast them into the furnace of fire, where there will be the weeping, and the gnashing of teeth. Have you understood all these things?" They said to Him: "Yes." He said unto them: "Therefore every scribe instructed in the kingdom of heaven is like to a householder, who brings forth from his storeroom things new and old."



St. Ignatius of Loyola (23 October 1491 – 31 July 1556) was the youngest of 13 children from a family of minor nobility in northern Spain. As a young man Ignatius was inflamed by the ideals of courtly love and knighthood and dreamed of doing great things.

In 1521 Ignatius was seriously wounded in a battle with the French. While recuperating, he experienced a conversion. Reading the lives of Jesus and the saints made Ignatius happy. St. Ignatius had always dreamed of imitating heroic deeds, but now, the heroes had names like Francis of Assisi and Catherine of Siena. St. Ignatius also noticed something strange happening to him, God, he realized, was working within him. St. Ignatius realized that these feelings were clues to God's direction for him. As he traveled far and wide these experiences would prove to be the beginnings of Ignatian spirituality — and Jesuit ministry.

He became a Spanish Basque Catholic priest and theologian, who co-founded the religious order called the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) and became its first Superior General at Paris in 1541. The Jesuit order served the Pope as missionaries, and they were bound by a vow of special obedience to the sovereign pontiff in regard to the missions. They therefore emerged as an important force during the time of the Counter-Reformation.

St. Ignatius is remembered as a talented spiritual director. He recorded his method in a celebrated treatise called the *Spiritual Exercises*, a simple set of meditations, prayers, and other mental exercises, first published in 1548.

St. Ignatius died in Rome on 31 July 1556, as a result of the Roman Fever, a severe case of malaria that recurred in Rome, Italy, at different points in history. An autopsy revealed that he also had several kidney and bladder stones, a probable cause of the abdominal pains he suffered from later in life. He was placed in a wooden shrine and his body was then covered with his priestly garments. On 1 August the shrine was then buried in the small Maria della Strada Church. In 1568 that church was pulled down and replaced with the Church of the Gesù. Saint Ignatius was put into a new coffin and reinterred in the new church.

St. Ignatius was beatified in 1609, and then canonized, receiving the title of Saint on 12 March 1622. His feast day is celebrated on 31 July.

He is the patron saint of the Basque provinces of Gipuzkoa and Biscay as well as the Society of Jesus and was declared patron saint of all spiritual retreats by Pope Pius XI in 1922. St. Ignatius is also a foremost patron saint of soldiers.

Prayer of St. Ignatius ~ "Take, Lord, receive all my liberty, my memory, my understanding, my whole will, all that I have and all that I possess. You gave it all to me, Lord; I give it all back to You. Do with it as You will, according to Your good pleasure. Give me Your love and Your grace; for with this I have all that I need."

Prayer to Know God's Will ~ "May it please the supreme and divine Goodness to give us all abundant grace, ever to know His most holy will and perfectly to fulfill it." St. Ignatius of Loyola (This prayer was added to the end of many letters St. Ignatius wrote.)

Saint Anne is the mother of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the maternal grandmother of Jesus.

While she is not mentioned in the Bible, her story comes from early Christian writings like the second-century *Protoevangelium of James*.

According to this non-scriptural source, Anne (Hebrew, Hannah, grace; also spelled Ann, Anne, Anna) was born in Bethlehem in Judaea. She married Joachim, and they shared a wealthy and devout life at Nazareth. Grieved by her barrenness, Anne promised God that she would dedicate her firstborn child to the Lord's service.

The couple then received a vision from an angel, who announced that Anne would conceive and bear a most wondrous child, Mary. When the child was three years old, Joachim and Anne, in fulfillment of her divine promise, brought Mary to the Temple of Jerusalem, where they left her to be brought up.

Because her exact life details are drawn from tradition rather than scripture, Anne's legacy is largely centered on her pivotal role in the Holy Family and her devout parenting. Devotion to her grew rapidly in the early Church, and she remains highly revered by both Catholic and Eastern Orthodox traditions.

The Protevangelium account of the life of St. Anne became the foundation for establishing the liturgical feasts of the Nativity of the Virgin Mary (September 8) and the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary (December 8), observed as a holy day of obligation. The dedication of Mary at the Temple became so important in church doctrine that by 1585 Pope Sixtus V included in the Western church calendar the liturgical feast of the Presentation of the Virgin Mary (November 21).

She is honored as the patron saint of mothers, grandmothers, and women in labor, her feast day is celebrated annually on July 26th.

We gladly welcome visitors and newcomers. At the same time, we respectfully remind you that to receive Our Lord in Holy Communion, one must be:
A baptized Catholic free from any mortal sin committed since one's last Confession. Fasting for three hours from any food and/or alcoholic beverage.

One hour from any other beverage except water.

DRESS POLICY ~ If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes of Vatican II in the Church, few parishes have had any kind of dress code: we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of respect for the True Presence of Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, and for the edification of our neighbor, we kindly request that all who come to our parish observe the basic traditional Catholic standards of dress for church attendance

and to receive communion at the communion rail:

Women and girls must cover their heads. (Chapel veils or mantillas are available for loan or purchase in the vestibule.)

Women and girls must wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting. Slacks, jeans, shorts, sleeveless, tight or low-cut clothing, and dresses or skirts with long slits above the knees are not permitted.

It is recommended for men and boys to wear suit coats and ties for Sunday Mass.

Jeans and other casual attire are inappropriate for attendance at church.



Remember, also, Lord, Your servants and handmaids below who are gone hence before us, marked with the sign of faith, and sleep the sleep of peace. To them, Lord and to all that rest in Christ, grant, we implore You a place of happiness, light and peace through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

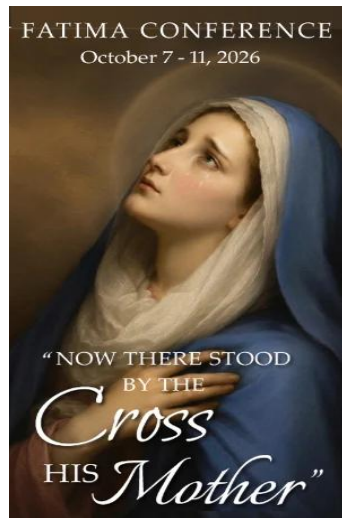
