GOSPEL Matt. 9:1-8 At that time, Jesus entering into a boat, passed over the water and came into His own city. And behold they brought to Him one sick of the palsy lying in a bed. And Jesus, seeing their faith, said to the man sick of the palsy: "Be of good heart, son, thy sins are forgiven thee." And behold some of the scribes said within themselves: "He blasphemeth." And Jesus seeing their thoughts, said: "Why do you think evil in your hearts? Whether is easier, to say, Thy sins are forgiven thee: or to say, Arise, and walk? But that you may know that the Son of man hath power on earth to forgive sins," (then said He to the man sick of the palsy,) "Arise, take up thy bed, and go into thy house." And he arose and went into his house. And the multitude seeing it, feared, and glorified God that gave such power to men.



The Feast of St. Michael is September 29th - Pope Leo XIII in 1888 after his startling vision as to the future of the Church composed this vital prayer.

The prayer was dedicated for the Feast of St. Michael 1448 years from the date of the election of the first Leo - Pope Saint Leo the Great. Everyone is familiar with the prayer below which was mandated by His Holiness as part of the Leonine Prayers after Low Mass. Following Vatican II, in league with the devil, Giovanni Montini outlawed this necessary prayer and then one wonders how "the smoke of Satan" got into the sanctuary? The Conciliarists wanted to make sure these words would never see the light of day again for in the long version of the prayer, Leo foretold what would happen: The shepherd would be struck, the sheep scattered. Below is the short version of this poignant prayer, which should never be forgotten.

"Saint Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle, be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him we humbly pray, and do thou, O Prince of the heavenly hosts, by the power of God, thrust into hell Satan and all the evil spirits who wander about the world seeking the ruin of souls." Amen.



OCTOBER, MONTH OF THE HOLY ANGELS AND THE ROSARY



The lovely month of October comes round and directs our attention and meditations to the rosary and the holy angels. The Blessed Virgin Mary is the Queen of Angels.

The mysteries of the rosary are almost constantly suggestive of the angels. The announcement that she should be the mother of Jesus was made to Mary by an angel. No doubt the visitation to her cousin Elizabeth was attended by angels, though they were invisible. The birth of the Savior was announced by a glorious choir of angels, who sang, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to men of good will." The agony of our Lord in the garden

was consoled by a ministering angel. In the glorious mysteries, especially, the ministry of the angels is conspicuous.

At the resurrection angels came and rolled away the stone from the sepulcher and announced to the disciples that their Lord had risen from the dead. At the ascension a company of angels received Him as He passed out of sight. The assumption and coronation of the Blessed Virgin were, of course, celebrated by an innumerable company of angels.

Indeed, if we meditate at all on these interesting mysteries as we recite the various decades it would seem the most natural thing in the world to include offices of these glorious messengers of God who are sent forth to minister to those who shall be heirs of salvation.

These prayers are to be said throughout the month of October to honor Our Lady and her spouse, St. Joseph.

The Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the Prayer to St. Joseph will also to be **recited starting on Friday, October 2nd, as there will be simple Benediction** (no Monstrance used) every Wednesday and Friday in the month of October at 8:30 AM before the start of the 9:00 AM Mass.

As prescribed for the month of October by Pope Leo XIII.

Please try to attend Mass on these days as often as possible.

DRESS POLICY ~ If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes of Vatican II in the Church, few parishes have had any kind of dress code: we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of respect for the True Presence of Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, and for the edification of our neighbor, we kindly request that all who come to our parish observe the basic traditional Catholic standards of dress for church attendance

and to receive communion at the communion rail:

Women and girls must cover their heads. (Chapel veils or mantillas are available for loan or purchase in the vestibule.)

Women and girls must wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting. Slacks, jeans, shorts, sleeveless, tight or low-cut clothing, and dresses or skirts with long slits above the knees are not permitted.

It is recommended for men and boys to wear suit coats and ties for Sunday Mass.

Jeans and other casual attire are inappropriate for attendance at church.



Remember, also, Lord, Your servants and handmaids below who are gone hence before us, marked with the sign of faith, and sleep the sleep of peace. To them, Lord and to all that rest in Christ, grant, we implore You a place of happiness, light and peace through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
