Mass of Christ the King (20th Sunday after Pentecost)

GOSPEL (St. John 18:33-37) At that time, Pilate therefore went into the hall again and called Jesus and said to him: "Art Thou the King of the Jews?" Jesus answered: "Sayest thou this thing of thyself, or have others told it thee of Me?" Pilate answered: "Am I a Jew? Thy own nation and the chief priests have delivered Thee up to me. What hast Thou done?" Jesus answered: "My kingdom is not of this world. If My kingdom were of this world My servants would certainly strive that I should not be delivered to the Jews: but now My kingdom is not from hence." Pilate therefore said to Him: "Art Thou a King then?" Jesus answered: "Thou sayest that I am a King. For this was I born, and for this came I into the world; that I should give testimony to the truth. Every one that is of the truth heareth My voice."

Feast of Christ the King

The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, commonly referred to as the Feast of Christ the King is observed on the last Sunday of October.

Pope Pius XI instituted the Feast of Christ the King in his encyclical letter Quas primas of 1925, in response to growing secularism.

According to Cyril of Alexandria, "Christ has dominion over all creatures, ...by essence and by nature." His kingship is founded upon the hypostatic union. "...The Word of God, as consubstantial with the Father, has all things in common with him, and therefore has necessarily supreme and absolute dominion over all things created."

"From this it follows that to Christ, angels and men are subject. Christ is also King by acquired, as well as by natural right, for he is our Redeemer. ...' We are no longer our own property, for Christ has purchased us "with a great price"; our very bodies are the "members of Christ." A third ground of sovereignty is that God bestowed upon Christ the nations of the world as His special possession and dominion. "All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me." (Matthew 28:18)

The feast has an eschatological dimension pointing to the end of time when the kingdom of Jesus will be established in all its fullness to the ends of the earth. It also leads to Advent, when the Church commemorates the arrival of the newborn king.

ALL SAINTS DAY ~ On May 13, 609 A.D. Pope Boniface IV dedicated the Pantheon in Rome in honor of all Christian martyrs, and the Catholic feast of All Martyrs Day was established in the Western church. Pope Gregory III later expanded the feast day to include all saints as well as all martyrs and moved the observance from May 13th to November 1st.

ALL SOUL'S DAY ~ In the Catholic Church, "the faithful" refers specifically to baptized Catholics; "all souls" commemorates the church penitent souls in Purgatory. It is called the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed and is celebrated on November 2nd.

We can pay no greater honor to the Saints than by offering up to God in their name the Blood of Jesus. The efficacy of their past merits and present prayers are greatly increased when offered to God in close association with the merits and prayers of our Lord.

Therefore, the Church commemorates on this day all the Saints in heaven without exception, and thus honors also those who are unknown and who have no public recognition in the Liturgy. Sylvester Juergens

We gladly welcome visitors and newcomers. At the same time, we respectfully remind you that to receive Our Lord in Holy Communion, one must be: A baptized Catholic free from any mortal sin committed since one's last Confession.

Fasting for three hours from any food and/or alcoholic beverage.

One hour from any other beverage except water.

DRESS POLICY ~ If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes of Vatican II in the Church, few parishes have had any kind of dress code: we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of respect for the True Presence of Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, and for the edification of our neighbor, we kindly request that all who come to our parish observe the basic traditional Catholic standards of dress for church attendance

and to receive communion at the communion rail:

Women and girls must cover their heads. (Chapel veils or mantillas are available for loan or purchase in the vestibule.)
Women and girls must wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting. Slacks, jeans, shorts, sleeveless, tight or low-cut clothing, and

dresses or skirts with long slits above the knees are not permitted. It is recommended for men and boys to wear suit coats and ties for Sunday Mass.

Jeans and other casual attire are inappropriate for attendance at church.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

- During the month of October there is simple Benediction (no Monstrance used) every Wednesday and Friday before Mass.
- Included today with the prayers after Mass, The Act of Consecration of the Human Race & The Litany of the Scared Heart.
- Daylight Savings Time ends next Sunday, November 2nd. Remember to turn your clocks back Saturday night.
- The Altar & Rosary Society will hold their monthly meeting on Saturday, November 1st after the 9am Mass.
- There are new church decals available for purchase after Mass in the church hall, the cost is \$4 each, see Sam Liburdi.
- All Souls Day remembrance sign-up sheets are located on a clipboard at the back of the church. Write in the names of your loved ones to be placed on altar.
- All Saint's Day Saturday, November 1st, is a Holy Day of Obligation, Mass is at 9:00am. Attendance at Mass is obligatory. Buying and selling as well as servile work are forbidden.
- All Soul's Day as it falls on a Sunday, has been moved to Monday, November 3rd. Masses are at 8:30am, 9:15am and 7:00pm.
- Following Mass, visit with your fellow Catholics in the Mary Help of Christians Hall where light refreshments are available.
- Join parishioners every Tuesday at 3:00 PM in the church to recite fifteen decades of the rosary.
- New to the Tridentine Mass, you may find the grey or green paperback missals found in the pews helpful in following the Mass.

What do we mean when we say that God is the Creator of heaven and earth?

We mean that He made all things from nothing by His almighty power.

Which are the chief creatures of God?

The chief creatures of God are angels and men.

What are angels?

Angels are created spirits, without bodies, having understanding and free will. They are inferior to God and superior to man. The nine "choirs" of angels are the Seraphim, Cherubim, Thrones, Dominations, Virtues, Powers, Principalities, Archangels and Angels.

What gifts did God bestow on the angels when He created them?

The gifts of great wisdom, power and holiness. They have supernatural grace by which they can gain eternal happiness by remaining faithful to God.

Did all angels remain faithful to God?

Not all angels remained faithful to God; some of them sinned, for which they were punished.

What do the good angels do?

First, they see, love and adore God; *second*, they pray for us, by acting as messengers from God to us, and by serving as our guardian angels. Although angels are pure spirits, they can be seen by man when God permits them to take on bodies which are visible to the human eye.

How do our guardian angels help us?

They pray for us, they assist in protecting us from harm and they inspire us to do good.

What happen to the angels that did not remain faithful?

God cast them into hell, these are the bad angels, or devils. These bad angels' chief job is to tempt us into sin.

Do all temptations come from the bad angels?

Some temptations come from the bad angels, but others come from ourselves and from persons and things about us.

Can we always resist temptations?

We can always resist temptations, because no temptation can force us into sin, and because God will always help us if we ask Him. The most effective means of overcoming temptation are prayer, frequent Confession, Holy Communion and avoiding idleness.





Remember, also, Lord, Your servants and handmaids below who are gone hence before us, marked with the sign of faith, and sleep the sleep of peace. To them, Lord and to all that rest in Christ, grant, we implore You a place of happiness, light and peace through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
