Fourteenth Sunday after Pentecost

GOSPEL Matt. 6:24-33 At that time, Jesus said to His disciples: "No man can serve two masters. For either he will hate the one and love the other: or he will sustain the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon. "Therefore, I say to you, be not solicitous for your life, what you shall eat, nor for your body, what you shall put on. Is not the life more than the meat: and the body more than the raiment? Behold the birds of the air, for they neither sow, nor do they reap, nor gather into barns: and your heavenly Father feeds them. Are not you of much more value than they? And which of you by taking thought, can add to his stature one cubit? "And for raiment why are you solicitous? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow: they labor not, neither do they spin. But I say to you that not even Solomon in all his glory was arrayed as one of these. And if the grass of the field, which is today, and tomorrow is cast into the oven, God doth so clothe: how much more you, O ye of little faith! "Be not solicitous therefore, saying: What shall we eat: or what shall we drink, or wherewith shall we be clothed? For after all these things do the heathens seek. For your Father knows that you have need of all these things. Seek ye therefore first the kingdom of God, and His justice, and all these things shall be added unto you."

September is the Month of the Holy Cross



Thanks be to God that His wisdom often turns human plans upside down and inside out. We see this in the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. The instrument of torture becomes the throne of glory.

He Who was nailed to the Cross like a criminal is in fact the King of kings before Whom one day every knee shall bow.

The splendor of the Holy Cross guarantees that in our war against the forces of darkness we are already well and truly on the winning side. The principal and decisive battle has already been fought and won by the Son of God. What now remains are the continuing skirmishes by which the Enemy tries to undermine our confidence in Christ's victory.

How do we exalt the Holy Cross? By showing forth in our daily lives the Gospel truth that suffering can be salvific. We also exalt Christ the Lord by reaching out in charity to our neighbors, especially to those who do not yet share our faith.

How are people going to know about Christ unless we tell them? How will they come to believe in Him unless we prepare the ground for them to receive the Holy Ghost's supernatural gift of faith?

We cannot hope to prepare the ground unless we ourselves are credible witnesses. We bear witness to Christ (among many other ways) by being of genuine service to our fellow citizens, serving them after the pattern of His own compassion and generosity.

We serve our neighbors in order to share with them something of what we ourselves have received; the countless blessings of that infinite charity which the Sacred Heart of Jesus unremittently intends for the whole of mankind.

O God, who willed that your Only Begotten Son should undergo the Cross to save the human race, grant, we pray, that we, who have known His mystery on earth, may merit the grace of His redemption in heaven. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Ghost, one God, forever and ever. Amen

We gladly welcome visitors and newcomers. At the same time, we respectfully remind you that to receive Our Lord in Holy Communion, one must be:

A baptized Catholic free from any mortal sin committed since one's last Confession. Fasting for three hours from any food and/or alcoholic beverage. One hour from any other beverage except water.

DRESS POLICY ~ If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes of Vatican II in the Church, few parishes have had any kind of dress code: we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of respect for the True Presence of Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, and for the edification of our neighbor, we kindly request that all who come to our parish observe the basic traditional Catholic standards of dress for church attendance

and to receive communion at the communion rail:

Women and girls must cover their heads. (Chapel veils or mantillas are available for loan or purchase in the vestibule.)

Women and girls must wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting. Slacks, jeans, shorts, sleeveless, tight or low-cut clothing, and dresses or skirts with long slits above the knees are not permitted.

It is recommended for men and boys to wear suit coats and ties for Sunday Mass.

Jeans and other casual attire are inappropriate for attendance at church.

Join The Altar & Rosary Society ~ Next meeting is Saturday. September 5th

We meet on the first Saturday of the month from September to May, 9 times a year, directly following the 9:00 am Mass.

 You may be asking yourself, “What is the Altar & Rosary Society and what are my responsibilities as a member?”

The purpose of the A&R Society is to cultivate and promote a greater devotion to Our Lord in the Most Blessed Sacrament of the Altar through Our Lady as Queen of the Most Holy Rosary. Likewise, to employ ways and means to secure the adornment of the sanctuary of the Most Blessed Sacrament. We provide support for the clergy and the religious as well as the parish as a whole with our two annual bake sales, covering the statues at Easter and decorating at Christmas. We also assist with the votive candles, the altar flowers, the May Crowning and celebratory cakes, just to name a few.

Weekly Catechism taken from Baltimore Catechism III, by Rev. Francis J. Connell

What is the Sacrament of Penance?

Penance is the sacrament instituted by Our Divine Savior in which sins committed after Baptism are forgiven through the absolution of the priest. The sacrament of Penance raises the soul from death to supernatural life.

With what words does the priest forgive sins?

The priest forgives sins with the words: “I absolve thee from thy sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen.” The power to forgive sins is given to the priest at his ordination.

What are the effects of the sacrament of Penance, worthily received?

First, the restoration or increase of sanctifying grace; *second*, the forgiveness of sins; *third*, the remission of both temporal and eternal punishment (if necessary), due to our sins; *fourth*, the help to avoid sin in the future; *fifth*, the restoration of the merits of our good works if they have been lost by mortal sin.

What else does the sacrament of Penance do for us?

Penance also gives us the opportunity to receive spiritual advice and instruction from our confessor.

What must we do to receive the sacrament of Penance worthily?

We must: *first*, examine our conscience; *second*, be sorry for our sins; *third*, have the firm purpose of not sinning again; *fourth*, confess our sins to the priest; *fifth*, be willing to perform the penance the priest gives us.

What should we do before our examination of conscience?

We should ask God’s help to know our sins and to confess them with sincere sorrow.

What is an examination of conscience?

It is a sincere effort to call to mind all the sins we have committed since our last worthy confession. We make a good examination of conscience by reviewing the commandments of God, and of the Church, and the particular duties of our state of life, and by asking ourselves how we may have sinned regarding them.



Remember, also, Lord, Your servants and handmaids below who are gone hence before us, marked with the sign of faith, and sleep the sleep of peace. To them, Lord and to all that rest in Christ, grant, we implore You a place of happiness, light and peace through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
