Mass of the 18th Sunday after Pentecost

GOSPEL Matt. 9:1-8 At that time, Jesus entering into a boat, passed over the water and came into His own city. And behold they brought to Him one sick of the palsy lying in a bed. And Jesus, seeing their faith, said to the man sick of the palsy: "Be of good heart, son, thy sins are forgiven thee." And behold some of the scribes said within themselves: "He blasphemeth." And Jesus seeing their thoughts, said: "Why do you think evil in your hearts? Whether is easier, to say, Thy sins are forgiven thee: or to say, Arise, and walk? But that you may know that the Son of man hath power on earth to forgive sins," (then said He to the man sick of the palsy,) "Arise, take up thy bed, and go into thy house." And he arose and went into his house. And the multitude seeing it, feared, and glorified God that gave such power to men.



Saint Teresa of Ávila

Saint Teresa of Ávila (1515–1582) canonized 1622; feast day October 15) was a Spanish writer and reformer of the Carmelite order. She was an influential and pivotal figure of her generation.

St. Teresa (Teresa de Cepeda y Ahumada) was born in Avila, Spain on 28th March 1515. Her parents were both pious Catholics and in some ways inspired their daughter to take up a life of prayer.

As a young child Teresa showed signs of a deeply religious nature; she would often retreat into silence for prayer and would enjoy giving alms to the poor. She was very close to her mother, who provided a warm counterbalance to the strictness of her father. However, in her teens, Teresa's mother passed away, leaving the young Teresa distraught at the void she felt. The young St. Teresa tells of her despair and how she turned instinctively to the Virgin Mary for comfort.

At the age of 16, her father decided to send Teresa to a convent school to be educated. This reignited in Teresa an interest in following a spiritual life and after some deliberation resolved to become a nun of the Carmelite Order. Shortly after becoming a nun, Teresa experienced a severe illness (malaria), which left her in great pain for a long period. At one point it was feared that her illness was so severe that she would not be able to recover. However, during this period of intense physical pain, she began to increasingly experience divine visions and an inner sense of peace.

At the age of 43, St. Teresa decided she wanted to found a new order recommitting to the values of poverty and simplicity. She guided the nuns not just through strict disciplines, but also through the power of love, and common sense and stressed the importance of experiencing God's Love.

She died on October 4 at the age of 67.

We gladly welcome visitors and newcomers. At the same time, we respectfully remind you that to receive Our Lord in Holy Communion, one must be: A baptized Catholic free from any mortal sin committed since one's last Confession.

Fasting for three hours from any food and/or alcoholic beverage.

One hour from any other beverage except water.

DRESS POLICY ~ If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes of Vatican II in the Church, few parishes have had any kind of dress code: we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of respect for the True Presence of Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, and for the edification of our neighbor, we kindly request that all who come to our parish observe the basic traditional Catholic standards of dress for church attendance

and to receive communion at the communion rail:

Women and girls must cover their heads. (Chapel veils or mantillas are available for loan or purchase in the vestibule.)

Women and girls must wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting. Slacks, jeans, shorts, sleeveless, tight or low-cut clothing, and dresses or skirts with long slits above the knees are not permitted.

It is recommended for men and boys to wear suit coats and ties for Sunday Mass.

Jeans and other casual attire are inappropriate for attendance at church.

- During the month of October there is simple Benediction (no Monstrance used) every Wednesday and Friday in the month of October at 8:30 AM before the start of the 9:00 AM Mass.
- There are new church decals available for purchase after Mass in the church hall, the cost is \$4 each, see Sam Liburdi.
- All Souls Day remembrance sign-up sheets are located on a clipboard at the back of the church. Write in the names of your loved ones to be placed on altar.

Weekly Catechism taken from Baltimore Catechism III, by Rev. Francis J. Connell

What is the Sacrament of Holy Orders?

It is the sacrament through which men receive the power and grace to perform the sacred duties of bishops, priests and other ministries of the church.

- a) A bishop is a priest who has the power of administering both the sacrament of Holy Orders and Confirmation.
- b) The other orders of ministers of the Church below those of priest are the major orders of deacon, subdeacon, and the four minor orders of acolyte, exorcist, lector and porter.

Who is the minister of the sacrament of Holy Orders?

The bishop is the minister of the sacrament of Holy Orders.

What are some of the requirements that a man may receive Holy Orders worthily?

To receive Holy Orders worthily it is necessary: *first*, that the man be in a state of grace and be of excellent character; *second*, that he have the prescribed age and learning; *third*, that he has the intention of devoting his life to the sacred ministry; *fourth*, that he be called to Holy Orders by his bishop.

Some of the preliminary signs of a vocation in the priesthood are: *first*, the boy or young man is capable of living habitually in the state of grace; *second*, there is an attraction to the priesthood manifested in frequent confessions and Communion, a virtuous life and by a love of serving Mass.

Without a special dispensation, no one may be ordained a priest until he is 24 years of age. Ordinarily the prescribed learning consists of 4 years of high school, 4 years of college, and 4 years of theology completed in a seminary.

What are the effects of ordination to the priesthood?

The effects of ordination are: *first*, an increase in sanctifying grace; *second*, sacramental grace, through which the priest has God's constant help in his sacred ministry; *third*, a character, lasting forever, which is a special sharing in the priesthood of Christ, and which gives the priest supernatural powers.

What are the chief supernatural powers of the priest?

The chief supernatural powers are, to change bread and wine into the body and blood of Christ in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, and to forgive sins in the sacrament of Penance.

Why should Catholics show reverence and honor to the priest?

Because he is the representative of Christ Himself and the dispenser of His mysteries.
