# Second Sunday after Pentecost

GOSPEL Luke 14:16-24 At that time, Jesus spoke to the Pharisees this parable: "A man once gave a great banquet and invited many. And at the time for the banquet, he sent his servant to say to those who had been invited, 'Come, for everything is now ready.' But they all alike began to make excuses. The first said to him, 'I have bought a field, and I must go out and see it. Please have me excused.' And another said, 'I have bought five yoke of oxen, and I go to examine them. Please have me excused.' And another said, 'I have married a wife, and therefore I cannot come.' So, the servant came and reported these things to his master. Then the master of the house became angry and said to his servant, 'Go out quickly to the streets and lanes of the city and bring in the poor and crippled and blind and lame.' And the servant said, 'Sir, what you commanded has been done, and still there is room.' And the master said to the servant, 'Go out to the highways and hedges and compel people to come in, that my house may be filled. For I tell you, none of those men who were invited shall taste my banquet.' "



**St. John the Baptist** was born through the intercession of God to Zachariah and Elizabeth, who was otherwise too old to bear children. According to scriptures, the Angel Gabriel visited Elizabeth and Zachariah to tell them they would have a son and that they should name him John. Zachariah was skeptical and for this he was rendered mute until the time his son was born and named John, in fulfillment of God's will.

When Elizabeth was pregnant with John, she was visited by Mary, and John leapt in her womb. This revealed to Elizabeth that the child Mary carried was to be the Son of God.

John began public ministry around 30 AD, and was known for attracting large crowds across the province of Judaea and around the Jordan River. When Jesus came to him to be baptized, John recognized Him and said, "It is I who need baptism from You." Jesus told John to baptize Him anyway, which he did, whereupon the heavens opened, and the Spirit of God was seen like a dove. The voice of God spoke, saying, "This is My beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased."

John's attitude toward Jesus was: "He must increase; I must decrease." John instructed his followers to turn to Christ, calling Him the "Lamb of God" and these people were among the first Christians.

Following his baptism of Christ, John's popularity grew so much that he alarmed King Herod. Herod ordered him arrested and imprisoned. John spoke with Herod on several occasions and condemned his marriage to his half-brother's wife.

This condemnation would be his downfall as King Herod promised to grant a wish to his daughter. In revenge for John the Baptist's condemnation of her mother's scandalous marriage to Herod, she asked for John's head. King Herod reluctantly obliged.

The Feast of Saints Peter and Paul is a liturgical feast in honor of the martyrdom in Rome of the apostles Saint Peter and Saint Paul, which is observed on 29 June. The celebration is of ancient Christian origin, the date selected being the anniversary of either their death or the translation of their relics.

The Feast is almost entirely devoted to St. Peter, the Bishop of Rome. St. Paul, the great apostle of the Gentiles is more especially honored on 30 June.

After the Descent of the Holy Ghost, St. Peter preached the Gospel in Judea and was cast into prison by Herod. He was miraculously delivered by an angel and established his See first at Antioch, and then, finally at Rome.

Like St. Paul, he died at Rome during the persecution of Nero (64-68), by being crucified head downward.

At the same time, we respectfully remind you that to receive Our Lord in Holy Communion, one must be:

A baptized Catholic free from any mortal sin committed since one's last Confession.

Fasting for three hours from any food and/or alcoholic beverage.

One hour from any other beverage except water.

DRESS POLICY ~ If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes of Vatican II in the Church, few parishes have had any kind of dress code: we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of respect for the True Presence of Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, and for the edification of our neighbor, we kindly request that all who come to our parish observe the basic traditional Catholic standards of dress for church attendance

# and to receive communion at the communion rail:

Women and girls must cover their heads. (Chapel veils or mantillas are available for loan or purchase in the vestibule.)

Women and girls must wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting. Slacks, jeans, shorts, sleeveless, tight or low-cut clothing, and dresses or skirts with long slits above the knees are not permitted.

It is recommended for men and boys to wear suit coats and ties for Sunday Mass.

Jeans and other casual attire are inappropriate for attendance at church.

Saint Aloysius Gonzaga was born Luigi Gonzaga, the eldest son of the Marquis of Castiglione, an Italian nobleman, on March 9, 1568. From the earliest age, the young saint was given to prayer. Legend has it that his first spoken words were the Holy Names of Mary and Jesus.

St. Aloysius was raised in the castle Castiglione delle Stivieri in Lombardy, with many servants, and plenty of wealth and comfort. It was natural for his father to have had great hopes that he would have a military career and succeed him in the nobility with title and property.

However, by age 9, he had privately decided on a religious life and made a vow of perpetual virginity. He practiced many devotions and mortifications and safeguarded himself at all times from possible temptation. St. Aloysius preferred to spend his free time in prayer, kneeling on a cold stone floor or in the church in front of the Blessed Sacrament.

In 1577, his father took him and his brother to Florence to study and improve their Latin and Italian. As it would happen, the young man would develop an affinity for the study of the saints even more than his regular studies. At this time St. Aloysius read of the Jesuit missionaries in India, and he resolved to join the Society of Jesus. He began this direction in life by instructing the poor boys of Castiglione in catechism.

At the age of 12, he encountered the great ecclesiastic Saint Charles Borromeo and he received his first Holy Communion from him.

St. Aloysius insisted that he be allowed to assist with the sick and he served in a hospital during the plague of 1587 in Milan. In time, he fell victim to the dreaded disease himself, and died at the age of 23, after receiving the last rites from Saint Robert Bellarmine, who later wrote the Life of Saint Aloysius.

It was revealed to him that he would pass on the Octave of Corpus Christi, and though he appeared much better in the days preceding the Feast, St. Aloysius Gonzaga did, in fact, die on the Octave of Corpus Christi, June 21st, 1591.

Who would serve as a better example or be a good patron saint for young people if not St Aloysius? Who would make a good advocate and intercessor for young people and their prayers in Heaven? This young saint is a model for all Catholic youth. He was filled with a love of God, remorse for his sins, and a desire for purity of mind, body, and heart.

St Aloysius, a patron to all young people, was beatified in 1621 and declared a saint in 1725. His relics are buried under the altar of Saint Ignatius Church in Rome. His feast day is celebrated on June 21st.


