Exaltation of the Holy Cross (14th Sunday after Pentecost)

GOSPEL John 12:31-36 At that time, Jesus said to the multitudes of the Jews, "Now is the judgment of the world: now shall the prince of this world be cast out. And I, if I be lifted up from the earth, will draw all things to Myself." Now this He said, signifying what death He should die. The multitude answered him: "We have heard out of the law that Christ abides forever. And how can you say: The Son of Man must be lifted up? Who is this Son of man?" Jesus therefore said to them: "Yet a little while, the light is among you. He who walks in the darkness does not know where he goes. While you have the light, believe in the light, that you may become sons of light."



The Seven Sorrows of the Blessed Virgin Mary, or Dolors, are seven specific events in Mary's life that caused her profound grief. A traditional Catholic devotion, the Chaplet of the Seven Sorrows, encourages contemplation of these events and can be prayed to express devotion to Mary and receive spiritual graces.

Here are the Seven Sorrows:

1. Simeon's Prophecy: Simeon prophesied that Mary's soul would be pierced by a sword, referring to the future suffering of Jesus.
2. The Flight into Egypt: Mary and Joseph fled to Egypt with the infant Jesus to escape the wrath of King Herod.
3. The Loss of Jesus in the Temple: Mary and Joseph lost the young Jesus for three days when they returned from Jerusalem, only to find him teaching in the Temple.
4. Meeting Jesus on the Way to Calvary: Mary encountered her Son as he carried the cross on the way to his crucifixion.
5. The Crucifixion: Mary stood at the foot of the cross and witnessed the agonizing death of her son.
6. Jesus Taken Down from the Cross: Mary received the dead body of Jesus into her arms after he was taken down from the cross.
7. The Burial of Jesus: Mary witnessed the burial of her son, a final act of sorrow and loneliness.

This devotion was approved by Pope Pius VII in 1815 and is often expressed through the prayer known as the Chaplet of the Seven Sorrows.

To pray the Seven Sorrows Chaplet (or Rosary), begin by making the sign of the cross and reciting an introductory prayer and act of contrition. Then, for each of the seven sorrows of Mary, announce the sorrow, pray one Our Father, and seven Hail Marys while meditating on the sorrow. After each set of Hail Marys, conclude with the prayer "Holy Mother, hear my prayers, and renew in my heart each wound of Jesus my Savior". Finally, pray three Hail Marys in honor of Mary's tears.

At the same time, we respectfully remind you that to receive Our Lord in Holy Communion, one must be:

A baptized Catholic free from any mortal sin committed since one's last Confession.

Fasting for three hours from any food and/or alcoholic beverage.

One hour from any other beverage except water.

DRESS POLICY ~ If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes of Vatican II in the Church, few parishes have had any kind of dress code: we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of respect for the True Presence of Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, and for the edification of our neighbor, we kindly request that all who come to our parish observe the basic traditional Catholic standards of dress for church attendance

and to receive communion at the communion rail:

Women and girls must cover their heads. (Chapel veils or mantillas are available for loan or purchase in the vestibule.)

Women and girls must wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting. Slacks, jeans, shorts, sleeveless, tight or low-cut clothing, and dresses or skirts with long slits above the knees are not permitted.

It is recommended for men and boys to wear suit coats and ties for Sunday Mass.

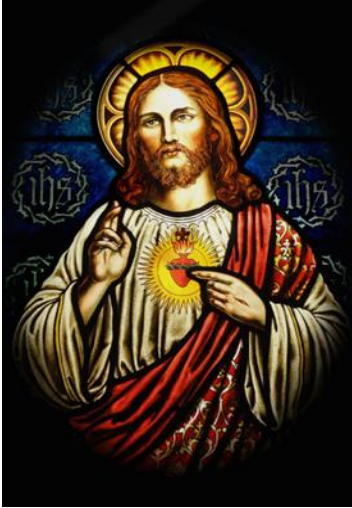
Jeans and other casual attire are inappropriate for attendance at church.

Our Lord Jesus Christ appeared to St. Margaret Mary between 1673-1675. Among the words spoken to her, she heard Jesus make 12 promises to those who would respond to the pleading of His Heart and make an effort to return His love.

St. Margaret Mary once said, “I do not know of any other exercise in the spiritual life that is more calculated to raise a soul in a short amount of time to the height of perfection and to make it taste the true sweetness to be found in the service of Jesus Christ.”

1. I will give them all the graces necessary for their state in life.
2. I will give peace in their families.
3. I will console them in all their troubles.
4. They shall find in My Heart an assured refuge during life and especially at the hour of death.
5. I will pour abundant blessings on all their undertakings.
6. Sinners shall find in My Heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy.
7. Tepid souls shall become fervent.
8. Fervent souls shall speedily rise to great perfection.
9. I will bless the homes in which the image of My Sacred Heart shall be exposed and honored.
10. I will give to priests the power to touch the most hardened hearts.

11. Those who propagate this devotion shall have their name written in My Heart, and it shall never be effaced.

12. The all-powerful love of My Heart will grant to all those who shall receive Communion on the First Friday of nine consecutive months the grace of final repentance; they shall not die under My displeasure, nor without receiving their Sacraments; My Heart shall be their assured refuge at the last hour.



The Promises of the Immaculate Heart of Mary are a response to devotion and include salvation, refuge in times of trial, and aid in obtaining graces necessary for salvation, particularly for those who fulfill the First Saturday Devotion requirements of confession, Holy Communion, reciting the Rosary, and meditating on its mysteries for five consecutive months.

These promises were revealed through the apparitions at Fatima, where Our Lady promised that devotion to her Immaculate Heart would save many souls and bring peace to the world.

The Great Promise of the First Saturdays is the most well-known promise associated with the Immaculate Heart of Mary. To receive this promise, one must:

Confess: Make a sacramental confession.

Receive Holy Communion: Receive Holy Communion in a state of grace.

Recite the Rosary: Pray five decades of the Rosary.

Meditate: Keep the Blessed Mother company for fifteen minutes while meditating on the mysteries of the Rosary.

Intention: Offer this devotion with the intention of making reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

The Promise Given for Fulfilling These Requirements

Those who practice the First Saturday devotion faithfully will receive the following:

Assistance at the Hour of Death: The graces necessary for salvation at the hour of death.

Salvation and Love by God: Salvation, and the promise that these souls will be loved by God.

Refuge in Her Heart: Mary's Immaculate Heart will be a refuge and the way that leads them to God.
